His daughter Mary DuPont (sister of my great grandmother Ermine DuPont Malone) was co-founder of Phi Mu (old Philimanthum ^{can't spell!}) Sorority at Wesleyan College. Sources think he was either Abraham ^{Strong} DuPont (1st President of National Bank of Charleston) or Eugene DuPont.

From enclosed "In Memoriam" to
 Judge Chas. Henry DuPont - he was
 an ancestor to be proud of - and
 he was a "son of Carolina".
