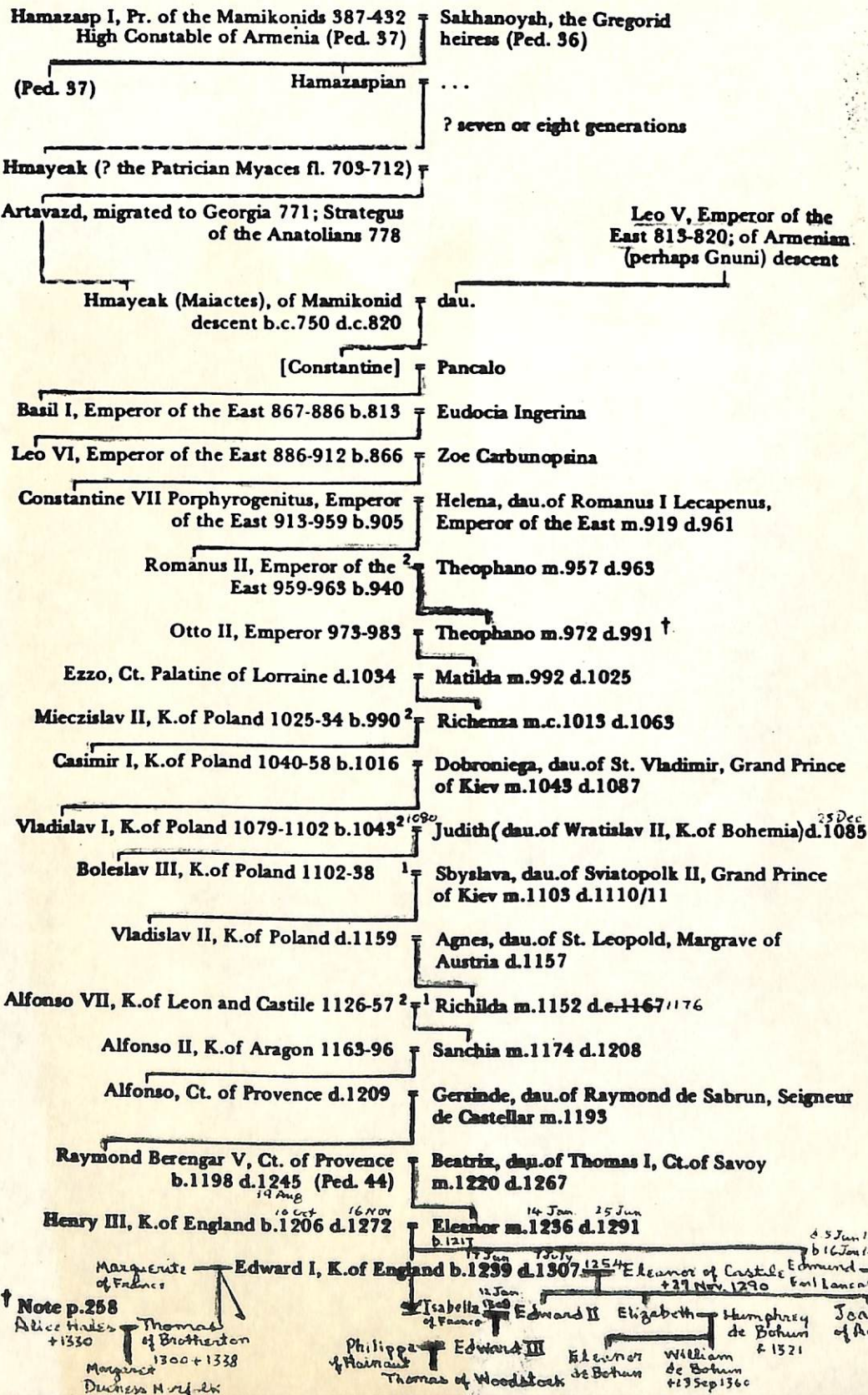


PEDIGREE 43 MAMIKONIDS, BASILID EMPERORS OF THE EAST, EDWARD I

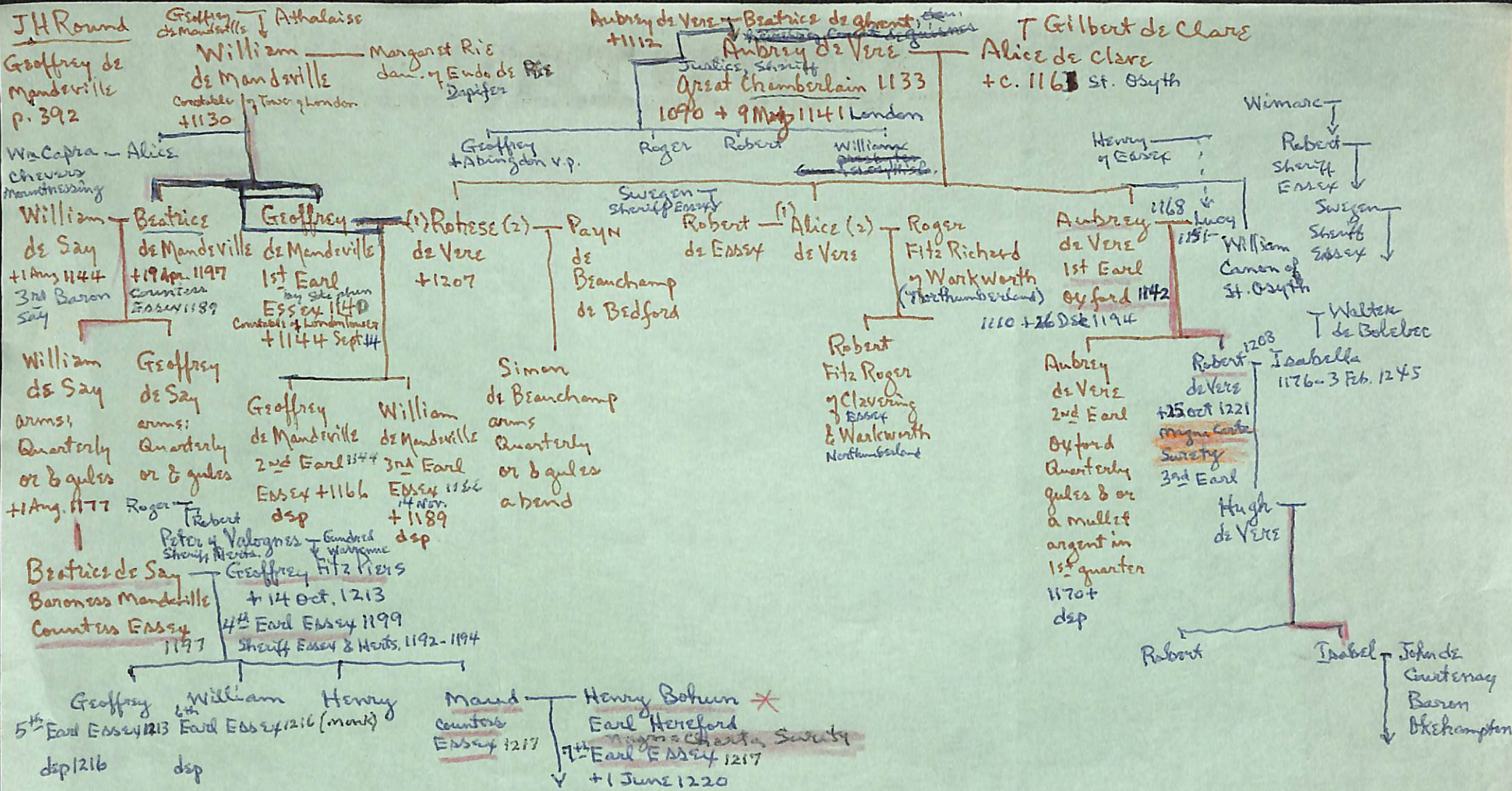

1. Humphrey de Bohun I, entered England with William the Conqueror
2. Humphrey II, de Bohun, m. (between 1087-1100) Mand, dau. of Edward de Saresburie; founded the priory of Farleigh in Wiltshire.
3. Humphrey III, de Bohun (d. 6 Apr. 1187, buried at Lanthony, Gloucestershire) m. ~~Margaret~~, eldest dau. of Milo of Gloucester, Earl of Hereford & Constable of England, (he died 24 Dec 1163, thout male heirs; his young dau. ~~Bertha~~ m. 1150 Wm de Braose.)
Lady of Brecon and Abergavenny
4. Humphrey IV, ^{+ 1182 Vit. pat.} predeceased his father in 1182, having married Margaret, dau. of Henry, Earl of Huntingdon (son of King David of Scotland). Their son:
5. Henry de Bohun (1176 - ^{1 June} 1220) created Earl of Hereford 28 Apr. 1199. In 1200 went with other nobles to summon his uncle, William the Lion of Scotland, to do homage at Lincoln. In 1215 joined the confederate barons who obtained Magna Carta & was one of 25 appointed surety for same. He died 1 June 1220 on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. His wife was Mand, dau. of Geoffrey Fitz-Piers, Earl of Essex; they left a son:
6. Humphrey V, de Bohun, II Earl of Hereford & I Earl of Essex (^{24 Sept} 1275) m. Mand de Lusignan

II Humphrey BOHUN (1208-1275)

Mandeville, near Trevières in the Bessin: Geoffrey, companion of the Conqueror 1066, appears in Domesday as tenant-in-chief, estates of Esegar the Staller (Ansgar) the portreeve, with London & Middlesex; founded Benedictine Priory of Hurley; married (1) Athalaïse (2) Keeline, the 1st was mother of William, Constable of London Tower

Ralph de Berners held 4 knights fees of Geoffrey II Earl in 1166.

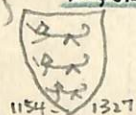
