

Benj. Blake, brother of famous admiral; of Bridgewater, Somerset.

Apr. 1692 Capt. Edmund Bellinger was surety for John Watkins of the ship Loyal Jamaica. (261 p.)

Major <sup>Pats.</sup> Daniel & Capt. Bellinger were in Eng. Apr 11, 1698 and assisted the Proprietors in reducing the # of articles of The Fundamental Constitutions to 41. (p. 291)

Capt. Edmund Bellinger purchased his patent as landgrave in Eng. to pay £100 for it in S.C. (p. 292)

"The Chief Justice was Edmund Bohun, who was commissioned on <sup>the</sup> 22<sup>nd</sup> May 1698. He was one of the few settlers in Carolina who was entitled by birth to be called a cavalier. He was of the family mentioned by Macaulay as one of those untitled families descended from knights who had broken the Saxon ranks at Hastings and scaled the walls of Jerusalem. (Hist. of Eng. Vol. I 1878 p. 42 Macaulay) Mr. Bohun was a man of learning; he was the author, compiler, editor, or translator of many books. (See Allibone's Dictionary of authors) etc. (p. 298-313)
