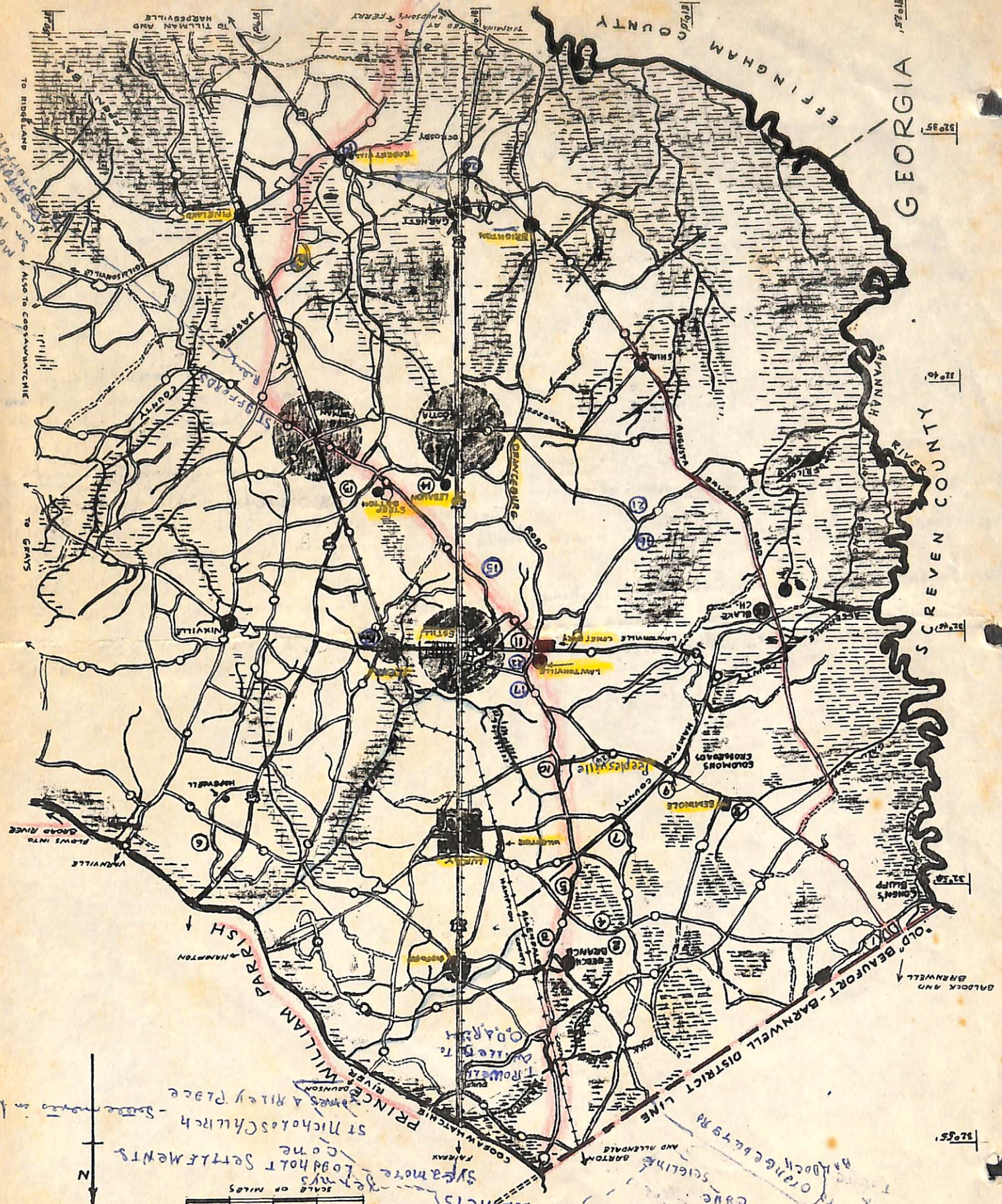
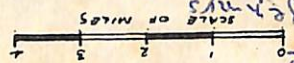
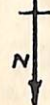

15. The Hermitage, plantation residence of Hon. George Rhodes (11 Jan 1802 - 2 Oct 1881), Signer of The Ordinance of Secession as Representative from St. Peter's Parish, burned 8 Feb. 1865 by Gen. Sherman's 20th Corps.
16. Jericho, plantation residence of John Lawton and his wife Elizabeth Stoney Peeples who was given Jericho as a wedding present by her father, Edward Harden Peeples, in 1851.
17. Plantation residence of Edward Harden Peeples (9 Oct 1811 - 24 Nov 1892) Capt., C.S.A., and his wife Charlotte Esther Lawton; built 1857, it was burned by Gen. Sherman's 20th Corps 8 Feb. 1865.
18. Plantation residence of Thomas Willingham, Jr. and his wife Phoebe Sarah Lawton (sister of Charlotte Esther Lawton Peeples, both daus. of Benjamin Themistocles D'Ion Lawton and his wife Jane, dau. of Dr. George Mosse); built 1828, accidentally burned 1930.
19. Robertville Baptist Church; ~~Dean~~ James Jehu Robert (4 Nov. 1781 - 19 Jan. 1852) was ~~Deacon~~ here for 50 years; Joseph and Sarah Robert Lawton are buried in the Churchyard.
20. Black Swamp Methodist Church, burned by vandals 1968, built 1790.
21. Episcopal Church of The Heavenly Rest, St. Peter's Parish Church after the burning of St. Peter's Church, Robertville in 1865.
22. Plantation home of John Williamson Peeples (27 Oct. 1850 - 4 Apr. 1914) and his wife, Eliza Jane (Lila) Rhodes (6 Oct. 1852 - 28 March 1915), married 8 April 1869; this home was built in 1887 and burned in 1916; an earlier residence stood immediately across the Orangeburg Road from it. IN 1912 Mr. and Mrs. Peeples moved to their handsome residence at West Seaboard Ave. and 5th Street in Estill.
23. Robert Family Cemetery
24. Plantation residence of Jesse Williamson Peeples, member of S.C. Legislature from St. Peter's Parish, assassinated 1856.
