p. 56: "This morning died, Capt. Silas Miles, of St. Paul's, parish. (Monday, 1 December 1766."

p. 57: "On the 1st instant died, at her plantation near Ashley-Ferry, upwards of 80 years of age, Mrs. Margaret LADSON, a native of this province, and a daughter of Mr. Daniel Donovan, who was one of the first settlers, and a remarkably distinguished himself by the gallant defence he made against the Indians, during the war with those people, which begun in the year 1715, and the use he made on that occasion of some dogs which he brought with him from Ireland. (Monday, 16 March 1767)"

p. 149: "On the 6th ult. died, at his Plantation in Prince William's Parish, aged 83 years, Captain James MacPherson, a Native of this Province, who in the first Indian War, and at several other periods since, served this Country with Honour and Reputation. As he was remarkable for his Honesty, Generosity and Humanity, and more particularly for his friendly disposition, so his Death is universally regretted. (Thursday, April 4, 1771)- S. C. Gazette

p. 150: "As did on Sunday (died), Mrs. Henrietta Stanyarne (Wife of Mr. James Stanyarne), another valuable woman. (Thursday, June 13, 1771)

p. 152 "On Tuesday last died, at his Plantation on John's Island, Mr. Joseph Stanyarne, aged 72 Years, and a Native of this Province, A Gentleman so well known and respected, that whatever could be here said to preserve his Memory is needless." (Thursday, April 9, 1772)

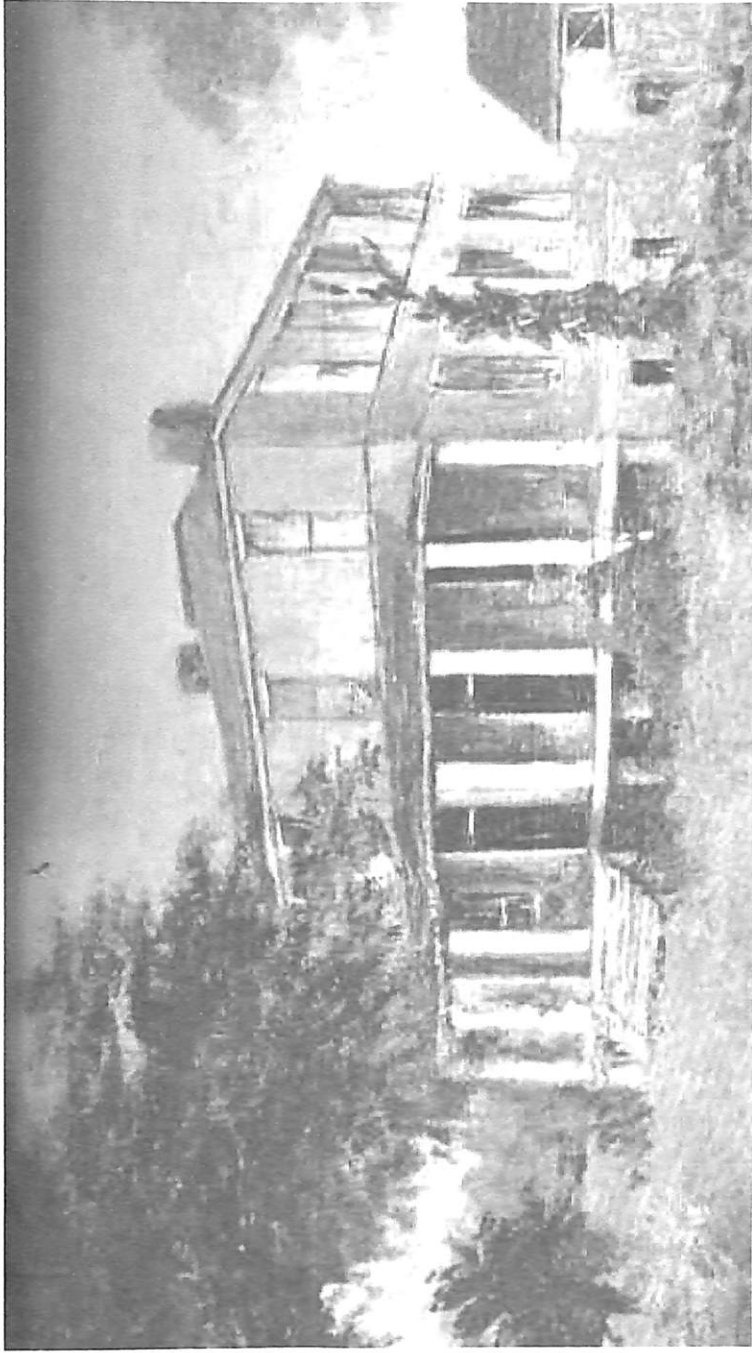
Deed from Edw. Weekly to Thomas Cater 25 Feb. 1726

"Edward Weekly of Berkeley County, for 175, to Thomas Cater, the money to be paid to Dec. 1726, plantation twenty odd acres on north side of Gourdin's Creek on other side of the old horse path adjoining lands of Captain John . . . deceased, part of Landgrave Smith's patent. . . .
