 James de ~~Bordeaux~~ Jaudon (Daniel¹, Elias³, Elias⁸) was born 7 Feb 1786, the son of Samuel Timothy (1739-1808) his wife (1753-1792) late / Elias Jaudon, Jr., and Mary Hyrne Smith Dixon. In 1810 he traveled [to Mississippi] with Joseph J. Lawton, Benjamin T. D. Lawton and their brother-in-law ^{Jr.} Thomas Polhill, [from South Carolina] (dated 13 Oct. 1810) on a Georgia Passport

through the Creek Nation of Indians, and returned to South Carolina in 1812. ⁴ In 1813 He was a Trustee ^{of the marriage settlement} at the wedding of his sister Judith Rebecca Jaudon to Thomas Polhill, on 3 Aug. 1813

He was Postmaster of Robertville 1816-1819 during which time he married ⁶ (c. 1824).
