aged 32



This is a reprint from the September 1988 News etter. It was sent by Ozelle Kilgore of Benjamin, Texas. Mrs. Kilgore's first husband was the Rollings. She is not doing any genealogy as she has arthritis and finds it difficult to write. She has some information to pass on to descendants of JAMES ROLLINGS, b. Nov. 16, 1770 in Virginia, died Nov. 4, 1856 in Smith County, Tennessee. I will quote from her letter: "JAMES RAWLINGS was born in Virginia and died and is buried at Denney's Branch on the Manning Place. He came to Smith County, Tennessee in 1825. The name of his wife is unknown, but the children were: MARGARET, JONATHAN K., ENOCH, CAROLINE and EVALINE. ENOCH was born in Virginia in 1805. His wife's name was Martha. She was from Alabama. Their children were: JOHN, WILLIAM, ENOCH Jr., AMMON, LEAPOLAUS, JOSEPHINE, AGNESS and TAYLOR. AMMON ROLLINS was born in 1838, died March 16, 1906. His grave is located in Smith County on a hill between New Middleton and Brush Creek on the edge of a field. He married a Miss Hearn, according to Erma Williams. After her death he married Agnes Minton. In another article HENRIETTA ROLLINS states JAMES married Mary (last name unknown. In 1948, a J.D.ROLLINS was Sheriff of Smith County.

Smith County Cemeteries on the South Cumberland River.

Enoch Cemetery - located on RAWLINGS CREEK, near the Church.

Gravestones: J.W.McClanahan (1824-1890) Willis McClanahan (1800-1844) JAMES ROLLINS (Nov.16,1770-Nov. 4, 1856)

ROLLINS Cemetery, located on Hiway 141 west of the bridge at Shavertown, Tennessee Gravestones: L.A.ROLLINS (Feb. 24, 1840-March 26, 1909) MIKE ROLLINS (June 18, 1909-September 25, 1910)

The address for Ozelle Kilgore is Box 65, Benjamin, TX. Since it has been a long time since we have corresponded, she perhaps is not living at this time.

CHARLES E. ROLLIN, living in Milton, Vermont, and married to Lucy Garlick. No marriage date, but CHARLES died Jan. 1848, aged 46. She didn't know who he belongs to. The following is a partial list of marriages on record in Portsmouth, Scioto County, Ohio.

(Extracted from the early Family histories from Gibson, Harrison, Knox, Montgomery, Perry, Pike, Posey, Sullivan, Washington, Vanderburgh and surrounding counties in Indiana, and including Illinois, Kentucky and Tennessee, plus the paths of migration to these general areas.) Jacob Turman was only 11 when his family left southwest Virginia via the Wilderness Road and Cumberland Gap to Kentucky...then on to Ohio in 1798. Jacob and his brother Isaac returned to Kentucky and married Jacob to SUSAN ROLLINS around 1812. (This SUSAN was the daughter of JOSHUA RAWLINGS and his first wife Verlinda Darnall) In Turman's column he mentioned that SUSAN was distantly related to the famed US Senator Henry Clay.

#### \*\*\*\*\*

Another RAWLINGS/ROLLINGS connection with the Turman family. One of the first settlers at Fout Boonesborough, KY, was named PEMBERTON RAWLINGS/ROLLINS. He and Col. Richard Calloway were killed by indians on March 9, 1780 while building a flatboat for a ferr . to cross the Kentucky River. PEMBERTON was listed as owner of land on nearby Paint Creek. A Bennett Pemberton md. a Mary Turman, daughter of Charles Turman of Spotsylvania Co., Virginia. They moved to Kentucky not long after PEMBERTON ROLLINS had helped to establish Boone's fort.

#### \*\*\*\*\*

Still another connection was a little more round-about. The Van Meter family came down the Ohio River to settle in Kentucky/Ohio area. A Margaret Van Meter married Edward Rawlings, son of STEPHEN RAWLINGS of Maryland who settled in Hardin Co., Kentucky.

MOSES ROLLINS: Enlisted Oct. 5, 1780, in Culpeper County, under the command of Capt.

Smith; attached to regt. commanded by Col.Buford, Virginia Line.

Served to near end of war. At Battle of Guildford Courthouse he received wound which later entailed amputation of both legs below the knees. He was 18. Married Nancy Cave of Ritchie Co, VA Dec. 5, 1814. She was 32 years younger than her husband. He received pension in 1819, died Feb. 4, 1856, aged 96. He was issued 2 bounty land warrants for his service, one for 60 acres, one for 100 acres. Nancy received widow's pension in 1857. Some records say he had 5 children, others say he had 11.



Seek documentation and more information for the following family: WILLIAM P. (or WILLIAM E.?) ROLLINS, b.probably before 1770, died October 1844 at Spartanburg, SC (but this county has no probate file for him). WILLIAM's wife was Nancy Clement or Clements. Children were SARAH who md. Mr. Sexton...ELIZABETH who md. Mr. Belcher; ABNER, JOHN CALVIN b.(1798, md. Sarah \_\_\_)...WILLIAM...DAVID who md. Serena Bishop...ROBERT...EDWARD...JEFFERSON who md Mahala Clements.

Does anyone have any information on these people? JOHN CALVIN ROLLINS is my direct ancestor. The first two children of his daughter NANCY were also surnamed ROLLINS and I hope to find that she married a ROLLINS cousin who died before 1850. Need help in verifying this family and tracing it back. Spartanburg SC is very near the borner of North Caolina so there may be a North Carolina connection.

He md Sarah Ann Cones, b. also in 1838, and died in 1905. Their Their children were ORAL OTTO, ROSE who md. a Mr. Alyea...NOBLE, JOHN and Van Ervin my great-grandfather. VAN ERVIN was born in 1869 in Shelby Co.. and died in 1935 in Kansas. He married Mary Frances Wickliff, b. 1870, Shelby Co., and died in 1940 in Kansas. Their children were CLAUD S., OPAL, MARGARET and my grandmother MARGARET. It is believed that our RAWLINGS family bible is in Missouri with my mother's cousin Margaret Moss of Bowling Green.

STEVEN RAWLINGS, first named above, was known to have been raised on a plantation in Kentucky.

From the 1870 edition of JOHN R. ROLLINS "Notes on the Families of ROLLINS/RAWLINS of New England", revised and updated in 1874. R/RFHA has copies of both books. The 1870 version is 83 pages long, the 1874 edition has over 300 pages. Here are a couple of examples, briefly, of what both contain:

# 1870 Edition, Pp 35 & 36

"JAMES RAWLINS, freeman, may 14, 1632, came with the Ipswitch settlers; was at Newbury, 1634. Removed to Dover (now New Hampshire) Bloody Point (now Newington). He was in Dover as early as 1642; received a grant of land there July 10, 1644, and another grant of 100 acres layed out November 26, 1656. He resided at Bloody Point till his death, receiving grants of land at various times. (This according to Dover records.)

His will was dated Dover, December 16, 1685, giving property to his wife Hannah, to his sons ICHOBOD (oldest) and BENJAMIN, and to "other children" not named. Will proved July 25, 1691.

Children (1) ICHABOD, a Corpenter, taxed at Bloody Point 1665

- (2) THOMAS, born 1641, taxed at Dover 1662. In 1668 removed to Exeter.
- (3) SAMUEL, born 1649, taxed at Bloody Point 1668
- (4) JAMES, born , taxed at Dover 1671
- (5) BENJAMIN born 1662
- (6) JOSEPH born \_\_\_\_, taxed at Bloody Point 1668 to 1671

From this original JAMES RAWLINS are descended almost all - certainly a very large majority of the ROLLINS families of New England, among them Hon. ICHABOD ROLLINS, for whom the town of ROLLINSFORD, New Hampshire, was named; Hon. EDWARD H. ROLLINS of Concord, New Hampshire; and Hon. EDWARD ASHTON ROLLINS, recently United States Commissioner of Internal Revenue."

NB| It should be pointed out at this juncture that another JAMES RAWLINS/ROLLINS moved to New Hampshire some 130 years later...JAMES, son of WILLIAM, was born Feb. 28, 1736, in Gloucester, Massachusetts. When he grew to manhood he moved to Dublin, NH between 1772-1776. He was a soldier of the Revolution, fought at Ticonderoga July 7, 1777. He was five times married but it was by his first wife he had his 10 children. She was Abigail Downe, who died May 7, 1790. His children with ABIGAIL were: MILLI, JAMES, JOHN, JOSEPH, ABIGAIL, HANNAH, SAMUEL, LYDIA, WILLIAM and FANNY. This all the 1870 edition of ROLLINS' book says about him.

Also from the 1874 edition is this interesting chapter on the musicians with RAWLIN(G)S for a surname;

THOMAS RAWLINGS, an English musician, was born about the year 1703. He performed at almost all Handel's oratorios, operas, etc., and was a scholar of the celebrated Dr. Pepusch.

ROBERT RAWLINGS, son of THOMAS, was born in 1742; at the age of 17 appointed musical page to the Duke of York, and organist of Chelsea College. He received his first musical tuition under his father, and subsequently studied under an Italian maestro named Barsanti who was at that time visiting England. ROBERT travelled on the continent nine years with his master until Barsanti died and then returned to England to resume his musical career, entering the King's band, which appointment was given him by His Majesty King George III. He died in 1814

THOMAS A. RAWLINGS Jr., son and brother of the above, was born 1745. He received his earliest instruction in music under his father also, beginning at the age of 7. When he was in his year his father assigned him for further instruction to the renowned theorist Dittenhofer. He studied for the next 7 years during which time he began composing. Later he discontinued writing and performed on the violin and violincello at the opera and all the first concerts including the City and Philharmonic orchestras. He also gave instruction on the piano and violin. His compositions for piano, published by Chappell were very well received although he also composed for flute and other instruments.

In addition there was a CHARLES RAWLINGS, son of WALTER RAWLINS of London, England, also a musician. CHARLES was born in 1749, emigrated to America. Excellent education, was an instructor of music, navigation and surveying. Died in Sussex County, Delaware in 1812, aged 63. Several of the R/RFHA subscribers are descended from him CHARLES had 6 children, JOHN, WINDSOR, LOT, NANCY, PHILIP and JAMES.

Notes from the Rev. Roger B. Rollins, St. Michael's Episcopal Church, Cedar Rapids, Iowa... given him by his cousin Velma (Tucker) Dawson Johnson. These notes are in her words slightly edited for brevity.

"My mother's family name was ROLLINS. It is believed they were of Dutch (?) descent. The earliest ancestor of my mother's that I can find a record of is a JOHN ROLLINS b. 1823, died 1890; wife named Christine with no record of her birth or death. This couple are my great-grandparents on the ROLLINS side. They were born in either Michigan or settled there in the early 1800's, in the Georgetown area, Blendon Township, Ottawa County. They are buried in the Blendon Township Cemetery, Lot 211.

JOHN and Christine had 4 children: ALICE, B. 1851, d. 1871, md. a Mr. Raynor

JULIE E., b. 1861, d. 1883 THOMAS M. b. 1859, d. 1878

CHARLES E., b. 1854, d. 1895, md. Catherine Jane Thomas

CHARLES and Catherine lived on a small farm, wooded, which CHARLES had to clear, and had 8 children before Catherine was 30 years of age. She died then of a stroke.

Children: MINNIE M., b. 1876, d. 1963, md Paul Wagner, had 6 children

JENNIE, b. 1878, d. 1897.

MARY, b. 1879, d. 1966, md. George Tucker. (these are my parents)

CHARLES E. Jr., b. 1880, d. 1966, became a pharmacist.

FRANK A., b. 1881, d. 1919. He went into partnership with his brother CHARLES in a drugstore but he died young of tuberculosis.

ANNA b. 1883, d. 1969, md. a McKenny, had 6 children ELLIS W., b. 1884, d. 1955, became a farmer, married and had 6 children HERBIE, b. 1889, d. 1897 of whooping cough and pneumonia

Their father died young as well, leaving the children to be raised by others. He died of hard work and the complications of tuberculosis. Four children died, four remained and managed to finish high school, a tribute to their strength of character and determination. I never knew any of them except MINNIE, CHARLES Jr., ANNA and ELLIS. With these few facts I have managed to gather I am wondering how I ever thought I had a hard life. During later years the cousins have kept in touch and had many happy times together."

Rev. Rollins adds: "Last summer I visited the cemetery where CHARLES E. and CATHERINE JANE are buried in Blendon, Michigan. Also saw the farm house my dad ELLIS shared with all those listed above, and the school house they attended."




