On 30 Jan. 1676 a warrant was issued to lay out to "Capt. Hen:
Bryan 1100 A., and on 29 April, 1678 a warrant was issued to lay out
to Jonathan Fitz eleven hundred & ten A.

Bryan apparently abandoned the land laid out for him, fo by an
order of the Council dated 30 Nov. 1678 the surveyor General is di-
rected to lay out for Jonathan Fitz "all that tract of land upon
Ashley River formerly called Mr. Bryan's land and now in possession
of the s^d Mr. Fitz, and on 22 March 1678/79 a formal grant was made
to Jonathan Fitch of 1100 acres on Ashley River. This first Jonathan
Fitch seems to have left a son also named Jonathan and for some
reason a new grant was on 13 May 1696 issued to Jonathan Fitts for
1100 A. on Ashley River. Jonathan Fitch conveyed to his nephew,
James Stanyarne, son of his sister Rachel who had married the elder
James Stanyarne.
