

"In 1675 THOMAS STANYARNE, the Elder, wife and five children and four white servants, arrived from the Barbadoes. For two centuries Stan-yarnes were conspicuous in the history of South Carolina, but today their descendents are all on female lines." - from an Address before the National Society of Colonial Dames in 1945 (put into booklet form) by A. S. Salley, Past President of the S. C. Historical Society.

- I. THOMAS STANYARNE, the Elder, came in May 1675 from Barbadoes to John's (Mary ~~Waight~~) Island, S. C. and settled on Wando River. He spelled his name with an "e" before the "a" but it appears to have been dropped by his children. Thomas made a Will dated 5 May 1682, entered 17 Feb. 1682/3, Records of the Province, "Court of Ordinary" Book 1672-1692. Among his bequests was one to "The Society called Quakers" and it is probably that he was himself a Quaker.

In "Warrants for Lands - 1672-1679" by Salley, p. 122 appears:

"Stanyan, Thos. dated 13 Jan. 1676 for 950 acres, place not yet laid out, 5 children and 4 servants. Arrived May 1675 (place from which they came not given). This warrant received in 1676."

In 1677 (Book 1672-79), p. 127: 2 warrants to "Thomas Stanjon - one of the freemen of this Province" - 450 acres March 1677 and 500 acres March 1677.

Also: "Lords Proprietors, etc. grant Thos. Stanyarne a plantation containing 900 acres of land English measure on Western Branch of Wandoe River and boundary as per platte - 14 July 1677 (950 A. Christ Church Parish) Entered 7 May 1678."

Thomas Stanyarne, the Elder, lived at first on a plantation on Wando River, ^{Rainey on} John's Island (which was in St. Paul's Parish at that time) but he also owned a plantation in "Charles Town Neck" which he left to his wife, Mary, during her life and then to eldest son, James. Mary, his wife, came with him to S. C. and was living at the time of his death 1682/3; she ~~is generally thought to have been a sister to Jacob, Abraham and Isaac Waight, dau. of Phoebe Baynes & Abraham Waight of Barbados.~~

In his Will dated 10 May 1682 Thomas states: "My eldest son, James (who is named Administrator along with wife, Mary)...and should any of my sons doe happen to die or become defunct before they arrive to the age of maturity years or be married and have children, then this estate of the deceased to be equally divided amongst the rest of my sons yet living". He does not indicate that any of his children are married, or of age, except his one daughter, Mary, designated as "my daughter Mary Ladson". It appears that his son, James, was 24/5 in 1683 as he was a witness in 1675 to a deed in which his father was the Grantee and it is stated he was a boy of 17. (See State Archives Registers Records Book 1675, p. 96, Columbia, SC) Thomas names his other sons as John, Thomas and William, mentioning them twice in this order in his Will.

1. JAMES STANYARNE, Senior, "eldest son", inherited the house and (1st: Rachel Fitch) plantation in Charles Town Neck after (2nd: Hannah Bennett, widow) his mother's death. It is said that his descendents settled elsewhere than on John's Is. although he did own property thereon. Being 17 in 1675, he was born in 1658; he was one of the Executors of his father's Will and the principal inheritor. He was a member of the Governor's Council in 1693 and the Assembly in 1692. There are numerous land warrants for James Stanyarne, Senior; he died "before 1702" when his daughter, Elizabeth was married. (See SC Hist. Mag. Vol. I, p. 6, which also indicates James was living on John's Island as late as 1694.

James Stanyarne, Senior, married (first) RACHEL FITCH (M.C.O., Charleston Book D-3, p. 129), dau. of Jonathan Fitch, Senior (who arrived S. C. in 1678, died 1691, a Quaker who was mentioned in the Will of Thomas Stanyarne, the Elder.) It has been stated that State Archives records show that James Stanyarne married (second) Hannah, the widow Bennett, and that she was the mother of his son, Thomas, and his dau., Mary Stanyarne. Vol. 12, p. 210, Charleston Wills Vol. 52 (1687-1710) p. 86: "Bond of HANNAH Stanyarne, John Stanyarne, William Smith and William Edwards, all Executors of the Will of James Stanyarne, deceased, Dec. 1703; records of Court of Ordinary, p. 81" show that James Stanyarne died before 1702. Other references to James Stanyarne appear in S.C.Hist. Mag. Vol. 20, p. 6; Vol. 6, p. 89, etc.

Rachel Fitch Stanyarne had a sister named Sarah (Mrs. John Norton); Rachel named one of her daughters "Sarah". Also see; Ancestral Records & Portraits, Vol. II, pp. 638-9; Vol. I, p. 377; McCrady's History of S. C., pp. 377-387.

Issue: (Children of James & Rachel Fitch Stanyarne):

a. ELIZABETH STANYARNE, married 11 May 1702 JOHN WOODWARD (19 Feb. 1681 - 7 Jan. 1727), son of "young Dr. Henry Woodward", 1st settler of South Carolina, and his wife, Mary Godfrey, dau. of John Godfrey, immigrant. Dr. Henry Woodward had previously been married to "Margaret" (see Vol. 8, p. 173, Warrant Book 1672-1692) but no record has been found of any issue of Margaret. A letter from Dr. Woodward to his "father-in-law", Col. John Godfrey, dated 1686 is extant. Elizabeth Stanyarne Woodward was born c. 1684; she is the ancestress of the South Carolina families of Barnwell, Wigg, Hutson, Heyward and others.

b. SARAH STANYARNE, married RICHARD WOODWARD (9 June 1683 - 1725), (Richard Woodward) brother of John Woodward. John Woodward's Will, dated 10 Apr. 1725, mentions his "brother-in-law Thomas Stanyarne" and also "James Stanyarne, Junior" for whom he is Guardian. Sarah Stanyarne Woodward's Will is also extant; she mentions her "nephew, Benjamin" (son of her brother, James Stanyarne, Junior). Sarah Stanyarne is the ancestress of the South Carolina families of Claridon, Hutson, Heyward and others.

c. JAMES STANYARNE, Junior, married Jean Godfrey, dau. of John (Jane (Jeane) Godfrey) Godfrey, Senior, immigrant to S. C. James was a minor and his father was deceased in May 1702 when his sister, Elizabeth, married. Charleston Will Book Vol. 52 (1687-1710), p. 122: Letters of Guardianship of James Stanyarne, natural and lawful son of James Stanyarne, deceased. (12 Feb. 1706/7) James Stanyarne, Junior left a Will (Charleston Wills & Misc. Records, 1722-1724, p. 272 - 1716) in which he mentions his wife, Jean; his son, Benjamin; his brother, Thomas; his nephew, John Woodward, son of John and Elizabeth, and "children of my three sisters", Elizabeth, Sarah and Mary. His executor: John Godfrey.

Issue: (ONLY child of James Stanyarne, Junior & Jean Godfrey):

(1) BENJAMIN STANYARNE, who died without issue, the last of the male line of James Stanyarne, Senior. He received inheritances from several families, including "Vaucluse", seat of the Fitch family which he conveyed out of the family in 1747. His Will was dated 4 Apr. 1740, proved 4 May 1751. (Will Book 7, p. 10) James Stanyarne, Junior's wife, Jean Godfrey, married (second) Gerard Monger - no male issue; Vol. 13, p. 222 SC Hist. Mag.: "Jane Monger, widow, buried 2 Dec. 1739".

Issue: (Children of James Stanyarne, Senior & his 2nd wife, Hannah):
d. Mary Stanyarne, possibly the Mary Stanyarne who married Richard Timmons on 6 Oct. 1723 (SCHM 13-23)

* e. Thomas Stanyarne, married 29 Mar. 1726 Ann Barnwell (born 7 (Ann Barnwell) Aug. 1707), dau. of Col. John ("Tuscarora Jack") Barnwell; Thomas was buried 6 April

1731 (Vol. 23, p. 180 SCHM) and his widow, Ann, married 16 Dec. 1733 Ambrose Reeve, bachelor, after whose death she married Thomas Wigg, following whose death she married John Gibbes. Thomas Stanyarne's Will dated 23 Feb. 1731 (Vol. 62-B, p. 828, 1729-31) mentions his wife, Ann; his wife's sister, Elizabeth Barnwell and Thomas Woodward, probably a nephew who was named for him. Thomas had no issue.

2. THOMAS STANYARNE, Junior, arrived SC with parents 1675; probably born c. 1661 for he received grants after 1682/3 when his father died. (See Warrants

by Salley, p. 147): Thomas Stanyarne received grant for 200 A in Colleton Co. 10 Aug. 1697; 500 A 24 Jan. 1700, 500 A Dec. 1704. Vol. E-3, Mesne & Conveyances, p. 465: Wadmalaw Is., 13 May 1783, William Stanyarne to William Sams, original grant 15 Sept. 1705 to Thomas Stanyarne (deceased), father of Thomas Stanyarne (deceased) and grandfather of William Stanyarne. ("Original grant in 1705" was to Thomas, Junior) Also, in SC Memorials Vol. 5, p. 57, 10 Apr. 1730 Thomas Stanyarne and wife, Dorothy make a deed to Robert Sams; this is probably Thomas III. In SC Memorials Vol. 5, p. 475 Thomas Stanyarne was appointed Commissioner for Wadmalaw.

ISSUE: (Children of Thomas Stanyarne, Junior and):

a. Thomas Stanyarne, III, died before May 1783, date of above (Dorothy Ogle) deed; married Dorothy Ogle, dau. of Ogle & his wife, Dorothy.

Issue: (Child of Thomas Stanyarne, III and Dorothy Ogle):

(1) William Stanyarne, living 13 May 1783 when he made deed to William Sams to an "original grant" in 1705 to his grandfather, Thomas.

b. Jehu Stanyarne See Vol. 1724-25 Warrants of Participation of (Ann Steads) Estate: Jehu prays Arthur Middleton, President, to appraise Ann Stead's estate, "he

having lately intermarried with her". Charleston Wills & Inventories. Jehu is of Colleton Co. Vol. 1726-27, p. 102: Jehu Stanyarne Bill of Sale for "a Mustee boy...and an Indian man, Hercules, to Mr. Hugh Hext for ..." Also, Vol. 1726-27-B, p. 479 Jehu Stanyarne mortgages slaves to William Stanyarne in 1727. Also, p. 561 mortgage of slaves from Jehu to Henry Nicholls. His Will is in Book 5, p. 627, dated 24 Nov. 1746, proved 6 Feb. 1746/7; he mentions:

Issue:(1) John Stanyarne, a minor in 1746; his Will: Book 19, p. 124 (Mary) dated 10 Sept. 1779, proved 9 Feb. 1781, mentions wife, Mary; nieces Ann Guy, Ann

Freer, Mary Freer.

* Thomas Stanyarne, adult, baptized by Rev. Alex. Gordon in St. Philip's Ch., Charleston, Feb. 1726 (Parish Register, ed. by Salley, p. 111)

- (2) Susannah Stanyarne (One of these sisters apparently married
- (3) Anne Stanyarne (a Freer and the other a Guy.)
- (4) Mary Stanyarne, was not mentioned in her father's Will. Vol.

13, p. 217, SCHM, records 8 Oct. 1738 Mary, dau. of Jehu and Ann Stanyarne, was baptized. Apparently she died prior to her father's Will in 1746.

3. WILLIAM STANYARNE, Senior, first of his name in SC, arrived with parents 1675 as youngest son. "Public Laws of S.C." by Hon. John F. Grimke, 1790, p. 14-15; 7 June 1712, No. 322-"Bridge over causeway of William Stanyarne..." His estate was appraised, recorded and dated 31 Jan. 1716/17 (with John Chaplin as one of the appraisers). "Probate Court, 1711-1718 shows Isaac Waight appointed Guardian of William Stanyarne, infant & orphan of William Stanyarne, deceased - 24 Mar. 1718/19. Issue: William Stanyarne, II, called "infant & orphan" son of William (Catherine) Stanyarne, Senior, deceased, in Probate Court 1711-1718 and Isaac Waight was appointed Guardian 24 March 1718/19. Nine years later in 1726/27: INVENTORY, p. 181, Vol. 1726/27: "slaves, cattle, etc...William Stanyarne". Probably William had reached maturity and his estate was being turned over to him. A William Stanyarne married Catherine.

Waight, dau. of Abraham & Phoebe Baynes Waight

4. MARY STANYARNE, only dau. of Thomas & Mary () Stanyarne, was (John Ladson) born 1667, arrived SC with parents 1675, died 8 Dec. 1707. She was married when her father made his Will in 1682 when he called her "my daughter Mary Ladson". JOHN LADSON came from Barbadoes "in the Barq Plantacon for Carolina, Aser Sharpe, Commander, 13 Aug. 1679" (Register's Records, Col. Bk. 1675-96, Columbia, SC); he was a member of the Assembly from Berkeley in 1683, a member of Council 1691-1698; he was a Quaker and died on John's Island 1698, intestate.

ISSUE: (Children of John & Mary Stanyarne Ladson):

- a. John Ladson, born SC c. 1684, married c. 1704 Margaret, widow of Thomas Cuby (Probate Court Charleston Book 1707-10, p. 122) Register's Records, Columbia, Bk. 1704-1708, p. 202 shows John Ladson of Berkeley Co., planter, & Margaret his wife..."Whereas Lords Prop^{rs} did grant unto John Ladson (late father of me the sd John Ladson) a certain plantation... and ye sd John Ladson...dyed...intestate in the sd province and right & title to the sd land thereby became vested in me ye sd John Ladson as eldest son and heir at law of the sd John Ladson..."
- b. William Ladson, born SC 1687, died 1739, married ^{buried 22 Dec. St. Andrews 1711} Martha Elmes (born 1698, died 1750, dau. of Thomas Elmes & Elizabeth Cantey (SCHM, Vol. 11) Issue: 3 sons: William, Thomas and John, and 5 daughters: ^{Mar. 1718} Eliz., Mary, Sarah, Martha + Martha.
- c. Thomas Ladson, born SC 1690, died 1731, married (1) Sarah ¹⁷²⁴ Raven, (2) Mary Graves, ^{dau. of Thomas Graves.}
- d. PHOEBE LADSON, born SC 1691, died 1764, married (1) Caleb ^{born 27 June 1691} Toomer, (2) ¹⁷¹⁰ JOHN CHAPLIN (born 1682, died 5 Jan. 1752) Issue: (SCHM Vol. 23) MARY ANN CHAPLIN (22 Jul. 1716-10 Jan. 1764, bapt. St. Helena's Ch. by Rev. Jones 24 Dec. 1732, married by same 16 May 1732 JONATHAN NORTON, bachelor; Phoebe (25 Jan. 1717, bapt. 31 May 1735, married 31 May 1735 Joseph Jenkins, bachelor; Martha (3 Apr. 1720, bapt. 31 Oct. 1737, married 31 Oct. 1737 John Barnwell, bachelor, son of Col. John & Anne Berners Barnwell); Elizabeth (bapt. St.

Helena's 6 July 1741, mar. 30 Apr. 1741 John Evans (who was buried 5 Jan. 1768), son of Randolph & Sarah Evans; William, bapt. 6 July 1741, mar. 30 Apr. 1741 Sarah Reynolds, widow; Sarah, mar. 1 Oct. 1751 by Rev. Peasley to William Field; Benjamin, mar. 1 Oct. 1751 Sarah Ladson, dau. of Samuel Ladson & Elizabeth Toomer; John, bapt. St. Helena's 24 Feb. 1756 by John Belcher, mar. 2 Nov. 1758 Elizabeth Perry Ladson, widow of Benjamin Ladson.

- e. Samuel Ladson, (1693-19 Feb. 1739), bapt. St. Andrew's 31 Dec. 1735 as an adult; married Elizabeth Toomer, bapt. St. Andrew's 26 June 1736, buried 26 Apr. 1752, dau. of ~~John~~ (John ~~Toomer~~ Toomer. Issue: Mary Ann, died young; Samuel, mar. July 1746 Sarah Norton (buried 4 Apr. 1755, Child bed, SCHM Vol. 23 St. Helena's - they were mar. St. Andrew's 7 July 1746, SCHM Vol. 14, p.35) & after her death Samuel mar. 2 Dec. 1756 Sarah Fending (Fendin) by whom he had 3 children; Benjamin, mar. by Rev. Wm. Orr 19 Mar. 1749 in St. Helena's to Elizabeth Perry who after his death was mar. by Rev. A. Baron 2 Nov. 1758 in St. Helena's to John Chaplin; Susannah, died young; Henry Ladson; Sarah, mar. by Rev. Peasley 1 Oct. 1751 to Benjamin Chaplin (her 1st cousin); Elizabeth, bapt. 10 June 1736 St. Andrew's, mar. 24 Apr. 1753 by Rev. Peasley in St. Helena's to Peter Perry, son of Peter Perry & Elizabeth Holman, and left many descendents; Mary, died young; and Martha Phoebe, died 1741.

5. JOHN STANYARNE, Senior, born 1662, died 1714, probably 2nd son of (1st: Mary Moore) Thomas & Mary Stanyarne; member of Commons (2nd: Elizabeth Rivers) House of Assembly in 1702; married (1) c. 1683 Mary Moore, no record of issue, (2)

c. 1694 Elizabeth, dau. of William Rivers who received 200 A from the Lords Proprietors 21 Sept. 1683 "for arrival of himself, wife Elizabeth, daughter Elizabeth, and Martha Seller, who arrived 10 December 1681" (Warrants for Lands in SC by A.S.Salley, Jr.)

Deed Book K, pp.400-403 Mesne & Conveyance Office, Charleston: "John Stanyarn & wife, Magdalon, to Joseph Stanyarn. Indenture made the 6th day of July 1732" mentions William Rivers' Will of 3 Oct. 1717 (which cannot now be located) which mentioned William Rivers' grandsons: William Stanyarn, Rivers Stanyarn and Joseph Stanyarn; deed also says that John and Joseph are brothers. John Stanyarne settled on John's Island and his descendents lived there for years. St. Paul's Parish was created under the Church Act of 1706 and the Parish of St. John's Colleton was created in 1734 out of St. Paul's; hence, some who were referred to as "in St. Paul's" before 1734 were referred to as "in St. John's" after 1734.

ISSUE: (Children of John & Elizabeth Rivers Stanyarne):

1. Elizabeth Stanyarne, born 1704, died 1738, after which her (Archibald Parish) husband remarried. Issue: James, born 1724; John Parish; Elizabeth Parish.
2. William Stanyarne, died under age.
3. Rivers Stanyarne, Will recorded Book 7, p. 361, dated 25 Jan. (Sarah Glaze) 1754, proved 22 Nov. 1754; married Sarah Glaze whose Will is recorded Book 8, p. 400 dated 5 Jan. 1759, proved 4 May 1759. She mentions sons William, Joseph, James; dau. Sarah, dau.-in-law Anna Stanyarne; brothers William and Malachi Glaze; sister Esther Wilson. His Will mentions dau. Mary Braelsford; brother-in-law Hugh Wilson; brothers John and Joseph; children: Ann, Sarah, William, Joseph, Rivers, and James.

4. Joseph Stanyarne,* first by name of Joseph, m. Elizabeth, dau. (Elizabeth Stobo) of Rev. Archibald Stobo, Presbyternian minister; Joseph was b. 1700, d. 1772; his Will, dated 26 Sep. 1770, proved 5 June 1772 (Bk. 14, p. 263); built & owned the old "Brick" residence on the lower part of John's Is. (no longer extant) near cemetery where he is buried (Legarville, on Stono River), called "Stanyarne Hall (later owned by Hamilton family). Elizabeth's father built Pon-Pon Church, Walterboro & established Circular Church on Edisto Is.; she was b. 1708, d. 1784; her Will dated 7 June 1784 (Bk. 21, p. 479) proved 24 Sept. 1784; she was buried beside her husband, Joseph, who d. 7 Ap. 1772 at his John's Is. Plantation (SCHM Vol. 34, p. 152). Issue:

- a. Joseph Stanyarne, Jr, buried Legarville Cemetery 18 Feb. 1766, his estate administered 1767; apparently died single.
 b. Archibald Stanyarne, b. 1728, d. 1773; Will dated 22 Apr. 1772, proved 8 July 1773 (Will Bk. 15, p. 528); ^{Mar. 1759} mar. Sarah** (1742-1767), dau. of Thomas Elliott of Stono (SCHM Vol. 10, p. 38) No issue.
 c. Jane Stanyarne, m. Charles Elliott (b. 17 Aug. 1737, of Sandy Hill, St. Paul's Parish), was deceased in 1772; issue:
 (1) Charles Elliott, died young.
 (2) Jane Reilly Elliott, m. Col. William Washington, cousin of President George Washington.
 d. Elizabeth Stanyarne (1737-1758), m. Isaac Holmes, Jr. Issue:
 (1) Isaac Holmes, III, an infant in 1772, living 1781, m. Rebecca Bee
 (2) Elizabeth Stanyarne Holmes, m. after 1772 John Raven Mathews and left a dau., Elizabeth Stanyarne Mathews.
 e. Ann Stanyarne (1734 - 1784), d. unmarried.
 f. William Stanyarne (1734-1784 SCHM Vol. 18, p. 188); Will dated 5 May 1783, proved 21 Oct. 1784 Book 21, p. 499; married Annah, widow of his 1st cousin, Rivers Stanyarne; issue:
 (1) Charles Stanyarne, named in his sister's Will 1790.
 (2) Fanny (Frances) Stanyarne, Will proved 22 Dec. 1790, Will Bk. 23, p. 747.
 (3) Elizabeth Stanyarne, living in 1784, not mentioned in her sister's 1790 Will.
 (4) Mary Stanyarne, mentioned in sister's 1790 Will as married to Charles Freer; issue: Charles, Jr., Joseph & John Freer.
 (5) Rivers Stanyarne, mentioned in father's Will 5 May 1783, apparently died Dec. 1783 before his father's Will was probated.

- (6) Ann Stanyarne, mentioned in her sister's Will in 1790.
 g. John Stanyarne (11 July 1730 - 12 Sept. 1749), unmarried.
 h. James Stanyarne, Will dated 2 Mar. 1780, proved 14 Sept. 1781, Bk. 19, p. 253 Chas.; married on 30 Oct. 1767

+9 June 1771 (1) Henrietta, dau. of Thomas Smith & widow of William Raven (m. 7 June 1761) she was deceased by 1772, leaving their son:

His 2nd wife, Mary, was dau. of John Whitmarsh, Senior (Will dated 1 June 1718, proved 25 Jan. 1720 SCHM Vol. 2, p. 62; she had been married to Robert Seabrook who died 22 Sep. 1720 leaving no issue. SCHM Vol. 13, p. 40: "Mary, wife of John Stanyarne of St. Paul's, buried 12 July 1730." SCHM Vol. 13, pp. 218 & 220: "Madalyn, wife of John Stanyarne died John's Island 21 April 1739". Deed Bk. K, pp. 400-403, John Stanyarne and wife, Magdolon to Joseph Stanyarne, 7 July 1732. Then, "Sarah Harvey (widow) and John Stanyarne of John's Island, married 18 Aug. 1740". Issue:

 - a. John Stanyarne, III, Will dated 1762 mentioned no wife, leaves property to four living sisters: Ann, wife of Robert Gibbs; Jane, wife of Ebenezer Simmons; Mary, wife of Robert Sams, Sr. and Edith, widow of William Matthews. He also mentions three living nieces whose mothers were deceased by 1762: Elizabeth, dau. of William & Sarah Stanyarne Raven, who later mar. Adolphus Vanderhorst and is called "Elizabeth Vanderhoist" in her grandfather's Will in 1772; Elizabeth Hext Sams, dau. of Francis & Elizabeth Stanyarne Hext, Jr., who mar. William Sams, Sr.; and Elizabeth, dau. of Isaac & Elizabeth Stanyarne (widow Hext) Nichols, her grandfather's Will specifically states that his "granddaughter, Elizabeth Nichols" is not to inherit under his Will - no reason given.
 - b. Edith Stanyarne married William Mathewes, son of Gov. John Matthews of South Carolina; she was buried in Simmons Bluff Cemetery, John's Island; issue: William Mathewes, Jr.; Thomas Mathewes; Elizabeth Mathewes; Susannah Mathewes who mar. Daniel, son of John & Hannah Hall; Mary; Ann.
 - c. Jane Stanyarne, mar. Ebenezer Simmons was willed "home where I now live" by her father; issue: Ebenezer, Jr., Thomas, William, Ann, Mary & Henrietta Simmons.
 - d. Sarah Stanyarne, mar. William Raven & died before 1762. Issue: Elizabeth Raven who mar. Adolphus Vanderhorst & was willed part of Kiawah Island in her grandfather's Will where the old house of Vanderhorst estate still stands.
 - e. Ann Stanyarne, mar. Robert Gibbes (born 1732) in 1753; he mar. as his 2nd wife, Sarah Reeve in 1764, dau. of Ann Barnwell & Ambrose Reeve; he was son of John & Mary Woodward Gibbes. Issue: Mary Gibbes, m. Thomas Middleton; she was born 1758.
 - f.* Mary Stanyarne, m. (1) Arthur Mowbray, Surgeon of Colleton County (his Will dated 20 Sept. 1745), (2) Robert Sams, Sr. after 1746; (3) a McGillvary; issue: (1) Thomas Mowbray, mentioned in his father's Will; (2) Charles Sams, who took an active part in the

Revolutionary War and died unmarried shortly thereafter; his Will is of record; Sarah Sams who married in 1770 Benjamin Mathewes & left an only daughter; (3) Alexander McGillvary, mentioned in grandfather's Will in 1772.

- g. Elizabeth Stanyarne, born before 12 July 1730, dau. of Mary Whitmarsh & John Stanyarne, Jr.; married Francis Hext, Jr. (son of Francis & grandson of Hugh Hext, the immigrant) who died 1746, the same year his dau. Elizabeth Hext, was born, to whom he left half of his estate, the other half to his wife, his "father-in-law" John Stanyarne as Executor. Issue: Elizabeth Hext; born 2 Jan. 1746, married 5 Feb. 1761 William Sams, Senior; they moved to Datha Is., Granville County (now Beaufort County) S. C. after the Revolution; it is said she died in Beaufort 8 Nov. 1813 where she had moved in order to educate her children better after her husband's death; she is buried on Datha Is. in Sams Cemetery.

The male line of John Stanyarne, Jr. apparently became extinct with his death in 1772.
