Dear Robert:

As I have written you, I am very anxious to get the Jenkins family typed, the Clark branch is holding me up so do want to make one more effort to get a bit more data. For over a week I have been checking and re-checking all of the data I have on hand which may be of some help and sorting the wheat from the chaff so to speak. I have made several lists which I hope will be of help to you.

Since I know very little about Mrs. Jenkins' Clark family it is like trying to work in the dark, then too there seems to be very little Clark data available. I feel that we have solved the Bellamy-Evelyn-Crawford connection to which Mrs. Jenkins' ~~Grandfather~~ Charlie referred and since he mentioned that his grandmother (Bowman) had a family Bible I believe that her mother must have been a Crawford and married an Adams. Charles Alexander Bowman married Ann Adams, 1825, in Trinity Church, Charleston, S. C. These were Cousin Charley's grandparents. In the Beaufort Library I found records of St. Michael and St. Philips Churches; as I remember neither had many references. I can not remember if they have Trinity Church records or not. If you could locate those records you may find the name of Ann Adams' parents, however as a rule the records only mention the father; even that might lead to something. I only have a few Adams' listed in the SCHM I have. (V, 22, 1922)

I am also enclosing a list of records which may be of some help, some of the books listed are in the Charleston Lib. King St. others may be found in the S. C. Hist. Society, I have never been there. I am hoping that the Huguenot records may have something which might give a clue as to the father of Ann Doharty, Wid. who married Henry Talbot. That of course will come later. I have quite a lot of Talbird data which I will get in shape for later, I still lack a great deal however. I wrote the Archives in London but could get no help there, I plan to write to the Library of Congress but doubt if I get much help, will also try the Archives Dept. They are very helpful, so is the Genealogical branch of the Latter Day Saints. The head of one of the departments gave me a lot of data on one branch of the Talbird family, unfortunately not mine.

I have just found the address of Richard B. McConnell so will get a letter off pronto. Two people sent me a list of William Jenkins' children but left out all dates etc. I have written to a Grand-daughter and gave her a list to fill in but as yet no answer. I also have data on Mr. Jenkins' other brothers and his sisters but no dates, however I will give Mr. McConnell what data I have. Regards to both of you,
