WILLIAM AMBROSE JAUDON (Daniel¹, Elias³, James Elias⁹, Charles²²), born 10 Aug 1830, son of Charles Jaudon of St. Peter's Parish and his third wife, Susan Stokes, moved to Savannah at age 16 and became a clerk in a clothing store. He enlisted in the Chatham Artillery in 1861 and was stationed at Isle of Hope until 1864 when he was appointed a Purchasing Agent for the Confederate States of America. After selling Confederate bonds in England, he purchased blankets, medicines and other supplies. Upon his attempted return to Georgia, he found the U.S. Blockade so tight that he was ordered to Nassau where he sold the supplies and returned the funds to the Confederate Treasury. After the war, he owned his clothing business with several successive partners. He married 2 Jun 1869 in Rahway, N.J., Mary Elizabeth Scudder (30 Jul 1841 - 25 May 1920), daughter of J. Scudder of Savannah, widow of Robert Smythe of Rahway. William A. and Mary Elizabeth (Scudder) Jaudon are buried in Laurel Grove Cemetery, Savannah. Their children were:¹³⁵

THOMAS JEFFERSON JAUDON (Daniel¹, Elias³, James Elias⁹, Charles²²), born 10 Apr 1831 in St. Peter's Parish, son of Charles Jaudon and his third wife, Susan Stokes. He was a dry goods merchant in 1850 and 1860 in Savannah, where he married 1 Nov 1860 in Trinity Methodist Church, Anne Eliza Heidt (14 Oct 1843 - 19 Jul 1917), daughter of Rev. Emanuel and Frances L. (Grayson;) Heidt. He enlisted in Co. G., 1st Infantry Regiment, C.S.A., serving during 1861 and 1862. In 1870 he was a merchant in Effingham Co., Ga. and in 1880 was back in Hampton Co., S.C. The *Hampton County Guardian* of 19 Dec 1889 describes a 20-mile trip from Hampton through Stafford and Robertville to Hennis Cross Road on Savannah River where Thomas Jefferson Jaudon had a fine store and steam mill and was doing a good business there. The trip took four hours. The children of Thomas Jefferson and Anne Eliza (Heidt) Jaudon were:¹³⁶

EUGENE PORTER JAUDON (Daniel¹, Elias³, James Elias⁹, Charles²²), born 7 Jun 1845, son of Charles Jaudon and his fourth wife, Anna Christiana Blount. He was a farmer in Effingham Co., Ga. where he married 22 Dec 1875 Marietta M. (Mollie) Morgan (11 Nov 1850 - 16 Jan 1941), daughter of William G. and Frances Abigail (Gnann) Morgan. Eugene Porter Jaudon died 15 Jun 1927 and both he and his wife are buried in Springfield Cemetery. Their children were:¹³⁷

JAMES DEBOURDEAUX JAUDON (Daniel¹, Elias³, James Elias⁹, Charles²²), born 28 Jun 1851 in St. Peter's Parish, son of Charles Jaudon and his fourth wife, Ann Christiana Blount, owned a grocery store in Tillman, S.C. for many years. He married 22 Dec 1886 Mary Josephine (Minnie) Deloach (8 Feb 1869 - 14 Jun 1908), daughter of A. M. and Martha Deloach. James deB. Jaudon died 16 Aug 1919; both he and his wife are buried in Stafford Baptist Churchyard, near Furman,

ROBERT OLIN JAUDON (Daniel¹, Elias³, James Elias⁹, Charles²²), born 8 Jun 1852, son of Charles Jaudon and his fourth wife, Ann Christiana Blount, was a farmer in Effingham Co., Ga.; he married 19 Apr 1883 Leola L. Morgan (20 Dec 1865 - 6 Jun 1928), daughter of A. Green and Anza (Dawson) Morgan. Robert Olin Jaudon died 6 Nov 1933 and was buried beside his wife in Springfield Cemetery. EMMA EMMELINE JAUDON (Daniel¹, Elias³, James Elias⁹, William²³), born 18 Aug 1837 in St. Peter's Parish, S.C., daughter of Elias James William Josias Jaudon and his second wife, Susan Porter, was married by the Rev. Charles C. Chovin in Robertville 22 Dec 1856 to Thomas Archibald Arthur Askew (1 May 1832 - 25 Dec 1899), son of Thomas Archer and Lucia Mary (Behn) Askew. He served as Sergeant, C.S.A. in the Chatham Artillery in 1861, stationed at Fort Pulaski. Later he was elected Lieutenant, stationed at King's Bridge, James Island, S.C. with a section of the Battery, at one point in immediate command of the Battery. In 1875 he was a charter member and officer of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, Magnolia Encampment. From early manhood he was in the dry goods business, working his way up from clerk to buyer, and was on a buying trip to New York when he died of yellow fever. Emma (Jaudon) Askew died 28 May 1912; both are buried in Laurel Grove Cemetery, Savannah. Their eight children were:¹⁴²
