MARY ELIZABETH LAWTON (Daniel¹, Sarah⁴, Sarah Robert¹⁴, B.T.D. Lawton²⁵), born 1823 at Lawtonville, youngest child of Benjamin T. D. and Jane (Mosse) Lawton, married May 1841 Lawtonville, Dr. Theodore deHon Mathews, born 1816 Hilton Head Island, son of Rev. Philip Mathews, died 1828, Rector of St. Luke's Parish, for whom Mathews Drive, Hilton Head Island is named, and his wife Rebecca Davant (1793-1859, heiress of Sand Hill and Folly Field Plantations. His sister Sarah L. Mathews married 1835 Winborn Benjamin Lawton (1812-1884), son of Rev. Winborn Asa Lawton. In 1846 Dr. and Mrs. Mathews travelled by stagecoach to Albany, Ga., bought a lot and built a home at the corner of Pine and Jackson Streets. Her father, Benjamin T. D. Lawton died while visiting them and was buried in Oakview Cemetery, as were two of their children. They returned to St. Peter's Parish in 1854 where Dr. Mathews continued his practice.

Paul JAUDON, IV (Daniel¹, Paul⁵, Paul¹⁵, Paul²⁶) was born c1805, the son of Paul Jaudon III and Elizabeth (surname unknown). IN 1830 he was a planter in Georgetown with 28 slaves, and 30 "free persons of color". He married Eleanor Martha McDonald (c1800-60 yrs. in 1870), the daughter of Adam McDonald and Catherine (June?)^{m. D. c. 1832} In the 6 Nov 1834 issue of the Winyaw Intelligencer is a notice for all persons having demands against ^{his wife's} Paul Jaudon late of this district deceased.
