David Smith and Sarah Rebecca Lindsey were married in Abbeville Dist., S.C. and later moved to Walton Co. Ga. He is buried at the Smith Family Cemetery at Bethlehem, Ga. — a small town south of Weir, Ga.

My mother, Amy Moore married Jhon Henry Charles, Jr. — my father — in 1916 in Weir, Ga.

You mentioned in your letter that "although it can't be proved, the Jhon Smith (1611-1670) who was father of Langsane Thomas, was in fact the Jhon who was son of Sir Nicholas Smith of Breakspere." Among my papers I found these items:
