Dear Robert:

Again I thank you for the wonderful help you have been to me, and I appreciate very much the trouble you and "Miss Cora" went to in my behalf. This "research business" is like a jigsaw puzzle, with the main pieces missing most of the time, but am forced to admit that I find it very fascinating even though quite exasperating.

I will begin by answering your questions first; I am sorry but I know nothing about the Leith family, but the name "Leith" is used quite extensively in the Paul family. Mr. Charles Leith Paul lived in Beaufort for many years, he married Naomi Wyly Bostick, I gave a list of their children on the Benjamin R. Bostick, Jr. form. Allan and Sam are the only ones left of that generation, and they both live in Beaufort, I feel sure that you would enjoy meeting them. Arthur Paul, son of Charles Lucas Paul and Alice Chisolm Prioleau, lives on Pigeon Point as I mentioned in another letter, after thinking it over I am not sure whether the Bible he has is that of the Pauls or Bosticks, it probably has data of both families. I know that Connie would be delighted to show it to you.

I do not know if the Pauls in Charleston are related or not, There is a Paul Motor Co. there, Heyward says that he knew of three sons who were in the firm, Howard, Jack and Nobley ( the last may be a nick name), He knew Jack who used to sail in the races between Chas. and Beaufort etc., many years ago. One of the boys married Roberta Maybank, daughter of Sen. Maybank (deceased), he was killed on a golf course during a storm. Charles Lucas Paul IIIrd., brother of Arthur, is married and lives in Charleston or one of the Islands near by. Mr. Chas. Leith Paul had a sister who married a Lucas of Walterboro, I met her and some of her children when I was a child. A Mrs. Lever of Columbia, S. C. was trying to get some Foy data from me for her brother-in-law, Charles Johnstone of Alaska, his mother was Esther Mary Foy da. of Chas. E. and Jane Aseneth Bostick Foy (see Benj. Bostick form) and I was getting data for Charles E. Foy of Panama City, Fla. a grandson of the above Chas. E. Foy, so she kindly sent me the Bostick data. Mrs. Jenkins, Heywards mother, was the daughter of William Bernard Foy and Eliza Clark, William Bernard Sr. came from France to Canada married an English lady, they were enrouth to Charleston when Mr. Foy became ill and died at sea, their son Wm. B. Jr. was born several months later either in Charleston or Beaufort, the elder Foy gave a strong box to his wife just prior to his death and impressed on her that it contained all of his important papers, but it unfortunately got lost. I have been unable to find much data on either the Foys or Clarks. I think that Mrs. Jenkins' great-grandfather married an Adams but can not prove it, I know that she was related to the Adams, Bowmans, Courtneys and Henrys also DeSaussures. Do you happen to know anything about the Adams or Clarke? I have some Bowman data and some old letters to Mrs. Jenkins from her "Cousin Charlie" Bowman, in which he was asking for data on the Bowman family of Bft.

I Have never met Mrs. Berrian Sanders, but do know that her husband was related to the Sanders' of Beaufort. Mr. Wilson Sanders and his brother Gustav Sanders lived in Beaufort as far back as I can remember, Jennie Sanders, dau. of Wilson, was a devoted friend of mine. Fred Sanders who lives in Jacksonville, is the only one of that family left, Gustave
