Nos. 4 - William Henry Fleetwood
and 6, THOMAS CATER FARR

Both belonged to militia
companies. After the
outbreak of the Civil War,
in 1862, these companies
went to Virginia at their
own expense, and were
incorporated into the First
Virginia Cavalry under
J.E.B. Stuart and Wade
Hampton. Both served in
the ARMY OF NORTHERN Va.
during the remainder of
the War taking part in
most of the battles in
which Stuart and Wade
Hampton participated. Neither
received a scratch.

No. 8 - Green Fleetwood
b. 1-16-1810
d. 11-3-1856

He was a planter
and also had maritime
interests.

His plantation was
on Whitemarsh Island
near Turners Rocks
where Turners Creek
flows into the
Wilmington River.
Whitemarsh Island is
not far from Savannah
and at the time was
accessible only by
water from the
mainland. During the
siege of Savannah
(1862-1864) a
skirmish between
Federal Troops which
landed from the
blockading squadron
and Georgia Militia
was fought on and
near the Fleetwood
place.

In Savannah Green
Fleetwood live in a
townhouse on Columbia
Square on Habersham St.
