JOSEPH ALEX. LAWTON of Allendale, South Carolina was born December 9, 1811 in the vicinity of Natchez, Mississippi. His father, Reverend J.J. Lawton in company with his brother B.T.D. Lawton and Thomas Polhill and their families, had imigrated ~~and~~ Oct. 1810 and lived two years. Because of Indian uprisings and hostilities, returned to Black Swamp, Beaufort District, South Carolina.

He was licensed to preach at Black Swamp Baptist Church the same time as his father, J.J. Lawton, Dr. Joseph T. Robert and Dr. Lawrence J. Robert (son of Thomas John & Phoebe (m. King) Robert) 26 Nov. 1807 - m. Adeline Lawton Sept 1830 father of Gen. Henry Mouton Robert

He attended Furman University but graduated from Madison University in New York. 24 Feb. 1807 - 12 Apr. 1880

He married Mrs. M.S. Barksdale in Beaufort District in April 1836. They were married 44 years; he m. (2) Mrs. Josephine Polhill Lawton (Widow of Dr. B. W. (1822-1879) m. 1845)

the churches he served were: Pipe Creek, Philadelphia in Barnwell County, Mt. Arnon, Hilton Head, Dawfuskie, Smyrna, Arnon, Concord and Allendale. all buried at
