Dear Robert,

It has been two years since we visited together on your friends' porch across from your house. In the interim much has happened; I trust and pray that you and Miss Cora are well.

My skin condition, (highly allergic to paper (chemicals therein) and ink and photocopying paper,) has been worse but is temporarily controlled by a medicine which cannot be taken very long - affects the liver. Hence I am able to research which I have missed $\frac{2}{3}$ very much.

Do you know anything about the Perry family, specifically William Perry who lived in Prince William's Parish and married about 1841 Eugenia Myers - perhaps his second wife - had daughter Adelaide. Theodore Rosegarten identifies

William Perry as a Combahee River rice planter and "Tombee" called him his cousin William Perry (I presume Thomas B. Chaplin means first cousin - I suspect Tombee's mother Isabella Field (Jenkins)(Chaplin)(Fields)(Baker had a Perry mother who was a sister of William Perry's father but I lack proof. Also I think William Perry may have had a Fripp mother or grandmother. William Perry died Jan. 12, 1854 (see Tombee index and Diary entry of TBC).

There are several other questions I have

One is, do you know anything about the various Edward Newfoilles?

One, the Rev^d Edward Newfoille was the first rector 1825/26 of the restored Sheldon church. He left

the parish and was succeeded by the Revd Thos J. Young. There seems to be a possibility that he is the same Edward Newville who served as rector (1827-1851) of Christ Church, Savannah. He also seems to ~~be~~ ^{be} the son or nephew of the Edward Newville whose Estate is listed in the 1830 Beaufort District census. Edward of Savannah speaks of his "adopted" mother Mrs Eunice Newville and he of Savannah had land, about 1850/3, on the Pocotaligo or Tullifening River in Prince William's Parish.

These are my two main areas of concern, questions. If you know

anything of the following please let me know

1. Who the wife of William Hazel (Hayle) of PWP was? Her first name was Rebecca. She was 52 in 1850 and a widow. Her son William's wife was Sarah and in 1850 in their household was Sarah Farmer (48)

A William Hazel of PWP died Sept 30, 1831. and is buried at Sheldon Church. I believe he was Rebecca's husband

2. Dr. Alfred Raoul of PWP, wife Elizabeth, dau. Georgiana

3. Perry Fripp who married Margaret (Marguerite) Chaplin. He died _____ 1841?

4. Paul? Ulmer of PWP - I have information from Todd + Hutson Price William Parikh and Plantations but know nothing of Paul Ulmer.

5. William Cordery - is this a misspelling of Cordray? He and wife K. Cordray had a son Thomas born March 27, 1827 - bapt at Bralsfordville 9/26/1831 William Cordery was in Prince William's Parish around 1825.

Robert, I have missed your letters and our telephone conversations. I may call you before this letter has time to arrive but in any case you will have this in writing. My wife has not been well, breast cancer, which the doctors believe has not spread, but chemotherapy nevertheless. This will continue through May.
