John Fripp apparently arrived in South Carolina between 1670 and 1690. His stock mark was registered in 1698 and in 1701 he was "High Sheriff" of Colleton County. The 1715 map shows the family living west of the Edisto River; he had a land grant (Memorial Book 111, pp. 312-314). He bought land as early as 1707 and in 1724 bought 480 acres on St. Helena's Island.

By 1860 Fripps owned more than 612,000 acres on St. Helena's and nearby islands. At the end of the plantation regeme on St. Helena's Is. the Fripp family had a record of 136 years of planting thereon and

there were 20 Fripp plantations.

Under the Church Act of 1704 Carolina was divided in parishes: St. Helena's Parish was established in 1712, the Parish Church being on its original site in Beaufort where the present building was erected in 1720. In 1756 a Chapel of Ease was built on St. Helena is is is called "the White Church", its ruins are still standing. John Fripp who died in 1781 left 500 pounds to re-model this Chapel, already much to small since there were 70 families on the Is. in 1791. It was not until 1855 that a Baptist Ch. was erected near the center of the Island; owned by the Beaufort Baptist Church, it was taken over by negroes after the War and referred to as the "Brick Church". Many Fripps are buried in the cemeteries adjacent to these two Island Churches and on their family plantations; two Fripp cemeteries are near Frogmore.

In 1826 Capt. John Fripp owned the controlling interest in Hunting Island, then a hunting preserve. It is now a State Park. William Fripp

owned a house in "Helenaville", a summer resort on this Island.

Mrs. Robert Fripp of Beaufort tells a family legend of the vault of John E. Fripp's being broken into by pirates who came on a ship piloted by negroes. His bones were scattered and his brother, Archibald, collected them, placed them in a casket and covered the grave with a stone slab.

On 7 Nov. 1861 the Federal Fleet passed the forts at the entrance of Port Royal Harbor and within a few hours the entire population had deserted Beaufort. Plantation families on St. Helena's Is. refugeed; many family records were lost together with all other possessions. All public records of Beaufort and Colleton Counties were destroyed, and with them much history is lost forever.

"The effect of the Union victory", wrote Gen. The Sherman, "was startling. Every white inhabitant has left the islands of St. Helena and Ladies, and most of Port Royal. The wealthy Island of St. Helena and the Island of Ladies, and most of Port Royal are abandoned by whites, and the beautiful island estates of the planters with their immense property, left to the pillage of the hordes of apparently disaffected blacks."

The lands of the absent Islanders (who were with the Confederate Armies) was sold for taxes and an old established civilization was

ruthlessly replaced by an experiment.

The Immigrant John Fripp came from Bristol, England; at least one Mayor of Bristol was a Fripp. John Fripp was a widower with an only son, William. The next Fripp of record is John Fripp, born 1681 in Wales died 1742, apparently the grandson of the Immigrant.

born 1681 in Wales dated his Will 1 May 1742 (Chas. Will Bk. Vol.5, re-I. JOHN FRIPP corded 14 Aug. 1744: "I, John Fripp, Senior, of (Sarah Frampton) St. Helena Island, South Carolina, planter..." He was buried 29 May 1742, aged 61 yrs, therefore born 1681 (SCHM Vol. 23. pp66-67 & 15) Sarah Fripp was buried 9 Jan. 1756 at St. Helena.

John's Will mentions his wife, Sarah, but no living children; he leaves bequests to 3 grandchildren, "sons of my son, John, lately deceased".
