Dear Cousin Robert,

What a delight to return from vacation and find your letter. I'm pleased to know all the information included in same and will try to respond as best I can. My sister and I have been involved in our "roots" for only two years, much to our regret, and are still learning.

It seems that both sides of my family did little research in Texas so therefore, our families were omitted from the Eldred/Robert/Jaudon connection as well as the Gavin Pou (Orangeburg, SC 1740's) line. I do want Annie Millier's book and my check is enclosed. (Do you have her address - she mentions the name Pou in her book.)

With reference to Stafford's TPRF, there are mistakes on my line - Daniel Robert Eldred is referred to several times as Robert Daniel Eldred, and on page 230, Sarah Tanner is shown as marrying Robert Daniel Eldred, also mentioned on page 173, and he failed to mention Susan Eliza Robert.

I have visited and corresponded with Mary Eleanor Blakewood Marshall (page 170 TPRF) granddaughter of Peter Robert Eldred and Evolina Macelia Græffin. Am enclosing some of her correspondence as it is quite helpful.

I referred to Joseph L. (Leonidis) Robert as referenced in TPRF, page 91. Also, pages 91-98 include information of Joseph Benjamin Robert's connection.

With reference to the Eldred line, also in the 1790 SC census, vol 3, page 35, Charleston, St. Bartholomew Parish, : Eldrig, Randan, 1 FWM 16+, 1 FWM 16-, 1 FWF and 3 slaves. Since the deed for the Green Savannah Plantation gives St. Bartholomew as the Parish, I feel this is the correct entry, as does Mrs. Marshall. There was a sister, Freelope, who as a widow Elliott, married William Patterson (copy) and I have been unable to trace this line as yet. I've tried connecting the Eldreds with those in Rhode Island, but there are missing links I can't connect as yet. On a recently discovered Inventory of Randal Eldred dated 4 Dec 1795, the appraisement was provided by Eleanor Eldred. On the deed, Randal's wife was listed as Ann----

Esther Susannah Robert and Randal Eldred, Jr.'s children are outlined on pgs 152-173 in TPRF. However, family records list 3 girls that may have died in childhood. The list provided by my aunt, Esther Lehmann Bailey is:

My aunts are still living and my aunt Esther is in possession of the Eldred family bible.

My father married Bessie Mae Brigance (b 4/19/1902) and my sister, Miriam Ex (named after Aunt Esther) was born in 1924, my brother, Gus Eugene, born on leap year as (1928) was my grandfather Lehmann and I was born in 1933.

It seems the marriage of first cousins, which seemed to be prevalent in the Robert line, caught up with the families as the children died very early in Daniel's family. Also, the names are very similar through the generations.

We hope to be able to attend the reunion in June '85 - that would be most interesting - I'm very fond of South Carolina and would like to go back to do more research on the Eldreds and Pous.

I hope this information is sufficient as I have just begun - it does get involved. Would appreciate receiving copies of your articles as they are most interesting.

I have read with interest your article, JAUDON OF CAROLINA, in Transactions #88 of The Huguenot Society of South Carolina. As a descendant of Peter Robert, there are questions concerning this line as printed in your article and possibly you could be of assistance.


My line follows through Esther Susannah Robert and Randall Eldred. Their son, Daniel Robert Eldred married Susan Eliza Robert, daughter of Joseph B. Robert and Mary Augustine Griffin. The marriage bond was signed by her father, J. B. Robert. This J. B. Robert is the son of Joseph (L) Robert and Mary Hyrne Jaudon and possibly the eldest son. In addition to Susan Eliza (the eldest) their children were Franklin Agrippa Robert and Sarah Evolina Robert. Also Joseph Benjamin Robert, who died in childhood. On page 122 of the subject transaction, Joseph B. Robert was omitted from the list of children of Joseph Robert and Mary Hyrne Jaudon.

You mentioned a list of 97 residents who traveled to Woodville, Mississippi. Is there a list of names available for these travelers? The parents of Randall Eldred, Jr. are the most elusive in my genealogical research. [Randall Eldred, Sr. and his wife, Ann (Nonemacker?)] deeded the plantation, Green Savannah to Randall, Jr. in 1795, but I have no further reference, and I was wondering if they were included on the trek to Miss.?

Any information available on the Eldred family would be appreciated.

Your article was most interesting, and I look forward to the continuation.

Dear Marijo,

At long last, I have begun to try to dig out some of the info you want on the Eldred and Allied families. There is so much material and with the three and four marriages and intermarriages in the families, to say nothing of the repetition of names, it can become very confusing. For example, I note discrepancies in birth and death in family Bibles of members of the same family; these often do not agree with tombstone and probate records. Have you noticed this to be true in the Bible records you sent me?

I sincerely thank you for the Daniel Robert Eldred Bible record. You did not send the page recording Deaths. If it is available, I would like to have it as it may, also, give dates of others than the family. Except for what is given in Three Pioneer Rapides Families by Stafford (which I shall cite hereafter as Three Families or 3F/page #. I use the latter in my notes) I had practically nothing on the descendants of Mary A. Griffin and Joseph B. Robert. Thanks so much for your contribution. I would like to know something about where these families came from, where they lived and where they are buried.

Thanks, also, for the picture of Peter Robert Eldred. I had borrowed the old tintype from my cousin, Virginia Gray Moncla, daughter of my father's sister, Florence A. Blakewood Gray, but Virginia did not know whose picture it was. So you have furnished the proof of what I suspected. Let me say here that my grandmother, Mary Henrietta Eldred, wife of Dr. Bettison William Blakewood, became blind several years after she was widowed and could no longer maintain the home as its head. Consequently, she lived with her children, rotating her time. She was a very intelligent, lovely Christian and we always looked forward to the time when she would come to us. In my youth, the older folks were revered. When she moved about, she took Bibles, pictures, family memorabilia, etc. with her and much was left behind or lost. Most of the records were at Aunt Florence's, the eldest daughter. When Aunt Florence died, all of these things were scattered among her children and the rest burned. Most of the children are now deceased and their children know nothing of the records. Virginia has practically nothing left as her children have taken what they wanted and these records are now scattered, too.

I am sorry I cannot shed any light on the marriage of Daniel Robert Eldred to Sarah Robert referred to in 3F/132, 1.3, 230. The record I have comes from Avoyelles Parish Marriage Records, Bk. B-2, Page 31:

Filed with loose papers in a drawer. I found the Marriage Bond dated 30 Sep 1842, Daniel Robert Eldred and Peter Robert Eldred, bonds-
 men; Susan Eliza Robert, Consent of father, J. B. Robert.

I am sorry your trip to South Carolina resulted in disappointment. Judging by my experience, it is like looking for a needle in a haystack. However, I go back every chance I have and try again. I am enclosing three xerox copies from my notebook which are more or less work sheets on the Eldred family. The first record I have of the Eldred family in S. C. is the Deed of Gift of the Green Savannah Plantation, St. Bartholomew Parish, Charleston Dist., S. C. by Randal Eldred, Sr., shopkeeper, to his son, Randal Eldred, Jr, dated 22 April 1795. Randal Eldred, Jr., b. 1780, was a minor only 15 yrs. of age. It was suggested to me that this deed represents Randal, Jr.'s share of his deceased mother's estate when his father married Ann Newnamaker. This was a custom prevalent in those times. This is only a supposition but should be borne in mind when researching.

If I were involved in going back with the line, as you are, I would search North Carolina records as the records say Randal, Jr. was born in North Carolina.

The plantation of Randal Eldred, Jr. and Esther Susannah Robert in Rapides Parish, La. is now called Bennettville (see p 2 of notes). In 1960, the old house was being repaired and an old trunk filled with letters, ledgers and miscellaneous papers was found in a sealed off room in the attic. Some of these papers were given to LSU-A which is between Alexandria and Lecompse. Many of the letters were written by Sarah Providence Eldred, wife of Ezra Bennett and mother of George W. Bennett. (See 3F/171-2) The letters are headed "Eldred Bend" Plantation" and written 1862 forward. References are made to deaths and burials in the community in graveyards on the plantations. Lillian Jackson, my sister, and I have searched for these old cemeteries, but, in most cases, the plows got there first. All of this area is very fertile, and once farms were mechanized, all acreage was put in cultivation. I had not heard of the Dunwoody Hill cemetery, but the Dunwoody Place and Eldred Bend are just about a mile apart. (For Dunwoody see 3F/203-4). I know the place and have never seen an old cemetery. As for Lillian having DAR mark the grave, it would not be possible as Randal Eldred was born in 1780 when the war was coming to a close.

Last week I tried to contact a descendant of Randal Bettison Eldred who, at one time, had some Eldred records in the bank vault. All of these people are now dead and the one surviving member said she had destroyed so much because she could not store the accumulation of all the family. She promised to look, but I am not hopeful as she is a busy teacher and unless it is meaningful to you, it is a tedious task. I found some notes I had taken from the Wallace Eldred record and they are on page 3 of the xerox copy. Read the chapter on Esther Susannah Robert in 3F/152 et. seq. I have a newspaper article regarding the will of Randal Eldred, Jr., but have not been able to find it yet. An oilfield opened up some years back at Bala in the southwestern corner of Avoyelles Pr. near the line separating Avoyelles from St. Landry and Evangeline parishes. The Eldred family, Peter Robert, Daniel Robert, Ann Martha, Randal, Jr., their father, were active traders in land in that area; consequently, records pertaining to Eldred land titles in the area have vanished from the Avoyelles Pr. courthouse. There is an empty jacket for the succession of Randal Eldred, Jr. It is said the lawyers borrowed the records and never returned them.

This is getting to be a very long letter, but I wanted to give you a feeling for these people and not just statistical data. The Stafford book covers the Robert-Eldred families very well. A compiler works with what he has, and often information is lacking, contradictory or confusing. Often Joseph Robert is confused with his son, Joseph Benjamin Robert. Joseph Robert died before the Civil War and records of his succession which had been opened were lost when the courthouse at Alexandria, Rapides Pr., La., was burned by Banks. Joseph B. Robert remarried 3 Feb 1841 which gives an approximate date of the death of his first wife, Mary Augustine Griffin; the second marriage was to Elizabeth Thomas, a thrice married widow. Stafford's record (3F/94) confuses the father and son. You will also note Daniel Robert Eldred is sometime written Robert Daniel Eldred. There was a tract of land near me patented by Robert Lincoln Eldred, but title abstractors cannot identify him.

Using the book, you can see we are connected thru the Robert and Griffin lines. Esther Susannah and Randal Eldred, Jr. were our common ancestors. We are also connected thru the Griffin line. The first record I have of the Griffin family which has been proved begins with James Griffin.

James Griffin was born in Virginia between 1765 and 1775 (where?) (Parentage unknown). He came to Miss. Territory before 1799, and there are many land claims recorded in American State Papers for one or more James Griffins in the Adams Co. (Natchez) area. In 1799, he deeded slaves to his minor daughter Sarah Griffin because he was moving. He is shown on census records of 1810 and 1820 in Rapides Pr., La. on Bayou Cotile which is in the Hot Wells area near the town of present day Boyce. For more information, read 3F/173 thru 217. His large plantation has since been absorbed by the surrounding plantations, but I have visited the old graveyard. At this late date, no markers could be found for him or his 2nd wife Elizabeth Miller who predeceased him. He died after Jan 27, 1829 and before Dec. 11, 1829 when his daughter Mary A. bought land in Avoyelles Parish with money she heired from her father.

MARY A. GRIFFIN, deceased wife of said JOSEPH B. ROBERT, and mother of said heirs, of all the property movable as well as immoveable belonging to the community heretofore existing between the said Mrs. Griffin, deceased, and Joseph B. Robert. 2nd, A partition in kind between the same parties hereinabove named of one eighth of the value of all property, movable as well as immoveable belonging to said community being the portion coming to Joseph B. Robert as surviving father one fourth and by the other three named parties as brother and sisters together three fourths or by each one fourth. You will allot to Joseph B. Robert one half of the community property and to the other three named parties

each one eighth besides the portion coming to each as aforesaid out of the estate of JOSEPH BENJAMIN ROBERT, deceased. ...etc....

This property is located just outside Bunkie and the old home was on tour last year. Called Hillcrest.) *New owned by J. B. Luke*

ADAMS CO., MISS. BOX NO. 37 ESTATE OF RICHARD MILLER, dec'd, with William E. Hall, Administrator

Dec. 11, 1832 - Received of William E. Hall, Administrator of the estate of Richard Miller, dec'd, that portion of the personal estate of said deceased, which descended and was distributed to Elizabeth Griffin, one of the children of the said Miller, which said ELIZABETH died leaving seven children, namely; - John F. Griffin, Mary A. Griffin, now Mary A. Robert, Susan L. Griffin, now Susan L. Sims, Evolina Griffin, now Evolina Eldred, Thomas Griffin, James Griffin, William Griffin, which said children of Elizabeth are grandchildren of said Miller. This to operate as a receipt for the share of the personal estate, the same being undivided among the said children. 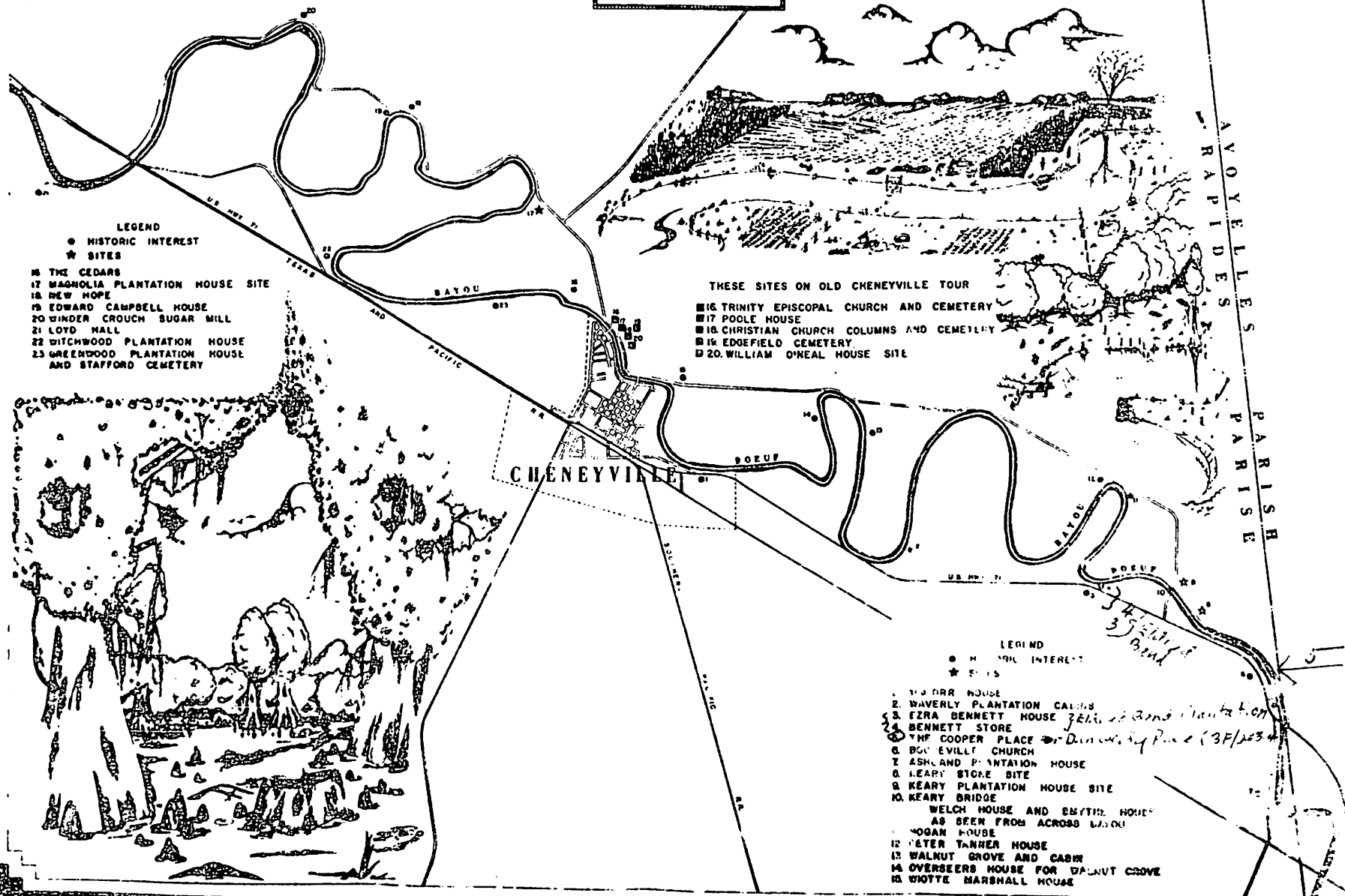
BAYOU DRIVE THE BAYOU BOEUF COUNTRY

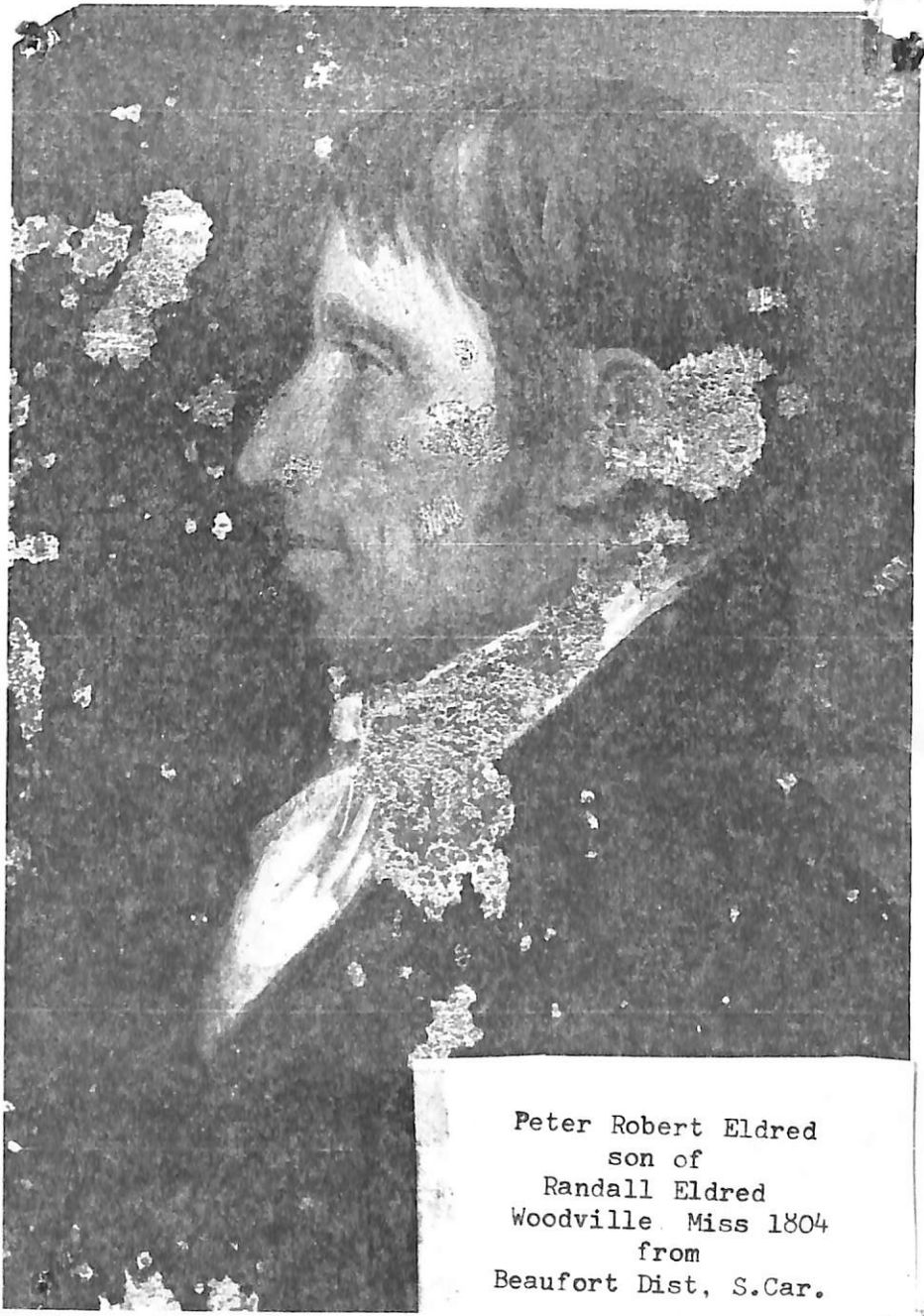
