Thank you for your letter and comments on my Lineage Charts. Regarding George Savage Smith, I used Professor G.P. Cuttino's designation given in History Of Cuttino Family, Savage Smith. I have found (George ) Savage Smith in the Biographical Directory Of The Senate Of The State Of South Carolina 1776-1964 and it appears that (George) Savage Smith should be proper for genealogy. My Great-Grandfather Thomas Peter Smith in his genealogy states "Savage Smith--(our father)--third son of George and Elizabeth Waring Snith". It appears family usage dropped the George. Thomas Peter Smith also states "(Dr.) George Smith was born in 1672 and died 1751, age 79" I find confusion 1672 vs 1674 and 1751 vs 1753. What source has the proper dates? I have received approval from the National Society of Magna Charta Dames and Barons. I have nothing yet from the Society of First Families of South Carolina. I shall inform you when I do receive notice.

The Huguenot Society of South Carolina request that you sign my Application which I have enclosed with envelope addressed and stamped for your forwarding. Thanks for signing.

S.A.R. I have not researched Revolution nor Confederate soldiers in the family. I desire to later. A General Benjamin Smith was an aide to General Washington and Governor of North Carolina. He and his brother James of Landgrave family settled on Landgrave land in North Carolina near Wilmington. Southport, N.C. was originally Smithville as named by Benjamin. James returned to Beaufort, S.C. and fathered the Rhetts, Hon. Barnwell Smith Rhett.

Where may I purchase the latest edition of Annie Miller's Our Family Circle? I only have 1st Landgrave pages provided by a nephew and I would like to study the complete book.


I shall inform you as soon as I receive membership in the Societies.
