- e. The Corporation is chartered in perpetuity and will be governed, managed, operated and controlled by a self-perpetuating Board of Directors.
- f. The Corporation's purpose is to support educational, charitable, scientific and literary work for and on behalf of the Lawton family, specifically by holding meetings, sponsoring lectures, erecting and maintaining historical markers and memorials, granting scholarships, publishing and distributing books and pamphlets, and various related activities of a non-political nature.
- g. The Corporation will not chiefly be oriented towards fund-raising activities; its receipts will be principally from donations by interested persons. It does plan to publish and distribute a few pamphlets and books of a local and historical nature.
- h. Educational: Corporation proposes to sponsor meetings and lectures, educational and historical in nature, to publish pamphlets and books, to erect historical markers, memorials and monuments and to maintain them.
Charitable: Corporation plans to grant educational scholarships and grants for historical research and to make distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.
Scientific: Corporation plans to sponsor historical research chiefly in South Carolina history, to make grants for such research and to publish and distribute the results thereof.
Literary: Corporation proposes to publish and distribute books and pamphlets chiefly of historical interest.
