Dear Mr. Peepshow,

I failed to mention in my last letter, the fact that Jarleton Brown of Barnwell was a pensioner of the Revolution. He died in Barnwell. William H. Peyton of Barnwell ^{was} administrator with the will annexed. He died about Sept 8, 1845, leaving the following children: William B. Brown, Polkville(?) Harley, Lewis M. Brown, Austin B. Brown and Francis C. Peyton. Will probated Sept. 19, 1845. William H. Peyton was still acting as administrator Nov. 19, 1845. In June 1851 Peyton was qualified as administrator.

The above information is obtained from Jarleton Brown pension file in Washington. Apparently Brown's will and estate records in Barnwell would show more light on the family of our interest and further support the statement made to me many years ago by Mr. and Mrs. Millidge B. Fure. Certainly Francis C. Peyton, daughter of Jarleton Brown, and William H. Peyton was her husband.
