Dear Sir:

I have been delayed longer than I expected waiting to gather some notes pertinent to our search of the Furze-Cater connection. I have found my old copy of the entries in the James Furze Bible and I am going to send you a copy in the next few days. It is of very considerable interest and seems to tie the several lines together.

I have been trying to get some information from Barnwell as to the condition and availability of the old record books but have not been able to get any satisfactory report. Of course, if the books are not there they are not available and there is no use of me to go to any expense sending someone over there. In this connection I would thank you to procure for me a copy of the notice of the sale of the Furze property which was published in the Atlanta paper sent me by you some time ago. ~~If you can, for a reasonable price, have a photostatic copy made.~~ I have been wondering as to the advisability of going to Barnwell and may do so or send someone to check the situation there and let me ask you in this connection if you are so situated that you might make a trip of that kind. I am just somewhat in a quandary as to what to do about that as I don't want to spend any money in making the trip and finding nothing in the way of a record. I doubt that the nature of your duties will permit you to be away from your home station long enough to accomplish anything. You wrote me that you knew Mrs. Stanley ^{Hawes} who is secretary or librarian of the Georgia Historical Society. Find out from her if she knows the present address of Jack Ladson who is interested in the Ladson connection with our line of Caters. He made an exhaustive study of Barnwell records some years ago and at that time lived at Moultrie, Georgia but doesn't seem to be there at present. Also discuss with Mrs. Stanley the possibility of getting someone in Augusta or possibly Mrs. Stanley herself to assist me in getting the material that I want and if so what her schedule of charges is.
