THUMBNAIL SKETCH In case you did not get the first three pages of the story that grew out of the life of this ancestor of ours, Dear Cousin, I will outline the events of his life that I know, and let you fill in with family history, legends, and old stories the heroic and often tragic, and always dedicated man of God, James Stoney, farmer, doctor and Priest.

He was born to Dr. George Mosse Stoney and Catherine Jenkins (She died ten days after bringing him into the world) on the 19th day of November, 1821. He was raised by his stepmother Sara Barnwell Stoney.

On April 5th, 1842, before he had reached his 21st birthday, James married Mary Clara Reed, daughter of Dr. Samuel Reed. She had been born in Beaufort June 4th, 1826 and wasn't yet 16 at the time of the wedding. She died in Yorkville May 2nd, 1862, leaving seven of her nine children for Amanda Springs Stoney, "Little Mother" to raise.

James graduated in Medicine at the South Carolina Medical College the year of his marriage to Mary, 1842. The years from 1842 to 1849 must have been busy ones for the planter, doctor and Layreader. That year he entered Virginia Theological Seminary and in 1852 was awarded a B.D. degree. April 18th, 1852 Bishop Meade ordained him Deacon and on July 15th, 1853 advanced him to the Priesthood.

The now Reverend Doctor James Stoney served in Beaufort at St. Helena's for his diaconate, and then took over the congregation of the Church of the Cross, Bluffton. Between 1853 and 1861 he and the congregation built the church, and in his spare time he ministered to the people over on Hilton Head Island at the Zion Chapel, which Dalcho's history says was built by James' great grandfather, "Captain Jack" John Stoney of Otter Hole plantation on Hilton Head, with the assistance of Mr. Fripp. The building stood from 1788 to 1868. The silver chalice was lost and is now restored. The story is an amazing one.

Rev. James Stoney M.D. became rector of Good Shepherd Church, Yorkville in April 1861, where he served out the War years. It was during those years that Mary died, Reed and James went off to the War, and he, serving a time as Chaplain had to come home to look out for his Parish and family. He married Amanda Springs there.

1866 came and Rev. Dr. Stoney returned to Trimblestone and the Church of the Cross. Crop failures, poverty in the congregation, all his fortune liquidated he moved to St. Stephen's, Savannah, Ga. January 5th, 1868 and died there as the rector February 10th, 1870. Amanda buried him by their child Margaret in the Richardson lot, plot number 1152, in Laurel Grove Cemetery. You may read the brave inscription she had the stonemason carve on the monument.

POSTSCRIPT. Amanda Springs Stoney and her two children, Julia Stoney and Saida Stoney, moved to Charlotte where a devoted Springs cousin, Colonel Myers, helped her through cruel years, one of which was a diphtheria epidemic when both of the children died. Later Amanda married Mr. Gibson, and when she died years later, the second time a widow, she was buried in Charlotte by her children Julia and Saida.

AIDS TO
INTERPRETING
THESE TABLES

In order to help the reader understand what generation he is looking at where the names recur over and over, I have tried a device of numbers and letters as follows for the generations:

The large capital numbers, I, II, III etc. are the children of Rev. Dr. James Stoney, and the small Arabic numerals such as 1, 2, 3, 4, etc are used for the grandchildren. Their children are lettered as capitals A, B, C, etc. which means they are great grandchildren. Small a, b, c etc. are used for great-great grandchildren.

I could get only four colors of paper, so I have started with this "goldenrod" and will give Uncle Reed's family in white. Then comes "Papa" or Jimmy (Rev. James Moss Stoney) which is in blue. That will be followed with Uncle Ned's family in white. And so on through Uncle Ned's, Uncle George's, Uncle Louises, and Aunt Mamie and Aunt Nana.

James studied for the Ministry and left many descendants.

George was said to be the first Southerner to be appointed to Annapolis after the close of the Civil War. He distinguished himself, rose to high rank, and made valuable explorations in Alaska.

Mary, our "Aunt Mamie", married Dr. Robert Brevard, whose grandson, Brevard Moore is just retired (1967) as Rear Admiral.

Ann, our "Aunt Nana" married Mr. Charles Drake. The family developed the Drake Corporation of Norfolk.

One of James' sons became Bishop of New Mexico, and his son is now Brig. General Paul Roberts Stoney, U.S. Air Force.

The present Rev. James Moss Stoney is the fourth Reverend James Stoney in direct line. He is rector of St. Peter's, Talladega.

Others have less spectacularly served their country and their people nobly.

My personal comment is that I, William Shannon Stoney, ^{or} is the only member of the family whose military experience took him only to the rank of Private. It was actually Private First Class.

Another line about "Trimblestone".

Since the first comment on it some months ago, I have received a letter from the Reverend Stephen B. Barnwell, who ~~thinks that~~ ^{says} Trimblestone plantation was Barnwell property, and as Grandfather's step mother who raised him from infancy was Sarah Woodward Barnwell, daughter of Edward Barnwell, this Barnwell family from Ireland where their ancestral home was named "Trimbleton" gave Trimblestone to James and Mary as a wedding present in 1842. *No, Dr. Geo. Moss Stoney bought it and gave it to Rev. Dr. James as a wedding present.*

COMMENTS Since this seems to be my page, I will take the liberty of calling attention to a few striking facts among the descendants of Rev. Dr. James Stoney M.D. One is that there are four Reverend James Stoneys in direct line, each one having a part of his ministry in South Carolina, at least. Ministers of other denominations also show up, particularly in "Uncle Ned's" family which is outlined in pages after this.

Doctors are frequent. And Navy men are outstanding, including "Uncle George" whose book on Alaskan Explorations is on my shelf. There are ranks as high as Rear Admiral at the present.

WHENCE CAME WE? The original "Captain Jack" Stoney came from Ireland to St. Luke's Parish about 1775. Since the Barnwells were also among these early folks it could be possible that some of the families knew each other there. Captain Jack was a colorful personality, served in the Militia in 1775 and was enrolled in the fighting forces in historical records. He went to Hilton Head Island after the Revolution and began to build the foundations of what came to be known as the Otter Hole Plantation. The Pritchett Shipbuilding Company later built him a schooner. I think its name was "The Saucy Jack". He and Mr. Fripp sparked the work of building the Zion Chapel in 1788, which stood till 1868, and was served by the Rev. Dr. James Stoney, M.D. later.

The roots of the early Stoneys are to be found in the West Riding of Yorkshire, on the Wharfe river, in the town of Kettlewell. The Vicar still has the records from 1690 showing the Stoney name here and there. The records in Rilston show that a Stoney of Kettlewell married Mary Morehouse even earlier than that.

One Stoney buried in the churchyard is recorded as a Yeoman. One is recorded as a stone mason. The only comment by the name of still another is "He was a poor man". Alas, that's why they needed to get away, I suppose.

He and his wife are buried at Arlington. He married Kate Duer Babcock who lived till July 1st, 1951. Her home, with the daughters was in California. Below is a comment on the work "Uncle George" did. In September 1959 I wrote the Department of the Navy for information about copies of "EXPLORATIONS IN ALASKA" by George M. Stoney, Lieut., U.S.N. and they said that no copies were for sale or distribution, but to ask the Library of Congress for the loan of their copy. Happily some copies remained in the hands of Helena and Katharine, and I am the proud possessor of one copy. It is a story which deserved wider publication. Uncle George was not a person who named rivers and mountains for himself. He distributed those honors among his associates and others. Nothing is named "Stoney Mountain" or "Stoney River", though those names in Alaska would be most appropriate.

The Proceedings of the United States Naval Institute, Vol. XV, Number 3, Whole Number 91, was reprinted, but copyrighted. It has much from Uncle George's own pen as the work went on. Some photographs of the 1884 experiences and those of 1885 and on into 1886 tell the story of cold, cold conditions, life in tents or native sod houses of Indians or others, frozen rivers, dog sleds, huskies, endless dog sled trails, log cabins, forests, piles of supplies which had to be taken along on every trip and snow, snow, snow.

Uncle George went first to take help for the survivors of an ill fated expedition. Later he named an important river for the heroic Master C. F. Putnam, the officer of the Rodgers, who lost his life while gallantly trying to aid his imperiled shapmates. These words were written by Uncle George in reporting his activities. In the midwinter of 1884-1885 Uncle George writes of a "turnaphone" which he had taken along to provide music for the group. He said that it afforded much pleasure. He said that the men did not have a single fight that winter. The story runs on well into 1886.

Now to go back to the children of Rev. Dr. James Stoney M. D., two more boys were born after Uncle George, but did not live long. (V.) John Joseph Stoney was born July 20, 1851 and died July 1, 1852. (VI.) William F. Stoney was born in 1853 and died as an infant.
