

27, 1814, and drew lands in Wilkes County for service in the Revolution.

JOHN -- Was Private in Lt. William Cooley's Company, Ft. McIntosh, Telfair County, August 16-26, 1813.

WILLIAM -- Served in Greene County Militia under Capt. Thos. Dawson, November, 1813.

That the South Carolina Copelands are connected with the Massachusetts branch founded by LAWRENCE in Braintree, Mass., in 1630 is indicated strongly by the strange discovery some 80 years ago of J. I. McCain, Professor at the time of English at Erskine College, S. C. Professor McCain, writing from Boston stated (article in the Charleston, S. C. "News and Courier" entitled "Who Was Hugh Copeland?") that he had found a grave stone leaning against a tree near the grave of Paul Rivers in Old Granary Burying Ground, the inscription on which reads:

"Here lies buried the body of  
Mr. Hugh Copeland, of South  
Carolina, aged 30 years, who  
died Sept. ye 7th, 1737."

Careful perusal of that monumental work "The Copeland Family" by Warren Turner Copeland, containing the names and records of almost 2,000 of the descendants of LAWRENCE (settled in Braintree, Mass., in 1630), fails to show who HUGH was. It is highly significant, however, that HUGH was born only eight years after the death of LAWRENCE, and that he died while on a visit to Boston less than 40 years later.

HUGH'S place of residence in South Carolina is definitely fixed by a record in the Secretary of State's office in Columbia. It shows that he was granted 300 acres in Williamsburg, Craven County, August 12, 1737 -- less than a month before death overtook him in Boston.

Other grants of interest are these:

CHARLES: 100 acres Dec. 8, 1774, in Craven,

ALEXANDER: 100 acres Dec. 9, 1774, in Craven,

→ ISAAC: 150 acres Jan. 10, 1771, in Granville.

As the names of the Counties referred to have long since disappeared from common usage in maps and records, it may be
