Paul Grimball (Thos 2. Paul 1-) since he is named  
as executor in his father's will, was probably  
born about 1700 and died between June 29, 1749  
and 30 and June 25, 1750/51. He was a planter of  
Edisto Island and died there. Paul Grimball  
married several times, certainly three and we  
have the maiden name of only one of his  
wives. Mary Barnwell, daughter of Col John Barnwell  
who seems to have been his second wife.  
His last wife was Mary, daughter, Susannah  
Humborn, widow of Thos. Humborn by a former  
marriage; after the death of Paul Grimball,  
this wife, Mary, married Capt William Garnton  
for her third wife and after his death she married

Wife Mary 1/4 share of slaves and use of 500 acres on Edisto Island for life or widowhood; (Copy is badly mutilated and parts not decipherable) Son Paul, Grinnall Island called Grinckley's Island, 842 acres, south west of Edisto; but if son Paul die under 21 without issue, then to the next son born of my said wife, and in want of such son, executors to sell and divide among daughters Mary, Catherine, Elizabeth and Providence and any other daughter or daughters which may be born when 21 or married.

Has already given to daughter Ann Grinke, wife of Mr Paul Grinke of Charlestown jeweller certain parts of personal estate as is equal for her; to said daughter Ann Grinke 500 acres on Edisto Island commonly called the P- piece adjoining the plantation where he now lives unto . . . Isaac Gumball married for his second wife Rebecca (Sealey?) she died between Jan. and April 10-1767, leaving her son John Gumball and John Sealey Jr. executors of her will which mentions her sister Mary Whipple

Nov 10. 1750 by Richard Ash. The said 600 acres at the death of Paul Grumball Sr. fell to his son Paul, as heir at law; this second Paul died leaving an only child and daughter Martha, at whose death the said lands

On Dec. 14, 1768 as John Grumball of St Luke's Parish, planter, he released to Thomas Searson, 194 acres, part of 1000 acres originally granted to Capt Charles Edingsell, bounding west on Col. Daniel Heyward, South on John Grumball, East on the estate of John Sealy and - on branch of Port Royal River <sup>②</sup>

On Nov 25 1773, as John Grumball, son of Paul, he gives bond for £ 10000 to John Grumball, son of Isaac, to secure the latter from any obligations which might arise from the fact that John, son of Paul, had been buying and selling lands and negroes under the appellation of John Grumball Jr. when it should have been Sr; signed John Grumball Sr., James Pelot, Samuel Pelot and John Swinton witnesses.

On July 26 - 1778 as of St Peter's Parish, with Elizabeth his wife, planter, he conveys to Abraham Smerat <sup>③</sup> 400 acres in several tracts, on New River, Call Bar Bay, sold to him by Elias Robert, John Audubert -

John Grumball (Isaiah 3 Lhos. 2. Paul 1) Son of  
 Isaac Grumball and his second wife Rebecca  
 Sealy, was born according to the family account  
 Sept 12 1748; his tombstone in the Unitarian (formerly  
 Congregational) Church yard, states that he died  
 Nov 8, 1804 aged 53 yrs, which brings date of birth  
 in year 1751; thus John Grumball had lands  
 in St Luke's Parish, Fairfield plantation  
 and owned a house on South Bay in Charleston  
 according to his family, he married at least  
 6 times, one wife being his cousin, a daughter  
 of Thomas Grumball <sup>(no 8)</sup>, and sister to Major  
 Thos. Grumball jr. and to Joseph Grumball (no 13)  
 this is supported by the will of John Grumball  
 who calls Thomas Grumball, son of Joseph  
 his nephew. In June 1784, John Grumball  
 of Edisto Is. married Mrs Ann Adams, widow  
 of Mr John Adams <sup>11</sup> The family account states  
 that he married two Miss Berkleys; certainly he married  
 sometime in April 1797 Elizabeth Berkley, dau of  
 Mr John Berkley, of Hilton, planter; John Grumball being  
 then described as of Beaufort Dist., planter, the marriage  
 settlement was dated April 21 - 1797. Paul Hamilton  
 of St Bartholomew's Parish and Morten Waring of  
 Charleston being the trustees; the date of the

marriage is given in the Circular (Congregational)  
Church register as April 2 - 1797.

John Gumball's will dated Dec 13, 1801 proved  
April 16 - 1806, describes him as being of St  
Lukes Parish, Beaufort Dist. planter. Here  
divides his plantation, Fairfield, from the  
north edge of the canal which joins near the  
house of Thomas Drayton Esq. on his Ocean plant-  
ation . . . to the west line of Jacob Gurnard on  
Bee's Creek, unto the use to the Old Settlement, to  
his wife Eliza for life or widowhood, then to  
his dau. Eliza Gumball; if his dau. died un-  
married, then to his son John Berkeley Gumball  
and in case said son died unmarried under  
21, then to his nephew Isaac Gumball Jenkins, son  
of Isaac G. Jenkins, of Edisto Island.

To son John Berkeley Gumball, the tract of  
Fairfield plantation called the New Settlement,  
if he died under 21, unmarried, then to Eliza  
Gumball, if said dau. die under 21, and  
unmarried then to nephew Thomas Gumball.  
Wife to use of three negroes, horses and furniture  
in house in Charleston, use of said house and  
the house on Sulbrans Island for widowhood, then

Paul Grumball (Joshua 4, Joshua 3 Thos 2 Paul 1) born 1766 died 1832 married June 1787, Sarah Chaplin of St. Helena (1766-1832); his uncle-in-law James Clark was appointed his guardian in Oct. 1781 on Oct 14, 1789, as Paul Grumball of Edisto Island, with Sarah his wife, he conveyed to Ralph Bailey of same plantation called Point of Pines, 1262 acres bounding north on North Edisto River, East on Josiah Mikell and Paul Hamilton, South on William Mikell, West on Thomas Shaly, Joseph Fiskling and James Clark <sup>(13)</sup> This plantation was part of a grant of 1500 to the first Paul Grumball, who seems to have left it to his wife for life, and then to his son Thomas; Thomas Grumball (1000) acres) and his son Joshua (500 acres) Paul apparently gave 500 acres of his tract to his daughter Ann, and his son-in-law, John Paul Grimke; and Grimke sold this 500 acres to Joshua Grumball June 20, 1749 <sup>(14)</sup> the bounds then being N.E. on Joshua Grumball S.E. on Paul Grumball, west on - James; the titles of all of this land have not been followed. (22)
