Their children were:

Anna DeYampert, m. EUGENE JOHNSON, had 4 children, two of whom are  
 living in Selma--Charlie Eugene and Hugh McC. Johnson, two died--  
 John Henry and Elizabeth Mary Johnson.

Mrs. Nancy Caroline Clay's two sons died in Sumpter Co. ROBERT  
 CLAY the eldest married MISS HALL of that county, had 2 sons and  
 2 daughters, all married.

Mary Jane McCurdy (author of the sketch) m. DR. JOHN HAZARD HENRY  
 of Selma, AL 4-15-1863, and had one living child when the  
 sketch was written.

ROSSER - Mr. W.W. Sanders, Box 391, Edmond, OK 73034 asks data on  
 ELIJAH ROSSER or ROPER, b. 1783 near Smithfield, Johnston Co., NC,  
 the son of JAMES ROSSER (1739-1798) and ALICE WORTHING. After his  
 father's death, the widow moved with children to Hancock Co., AL  
 where she lived 1800-1820. Elijah may have been in service during  
 the War of 1812. In 1816 he is listed in Mississippi Territory  
 census as ELIJAH ROSER. On 6-24-1818 Elijah ROSSER signed as a  
 justice of the peace in Clarke Co., AL.

The 1830 census of Wilcox Co., AL shows him with two sons 15-20,  
 5 daughters 15 and younger, and 4 slaves.

By 1840 census of Sumter Co., AL he has 3 daus. aged 5-20, and 18  
 slaves. Also in the same household is MARTIN ROSSER, b. 11-14-1814  
 in AL, d. 7-10-1876 in TX. Martin may be Elijah's son.

Martin Rosser's first wife was MARY BARBER, b. ca. 1823 in AL, d.  
 2-13-1857 in Bowie Co., TX.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Are you sure these Rossers were in Alabama 1800-20?  
 There were Rosser families in Hancock Co., GA during this period.
