+ deliver unto the sd James Gerald his heirs and Ex^{ors} one negro
girl called Betty To Have & to hold the sd negro girl unto him
for the sd use of grandson Charles Strother + if C. S. should
happen to die under age & without issue then for use of the
sd Mary Strother her heirs and assigns forever & I sd Charles
DeWitt for myself + my heirs the sd negro slave unto sd
James Gerald for aforesd shall + will warrant + forever defend
against all persons or persons whatsoever by these presents in
witness whereof I have herewith set my hand + seal 23 May 1755
Memorandum Before me John Pearson one of his Majesties Justices
for Berkeley & Craven Co. Personally appeared John Hands side & made
oath that he saw Charles DeWitt sign seal his act + deed to James
Gerald together with the above mentioned girl Betty tot for sale
intent + purposes therein mentioned & that himself + Joseph Crell
subscribed names thereto as witnesses Avorn before me 19 Jan 1759
