John and Elizabeth moved to Hilton Head Island, South Carolina in 1774. John's Obituary in "The City Gazette", Oct. 19, 1821 is that on page two. Most likely he was with Francis Marion's army during the Revolutionary War.

- b.1775 (?) (VI) JAMES STONEY,
MISS MOSSE.

James is said to have been a Privateersman in the War of 1812. The cannon from his ship is now mounted on the "smudge pot" on the front lawn of the place, next to the Church of the Cross, owned by Miss Caroline Pinckney Huger in Bluffton. It was fired the last time in 1860 to celebrate "Cecession", Bluffton being the cradel of the movement, and nearly caused disaster to the cecessionists who were inexperienced in cannonading.

James had two children, GEORGE, of whom I tell below, and Martha. Martha married Dr. Joseph Lawton and had two children, Samuel Lawton (who married first Anna Brooks and then Hattie Brooks), and Paul Lawton.

James had a brother named John Stoney, who died in 1838, a merchant in Charleston, who married Elizabeth Gaillard, who was born in 1784 and died in 1850, many of whose descendants live in Charleston now. Their pictures are in the St. Memin. collection of portraits. The present Thomas F. Stoney, Mayor, is a great-grandson, as is Samuel Gaillard Stoney, Author.

George Stoney and his wife lived in Beaufort South Carolina and had several children, the first of whom was Joseph J. Stoney born in 1817, the second Elizabeth F. Stoney, born in 1820 and died in 1876, and the third, JAMES STONEY, of whom I tell later, who was born November 13th, 1821 and died Feb. 11, 1870.

REV. DR. JAMES STONEY

Dr. George Moss Stoney married the second time Sara Barnwell, who bore five children. She was born in 1804 and died November 28, 1879. The children were Annie B. Stoney, Emma B. Stoney, born 1837, Charlotte, born 1839, who married Rev. Mr. Fuller and lived for a time in Miami, Adeline, born in 1840, whose grave is unmarked in St. Helena's Churchyard at Bufort, S.C., and lastly George Mosse Stoney who was born in 1843 and was killed at the battle of Bentonville, North Carolina on March 19, 1865. He is named on a tablet on St. Helena's Church.

Mary Catherine Reed was the daughter of Capt. Samuel Reed of New England who moved to Beaufort early in the nineteenth century, and Clara Summerville of Upper Beaufort District, now Hampton County I think. She had one brother, Samuel P. Reed, who died in 1855. It was this Samuel P. Reed who erected over the grave of his father, Samuel Reed, a marble block with canopy top, with the inscription "STOP STRANGER, MY FATHER RESES HERE!" According to Mr. H. M. Stuart of Beaufort the will had made the condition that the name was not to appear on the stone to mark the grave. Mr. Stuart told me that he heard Uncle George Stoney say that this was the grave of his grandfather Reed.

My belief is that Samuel Reed was the son of Samuel Reed of Tolland, Connecticut, who is mentioned in D.A.R. records thus: "Samuel Reed, 1761 - 1851 enlisted in 1780 in Capt. Isabod Hinckley's Co., 2nd Regiment of Militia. He was born and died in Tolland, where in 1831 he was placed on the pension rolls, Tolland, Conn."

I found another stone in St. Helena's Cemetery like this: "Eliza Mary Reed, wife of Samuel Reed, July 28, 1792, July 21, 1817". She was evidently the first wife of Samuel Reed of Beaufort.

JAMES STONEY was nineteen, and MARY REED was not yet sixteen when they were married. They moved to Bluffton and purchased "Trimblestone" plantation, where their nine children were born. I visited "Trimblestone" on August 19, 1931 and found only Grandfather's office standing amid live oaks, crepe myrtles, pomegranates, and pines. A pile of bricks marked the spot where the home stood. Mrs. A. G. Weatherson of Bluffton, who took me out there, remembers the house before it burned, having spent a night or so there as a child. She said it had a brick basement with wooden upper structure.

In 1849 Grandfather took his wife and four children to Alexandria, Virginia, where he studied for the Ministry. I found records of him there from '49 until '52. He returned to "Trimblestone" where he farmed, practiced medicine, and ministered to the people of the community till 1860.

I visited Miss Agnes Coe of Bluffton in 1931. We sat on her porch and looked out across the Churchyard to the May River lowlands. She told me of the building of "The Church of the Cross" while Grandfather was Rector 1852 - 1860. She told me how perilously near it came to destruction when Federal troops from Hilton Head Island landed at the Municipal Docks and fired the nearby buildings, during the Civil War. A clipping of the day from the "Courier" is as follows:

"Bluffton, Wednesday, November 7, 1860"

"The approaching translation of the Reverend Dr. Stoney to Yorkville - - - - The most cursory glance at the Diocesan Report will show that not only has the beautiful St. Luke's been built and paid for during the seven years that Dr. Stoney has been Rector of Bluffton, but that the most liberal contributions have been made to the home and foreign missions of the Episcopal Church, South; The number of hearers and communicants has greatly increased, whilst the Sunday School and other parochial machinery are in most flourishing operation"

The reference to "St. Luke's" is probably a mistake. "St. Luke's" is the beautiful old country Church outside of Bluffton. "The Church of the Cross" in Bluffton is the one that was built by the congregation in Grandfather's Rectorship. Strange to say "The Church of the Cross" has no Cross on it.

Grandfather moved the family to Yorkville, and enlisted as Chaplain in the Confederate Army for a period. He returned to his family only in time to be with Grandmother, the lovely Mary Reed, as she died before she had passed middle-life. After making an effort to keep the family together for awhile alone, Grandfather married Amanda Springs, whom we knew in later years as "Grandmother Gibson", and moved back to "Trimblestone" the beloved home of former years. They soon failed, and Miss Coe told me that the congregation was so poor that they could make little contributions towards a salary. The family moved to Savannah where Grandfather became Rector of St. Stephen's Church for colored people. The first record of Baptism that I found in the Parish Register was dated June 3, 1868 and signed by him. His last official entry was dated Dec. 2, 1869. His photograph hangs in the Vestry Room there now, and a large tablet is on the wall of the Church, as follows:



"Sacred to the memory of REV. JAMES STONEY, Born in Beaufort, So. Ca. Nov. 13, 1821. Died Feb. 11, 1870. Late Rector of St. Stephen's Ch. Savannah. Though brief was the period of his ministry He labored faithfully as Priest, Counsellor, and Guide. His memory is lovingly cherished by the congregation who hereby testify their grateful appreciation of his labors in their midst, for he led them forth beside the waters of comfort.

JAMES STONEY'S DESCENDANTS

I wish I could tell in detail of all of the nine children and the many grand children of Rev. Dr. James Stoney and his wife Mary Reed. This is an outline of the families.

Upon his discharge he returned to Bluffton and married ~~Apr. 23, 1861~~ Alice Cole, to whom six children were born, the first two in Arkansas, the last four in Milledgeville, Georgia, where Father was Rector of St. Stephen's Church. I have seen the window to his memory there.
