LINEAGE

This family has possessed the manor of Lawton since the reign of Henry VI, and by well-founded tradition, from a much earlier period. The pedigree, however, prior to that date cannot be perfectly traced; we shall, therefore, begin with the earliest member of the family from whom there is a clear deduction, viz.:

ARMS: Argent, on a fess between three cross-crosslets fitchee Sable, a cinquefoil of the first, pierced of the second.

CREST: A demi-wolf salient regardant Argent, vulned in the back Gules, and licking the wound.

These Arms and Crest were granted by Robert Cook, Clarendieux by l'res patentes Dated 14 R. Elizabeth 1572.

## TEMPLE OF STOWE

The Temple family derives its surname from the manor of Temple, Leicestershire; its pedigree is recorded in the Visitation of Leicestershire 1619, showing descent from:

Peter Temple, in the latter years of Edward VI, had a grant of the manor of Marston Boteler, Warwickshire and was Lord of the manor of Stowe, Buckinghamshire; he married Millicent, daughter of William Jekyll of Newington, Middlesex; he died 28 May 1577; their two sons were: 1. John, the heir, and 2. Anthony, ancestor of the Viscounts Palmerston.

John Temple, Lord of Stowe, died 9 May 1603, married Susan, dau. and heiress of Thomas Spencer of Everton, Northamptonshire; their eldest son:

Sir Thomas Temple, 1st Baronet Stowe, created baronet 24 Sept. 1611, baptized 9 Jan. 1567, M. P. for Andover 1588-89, died 1637; married 1595 Hester (died 1656), dau. of Miles Sandys of Latimers, Buckinghamshire; Fuller's "Worthies of England" says Lady Temple survived to see no less than 700 of her own descendants.

They were parents of 13 children, including:

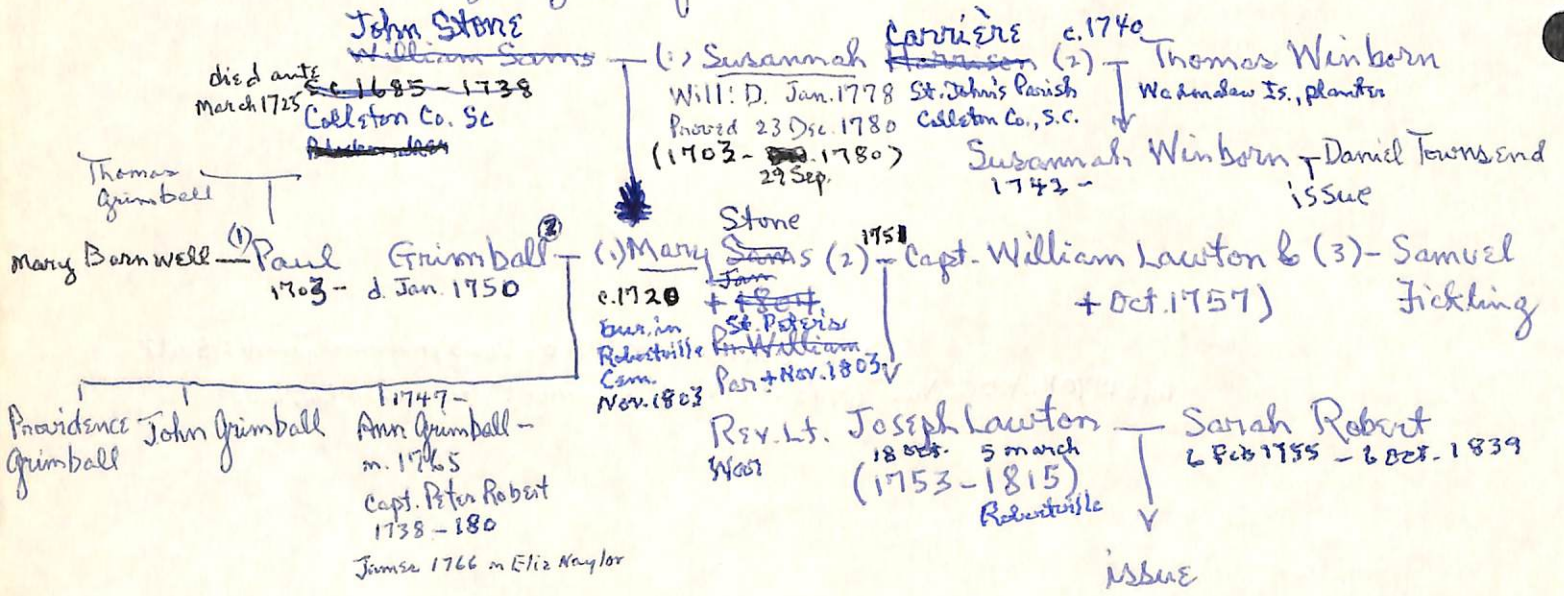
