No. (2) Did John Leacraft marry first 19 May 1752 Mary Doharty's daughter? According to an article written by Dr. Joseph Johnson of Chas. dtd. 1861 in his book: "Traditions and Reminiscences of The American Revolution in The South" p 444 in which he gives an account of the death of Capt. Doharty he mentions that three of Doharty's nephews were with him, John and William LeCroft, and "The late Col. Thomas Talbird", the latter ofcourse was James Doharty's half brother. If you note the Rev. Henry refers only to "Capt. Lecroft".

I noticed the name Lecraft in the S.C.H. Magazine (I believe) but did not copy anything. I gather from the above that John Leacraft married 2nd. Amelia Flower. I was under the impression that he died before his wife. Virginia ^{mentions} a John Leacraft whose sloop Charleston went down in a violent storm of 1771, also mention a Sea Captain from the Bermudas. Do you know where she got her data and if there is any connection with the Leacrafts above? I would also like to know the source of your information.

(3) I did not know that Capt. John Leacraft had married as Rev. Henry did not mention it. I have asked a Genealogist in Columbia to get the Revolutionary records for Talbirds, Doharty and Leacraft.
