 [piece] might be brought about... for Mr. Livingston receives the prejudiced
 people there in his congregation... and preaches when he pleases to them, lions
 thirty miles from his charge and preaches once in two weeks or once in three as
 he pleases, he married first a woman of £ lived with one Mrs. Ash (when the
said Mrs. Ash wife was alive) and had several children to them and upon
her decease married the rebel of the former Mr. Ash's son and for her
 way I love to stop no further into them....
