IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN

I Thomas Stanyarne of Colleton County Knowing the uncertainty of humane Life Do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth

Firstly I Doe Give unto Thomas Woodward One Negroe boy by Name June to him and his heirs forever.

Secondly I Doe Give unto my Sister in Law Eliz<sup>a</sup> Barnwell One Negroe Girl by name Marere to her and her heirs forever.

Lastly I Doe Give and Bequeath unto my Loveing Wife Anne Stanyarne One Island Known by the name of Bennets Point and one Lott in Charles Town and And one other Lott in Beaufort with all my Goods Slaves and Chattells that do or may be any part of my Interest to her and her heirs for ever and I do likewise appoint her to See this my Last Will fulfilled hereby revoking all former Wills by me made and Declare this to be my Last Will & Testament In Wittness whereof I have hereunto Sett my hand and Seal this Twenty Third Day of February 1730/31

Know yee That on the Thirteenth Day of May In the Year of our  
Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Thirty One the Last Will  
and Testament of Thomas Stanyarne late of this Province plan-  
ter Deced was proved approved and allowed of the said Deced  
having whilst he lived and at the time of his Death Diverse  
Goods Rights & Creditts within the Province aforesaid by  
means whereof the Approbation and allowance of his Testament  
& the power of Granting the Admion of all and Singular the  
Good Rights and Creditts of the said Deced to me is manifest-  
ly known to belong and the Admion of all and Singular the  
Goods Rights and Creditts of the Said Deced and his Testament  
of any manner of way Concerning was Granted & Committed unto  
Anne Stanyarne his Widdow Named Extrix in the said Last Will  
& Testament being Sworne on the holy Evangelists of Almighty  
God weel & faithfully to Administer and make a full and per-  
fect Inventory of all & Singular the Goods Rights & Creditts  
of the said Deced & Exhibite the Same into the Secretarys  
Office in Charles Town in Order to be recorded on or befor  
the Thirteenth day of August now next Ensueing and to render  
a Just Account Calculation and Reckoning thereof when there  
unto required.

The Condition of the above obligation is Such that whereas the above bounden John Woodward is -- -- -- Appointed guardian and protien Amie of the person and portion of James Stanyarn Naturall and Law-Son full daughter of James Stanyarn late of this province deceased she the Said James Stanyarn being in his Minority If therefore the Said John Woodward -- Shall well & truely bring up the Said Infant with Convenient meat drink and Apparell & Education dureing his Minority and dureing the time he shall be Guardian & Prochien Amie unto him shall defend him from hurt of body loss of goods or Lands in any wise so far forth as in his power lieth and Such portion as shall fall due by y<sup>e</sup> death & Inventory of the Said James Stanyarn shall truely pay unto the Said Infant within three moneths next after she shall Accomplish the age of one and twenty years or be Married And if she the Said James Stanyarn dye before that time then to his Executor Administrat<sup>r</sup> & to Such person or persons as the Law shall limitt and Appoint and further Shall make a perfect acc. upon his tuition to his granted as afores. when he shall be thereunto Required, And also Shall not only at a times hereafter Clearly Acquitt & Save harmless but also enter into and give Such farther & reasonable Security as by y<sup>e</sup> Govern<sup>r</sup>. for the time being shall be required Then this obligation to be void and of none effect or else to be and remain in full force power & vertue
