Please pardon the delay in replying to your letters of 3rd October and 14th October in detail. I have been in the throes of trying to get out a small printing of the deBohun Line and some of the maternal lines involved and, consequently, have not been able to really try to answer your inquiries.

I am today in receipt of a wonderful letter from Mrs. John Heyward Jenkins and some very comprehensive family information, which I am delighted to have for my Glover records. I certainly appreciate your good offices and the kindness of Mrs. Jenkins in going to all this trouble and shall write her accordingly.

Coming back to your letter of the 3rd of October, I enclose thermafax copies of various pertinent lines and some transcriptions, which may be of interest.

With regard to the mother of Elizabeth Fitz Lewes, who married Sir John Wingfield, (ob. 1491), whose mother I show to be Ann, daughter of John Montagu, whereas your records make her the daughter of Sr. John Neville, my authority for Montagu appears to be "MAGNA CHARTA SURETIES, 1215", Page 20, Line 20, Generation 10.

Thank you so much for all of the supplementary information concerning the family of Mrs. Frederick Henry Horlbeck, which has been duly posted in my records. I am sorry, of course, that I did not have this information at the time of the publication of "Glover Cousins".

Unfortunately, I have nothing further on the Bowman family of Colleton County, but suggest that you might write to Miss Beulah Glover in Walterboro, (see page 49 of "Glover Cousins"), as she is very well posted on the Glover family and their connections and has written a book, "Narratives of Colleton County."
