You guessed it I do not have the birth or marriage dates of Sutonius Lawton. They could no doubt be found at Providence, R. I. or the Historical Soc. at Newport Rhode Island, either in the Quaker Records or the Vital Records of R. I. I put the dates of his ancestors and perhaps you can figure from those dates -

By the way it is my husband who descends from the Lawton family. His grandmother was Mary Lawton Davis, dau. of James, Jr. of Barlow, Ohio.
