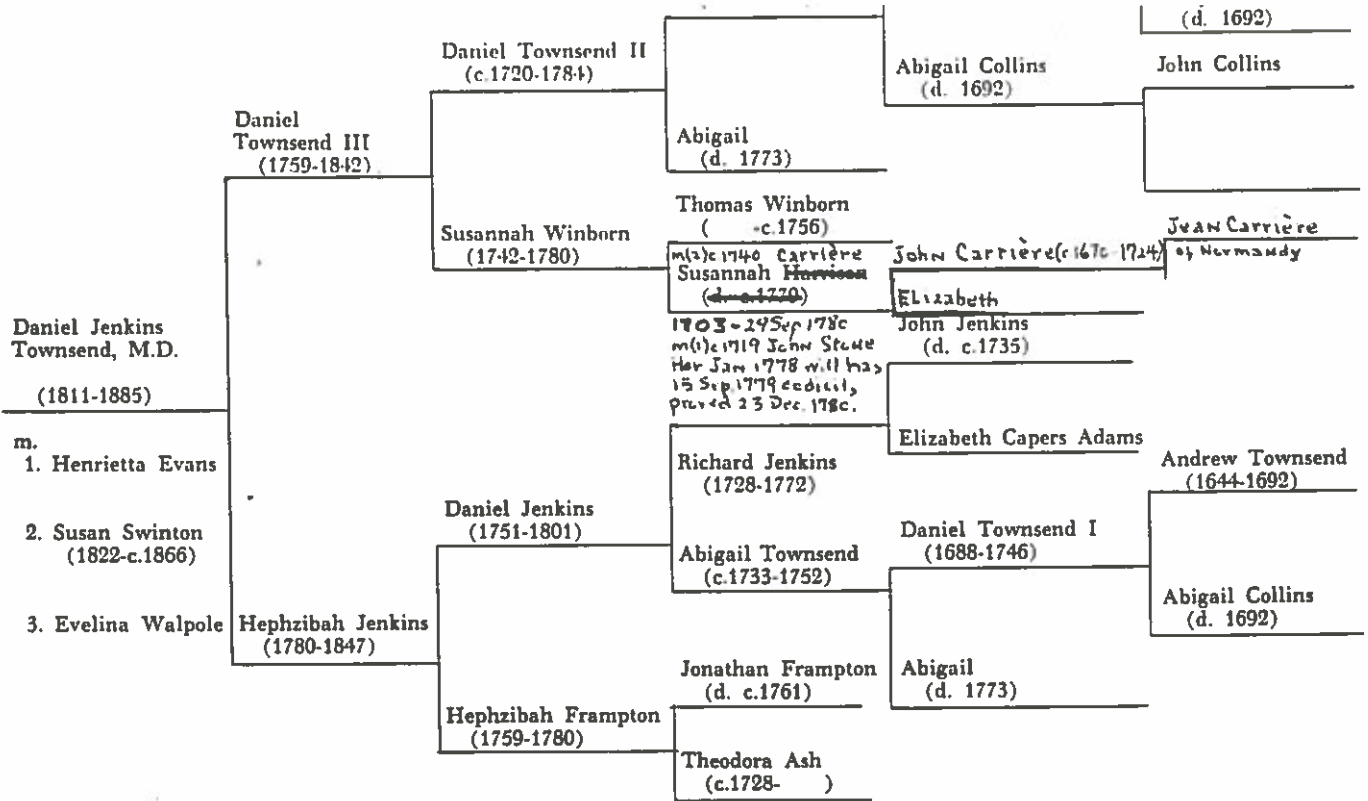

Daniel Townsend II was probably born in the Province of South Carolina, the eldest son of Daniel probably his first wife whose name and date of death married Susannah Winborn (1742 - 1780) about the had five children. She was the daughter of Thomas malaw Island and his last wife, Susannah Harrison of Virginia. Carrière (1703-29 Sep 1780) widow of John Stone Daniel and Susannah owned lands on Edisto Islands, but it is not certain on which of these islands was no doubt a planter since he owned farm lands mately fifty slaves to work them. 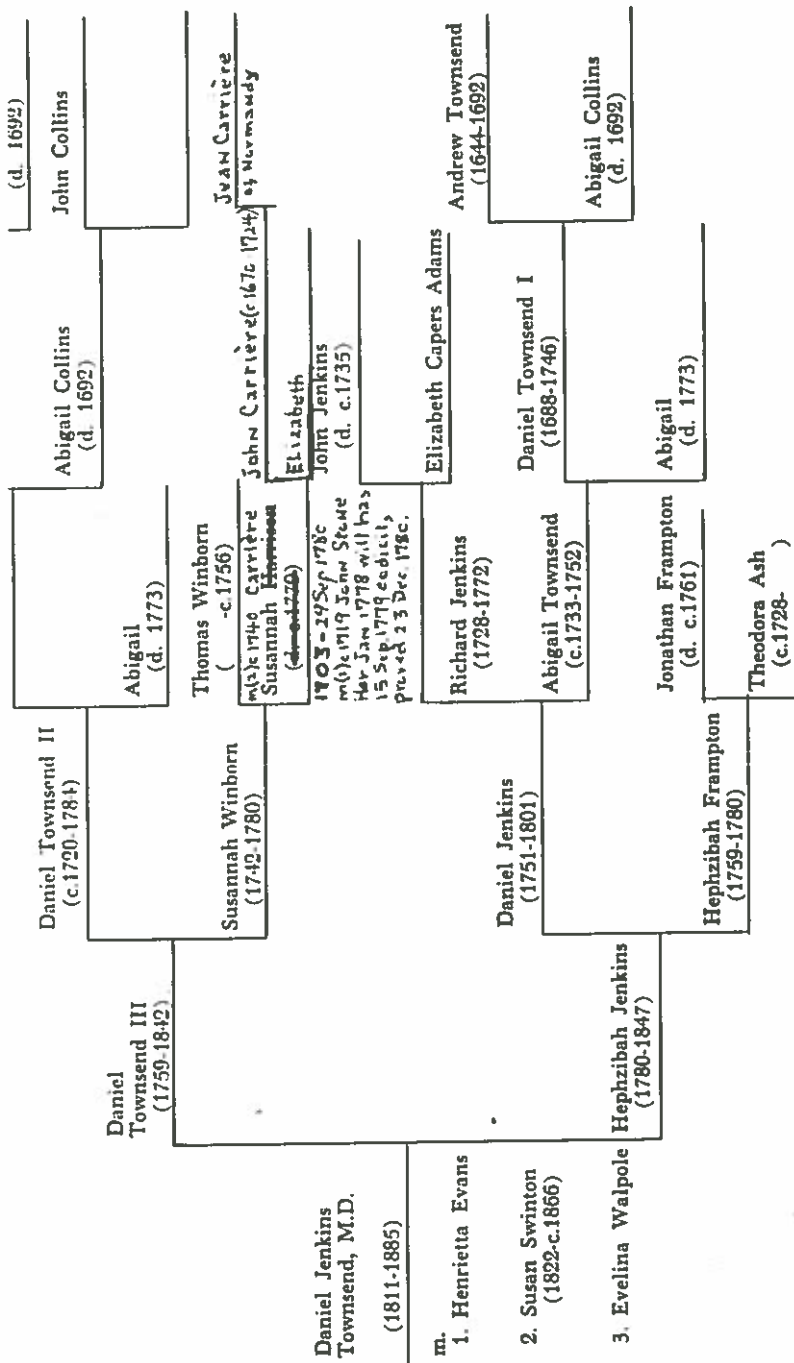

Will of Daniel Townsend

b, 17-6-1759, d. 21-5-1842

Daniel Townsend of Edisto Isl'd in Parish of St. Johns
Colleton.

1. To my beloved wife Mephezabah Townsend during her life my house and lot in Cannonborough purchased by me from Mrs Eliza Ferguson, After her death, the same to my children. Also to my wife 20 slaves, also 50 acres of land adjoining John La Roche for slaves to cultivate. Also to my wife one eighth share of cattle, sheep and hogs.

2. To my son John^F Townsend, the tract of land on which I ^{b. 23-10-1799} now reside known as "Bleak Hall" & Porky Island and 19 ^{d. 3-2-1881} slaves also one eighth part of stock.

3. To my son Daniel Jenkins Townsend, the tract of land which he now resides on known as "Shoregools" plus 20 slaves and one eighth stock.

4. To my daughter Mary Frampton Pope one eighth of stock also one fifth part of my land on Wadmalaw Island 18 slaves.

5. To my daughter Susan Martha Townsend, 20 slaves, one fifth part of tract of land on Wadmalaw, and one eighth of stock.

6. To my daughter Anarithia Jenkins Townsend 19 slaves and one fifth part of Wadmalaw land.

7. To my son Benjamin Joseph Townsend, 19 slaves and one fifth of Wadmalaw land.

8. To my daughter Theodora Elizabeth Townsend 18 slaves and one fifth part of Wadmalaw land.

9. I also give to my children Susan M. Anatintkia J., Theodora E., and Benj. J Townsend my lots of land situated within village called Rockville. (Wadmalaw Island is across N. Edisto River from Edisto, "Bleak Hall")

Executors --- Sons John Townsend, Benj. J. Townsend and Daniel Jenkins Townsend. Will drawn March 7, 1833
Proved June 2, 1842

A codical of 1839-----Fearing that his wife may prefer to live at "Sharegrave" instead of house in Charleston, give it to her if she wants it and make other arrangements for Son Daniel Jenkins.
