I have not been able to work on this until recently so it will probably be after Christmas before this will be accomplished. I would assume there would be something left to divide three ways, but that I would hold that until the stone was accomplished. The amount left is \$5567.68 as of this date with interest to this date added in. I still get threatening notices from bill collectors for that place in Sumter where Mama was put until her Medicare ran out. I finally told the last one that apparently the place was as good with records as they were with patients and that I was tired of furnishing check numbers...that it was paid in full. I see the check was 6-6-83 and marked in full. I have about gotten the information for the stones Mama wanted put at the Folk men's graves. If it is agreeable with you I will pay for it out of her money and would count on not more than \$200 for the three. If it is not agreeable, I will pay for it out of my pocket. I would like a comment on this from each of you... in writing. Also, I would like a comment ^{from} on each of you on the waiver you each offered in assuring me of your willingness to help me in closing the estate. I will be glad to let Bob examine the cancelled checks, etc. and he can pass the information on as in the past since you two appear to be in close communication. OR Randolph may examine them at any time. I mentioned Bobby since I may be on the Island before Christmas visiting a friend there and I have no plans to be near Sumter. If you are agreeable to a waiver of the accounting as offered previously, I will appreciate your mailing same. After the stone is purchased, I will send xerox copies of the invoice and distribute the remaining money to the three of us.
