A.C. Baynard was a South Carolina State Legislator. As an invalid, he remained in Beaufort during the Federal occupation and died during the war. Two servants buried him at churchyard. A.C. Baynard had a bachelor millionaire brother, about whom much is known from accounts of R.A. Ellis and B.E. Willingham (1st cousins). He left \$166,000.00 to medical college in Chastin. 4. Martha Sarah Chaplin, daughter of Benjamin Chaplin, Jr. and Martha Sarah Reynolds, was born November 5, 1805, Jericho Plantation, Lady's Island, South Carolina. Died April 23, 1889, Chattanooga, Tennessee. Buried there in St. Elmo's Cemetery. She was survived by five children, 45 grandchildren, 89 great grandchildren and one great, great, grandchild.¹¹ Martha Sarah Chaplin married November 1, 1821 Archibald Calder Baynard, son of Thomas Baynard and Sally Calder. The marriage was performed by Rev. Philip Mathews, Beaufort, South Carolina. Archibald was born on Edisto Island, South Carolina in 1798; died in 1865, Beaufort, and is buried on the Reynolds lot, Baptist Churchyard, Beaufort, South Carolina. Archibald graduated second from the top in the Class of 1817 from Old South Carolina College, now the University of South Carolina. A speech impediment prevented his being the first Honor Graduate and the Valedictorian of his class. Martha Sarah and Archibald had eight children, all born on Jericho Plantation, Lady's Island, South Carolina.¹¹

C. Calder A. Baynard (third child of Archibald Calder Baynard and Martha Sarah Chaplin) was born on Jericho Plantation also, date unknown. Married Julia Howard. Died after 1888. ¹¹ I believe he was a minister. R.A. Ellis said he was an exceptionally good man. But was only nephew left out of millionaire uncle Ephraim Baynards will.

D. Julia Sophia Baynard (fourth child of Archibald Calder Baynard and Martha Sarah Chaplin) was born on Jericho Plantation January 23, 1825; died April 4, 1894. Married first Dr. Wilson E. Hall; second, Stephen Gratton Ellis. ¹¹ Son was Richard Archibald Ellis, an attorney in Barnwell, S.C. He wrote Chaplin Family Letter to Aunt

Cecilia Matilda Baynard (third daughter and fifth child of Archibald Calder Baynard and Martha Sarah Chaplin) was born Jan. 10, 1829. ⁶⁰ (one source says 1828¹¹) on Jericho Plantation; died April 11, 1914. Married Thomas Henry Willingham, III, son of Thomas Willingham, II and Phoebe Sarah Lawton. Dr. James Stoney Lawton (husband of Sarah Calder Baynard, above) was a brother of Phoebe Sarah Lawton. Thomas Henry Willingham, III was born July 12, 1825 and died April 29, 1891. Cecilia and her husband had ~~seven~~ children. Her obituary in the Atlanta Constitution dated April 13, 1914, lists her eleven surviving children: ⁶⁰ Thomas died in 1891, some months after

- F. Elizabeth Martha Baynard (sixth child of Archibald Calder Baynard and Martha Sarah Chaplin) was born September 15, 1830, on Jericho Plantation, Lady's Island, South Carolina; died July 17, 1887. Buried in Rose Hill Cemetery, Macon, Georgia. Married February 15, 1848, Benjamin Lawton Willingham, born April 21, 1829, Lawtonville, South Carolina; died February 17, 1898 and is also buried in Rose Hill Cemetery. Benjamin was the son of Thomas Henry Willingham, Jr. and Phoebe Sarah Lawton (Item E, page 31). He and Elizabeth Martha had the following eighteen children:¹¹
- a. Phoebe Sarah Willingham (oldest child of Elizabeth Martha Baynard and Benjamin Lawton Willingham) was born on Black Creek Plantation, Lawtonville, Beaufort District, South Carolina, June 6, 1849; died July 5, 1933. Married Charles Edwin Malone November 15, 1865.¹¹
- b. Thomas Henry Willingham, IV (son of Elizabeth Martha Baynard and Benjamin Lawton Willingham) was born on Black Creek Plantation December 7, 1850; died June 2, 1909. Married Frances Harper Wright November 12, 1872.¹¹
- c. Calder Baynard Willingham (son of Elizabeth Martha Baynard and Benjamin Lawton Willingham) was born on Black Creek Plantation February 29, 1852; died October 26, 1908. Married Lila Martha Ross in Macon, Georgia on September 16, 1873. Martha was born December 17, 1854; died May 2, 1917. She was the daughter of William Alfred Ross and Mary Ann Redding. Calder and Martha are buried in Rose Hill Cemetery, Macon, Georgia. One of Calder's descendants wrote about him: "Well known Baptist church leader, philanthropist and Cotton Factor. Helped many young people obtain an education. Graduate of Washington College (now
