Bible printed in Oxford 1770.

- Alexander Trent the 3rd of Barter Hill March 3, 1729 and died February 27, 1793 age 64. Married (#92) Elizabeth Woodson - Born March 18, 1734 Died Jan. 7, 1787. They left six children - four sons and two Daughters -
- (92B) Elizabeth Born February 26, 1756 - Married Wm. Black and then Willis Wilson - She left one daughter, Maria Willis - and departed this October the 5th, 1834
 - (92A) Frances Born the 18th October 1753 - Married Wm. Gay and left two children - Elizabeth & Wm. and died March 1780
 - (92C) Alexander Trent the 4th Born the 10th of October 1758 - Married Ann Anderson and left five children, 3 Sons and 2 Daughters - and died Nov. 29, 1804

MATTHEW WOODSON¹, OLD TIMER PASSES

In the passing of Matthew Woodson¹ on Wednesday, Aug. 15, Middleboro lost one of her oldest and most respected citizens. Mr. Woodson was the last of nine children born to Mr. and Mrs. Anthony LeVillian Woodson² at the old homestead at Woodsonville, Ky.

He came to Middleboro in 1890 soon after the town was founded. In his early years he was chief dispatcher for the Louisville & Nashville Railroad Co. Later he moved to Virginia and became superintendent of the Interstate Railroad. In 1908 he returned to Middleboro where he organized the Middleboro Supply Co., of which he was president until he retired from active business late in life.

For many years he served faithfully as secretary of the board of education; deacon in the Christian Church, a member of the board of equalization, tax accessor, and for a period of 13 years he was local weather observer, from which he resigned at age 85.

He was a life member of the Knights Templar, the Louisville Order of DeMolay and the Elks.

He was a gentle and loving husband and father, a man of lofty ideals and quiet dignity; an outstanding Christian character, who not only professed his Christianity but expressed it in everyday life and in countless deeds of knidness to his fellowman.

Mr. Woodson is survived by his wife³ and two sons, Dr. E.D. Woodson and Grattan C. Woodson of this city, and one daughter, Mrs. Chenault Cockrell of Frankfort. Another daughter, Mrs. Irene Woodson Richardson of Chicago passed away eight years ago. He is survived by seven grandchildren and four great-grandchildren, and five nieces. Three grandsons, Lt. James Gregory Woodson, Midshipman Grattan C. Woodson Jr. and Lt. Matthew LaPrade Cockrell, are in the service of their country.

Mr. Woodson was the uncle of the late Anthony H. Woodson⁴, author of "Just Among Homefolks" column for the Courier Journal; also uncle of the late Isaac T. Woodson⁵ of Louisville.

Funeral services were held at the Woodson home on West Cumberland Avenue at 3 o'clock last Friday afternoon, conducted by Dr. A.H. Doak, assisted by Rev. A.B. Reeves and J.H. Baxter, pastor of the Christian Church, followed by short service at the grave and interment in Middleboro Cemetery.

INTRO TO JAMES LINEAGE

EDITORS NOTE: SEPARATING FACT FROM FICTION

Hundreds upon hundreds of books and articles have been written about Frank and Jesse James. In WW I make no attempt, amateur writer that I am, to try and compete with the professionals who have done such excellent work, William Settle in particular. Then there are the hacks, the penny dreadful type of writers who will set anything in print that will "make a buck", never considering whether it is true or not. Also, if untrue, how it will affect the descendants of the two men who became American Folk Heroes. I also cannot sit in judgement. But, I do wonder just how I would have reacted to the events that led up to their becoming outlaws. I have said before, when writing of Sarah Woodson in the Indian attack, that I would fight tooth and nail for my family, no holds barred. What would you have done if your family had been sent into Indian Territory, much as modern day Siberia? Or if your stepfather had been lynched? Or if someone had thrown a bomb into your home, killing your half-brother and blowing off the arm of your mother? How would you have reacted? Then, once making the move, how far would you go? Was it just momentum that carried them along? I don't know and we will probably never know the reasons. One must study the border wars, and the events preceding and during the Civil War to even begin to understand the whys involved.

I highly recommend to anyone seriously interested in this period of our history and that of James' in particular the following:
JESSE JAMES WAS HIS NAME, by William Settle. It has been meticulously written and very well documented. A most welcome addition to anyone's book shelf. It is easy and very interesting "read". It also separates fact from fiction, which is just what we will attempt to do in WW. From time to time, we will continue to print items and genealogical updates on the family. In this issue, we start the lineage of Frank and Jesse from Dr. John and Sarah Winston Woodson as compiled by Mrs. Lawrence Barr.

EDITORS NOTE: LETTER FROM MRS. BARR.

Dear Marilyn;

28 Aug. 1982

I would be happy to share my records with anyone interested in the Woodson line..... I have many, many inquiries from all over the U.S. on the Jesse James family alone! This "James Reunion" that was held July 19th brought in a lot of mail to the James Farm and Mr. Milton Perry turned it over to me to see what I could do with it. So very few even enclosed a SASE. I am almost 77 years old and I am beginning to have trouble with my hand because I have written too much in the past 16 years. Then Felix Luck (W7) of New Jersey has sent me a raft of information. He writes his up differently. He was kin to my husband in about 4 or 6 different ways..... Enclosed is an outline of the different lines I have. Some not too complete. Some people just send their direct line & no children or grandchildren.

Really, I believe I have more on the Woodson than I do on the James or Mims lines.

Just recently through the "James Reunion" I found another Jesse James, descendant of another John James, yet not our line. But the strange thing was they were 6th cousins to "our" Jesse James through the Woodson line.

I have had long distance calls from people who think they are related to the James line from about 15 different states. People just say, "My grandmother said we were kin to Jesse James; but I don't know how, do you?". Now how would I know when they don't even give me dates of birth, death or who they married, or when or where???????? Editors Note: A lesson for all of us.

INTRO TO JAMES LINEAGE (Cont.)

Barr letter continued.

Do you know of Richard Orr Sebree of Ghent, Ky.? His book, "Anthony Lindsay and his Descendants" is very much like Kenneth Lindsay's. Both did a fabulous job of research.....

I should have started my research when I was younger. Well, here it is 2:00 AM again. I write nearly every night. I get little sleep. I have so many interruptions in the day time I have to write after others go to bed. My name has been "spread around" so, over the James Reunion that I just don't know if I can handle anymore "publicity".

EDITORS NOTE: I am holding Thelma's address until she gives me the go ahead to print it. Hopefully, she will one day be able to get caught up with her correspondence. I do give her credit for even attempting to answer so many letters. Especially when many are probably not serious researchers.

EDITORS NOTE: Mr. Milton Perry is the curator of the James Farm and Clay Co. curator of historical properties. The farm consists of 38 acres purchased in 1978 by Clay Co., Missouri with plans to restore the famous outlaws' birth place as a historical attraction. Clay Co. officials believe the home-stead, which was built around 1822 is the oldest building in Clay County. Jesse was born on the farm, 1847.

EDITORS NOTE: I have often wondered if Jesse and #389 Gov. Silas Woodson of Missouri knew they were related. Gov. Woodson placed a sizable reward on Jesse's head. Also, I wonder if Jesse knew he was kin to Dolley Madison. Mr. Perry is quoted as saying, "For a long time around here, the Jameses were folk heroes. People looked at them as Southern boys who were put upon by the banks and railroads."

President Harry Truman in "plain speaking", I believe, compared the James boys with railroad robber barrons and the James' came out far ahead. He expressed quite an interest in them. The interest continues to grow, in fact many of you have subscribed to WW just to get the Woodson-James connection. There are many other descendents of note in the line and we will continue to feature lineage on them. Coming soon will be those of Sidney Lanier the American Hall of Fame poet. Also, Matthew Jouette the renown artist from Ky., student of Gilbert Stuart, to name two. But, our continuing thrust will be to try and tie up loose ends of lines & find the missing connections.

Mrs. Lawrence H. Barr (Thelma Duncan). Mr. Lawrence H. Barr is the grandson of Jesse Woodson James. "Cousin" Thelma has been a very good & faithful correspondent of mine for quite a few years now. Mr. & Mrs. Barr are desirous of having the heritage of the James family preserved, and most hopefully in a correct and dignified way.

I have long known about Dr. John and Sarah. In view of my interest with the possibility that other readers may be interested, I am submitting several quotes I copied in Oxford (England) University, Bodleian Library (Duke of Humphrey's Library) on May 11, 1982. Note; The name Wodeson was not listed, the name Wodyson was not listed.

Well, so much for the Oxford information. I went to St. John's College for a short visit. I walked up to the library in St. John's. It was a most pleasureable feeling to know that the ancestor of myself and so many others very likely climbed these same steps to the same library in the year 1604-5. But, enough of the nostalgia.

I wonder if someone has traced Dr. John's life in more detail. If he left Oxford in 1605-10, did he return to Bristol? When and where did he marry? From where did he sail when he and Sara(h?) came to Jamestown in 1619: Was it from London? Gravesline? Bristol? Where? Perhaps the letter will give some of this information. (We are certainly going to try! ed.).

Let me give a bit of information about myself. I am a professor of Bible at David Lipscomb College, Nashville. I have been, since 1959 until 1982, at Freed-Hardeman College, Henderson, Tennessee. Jeanne, my wife, and I have three children, Melissa (married to Mike Bishop), Bill (married to Donna Peccararo) and Allison, a highschool senior.

In tracing back to John and Sara(h?), I have a snag. I can go back as follows:

my father is Ed Woodson, married to Thelma Orear

His father was Alfred Vanhorn Woodson, married to Mattie Haywood.

Married _____. Note: Oldest son, Francis Pryor was born in Alabama, apparently Cherokee County, in 1850, so marriage was in late 1840's.

Here the trail grows very cold. In tracing what I am able to determine, the following appears: In the 1850 census of Cherokee County, Alabama William A. Woodson is mentioned. He was 22 in 1850 (In the Alabama census of 1860 this same William A. Woodson is mentioned as 30 years of age, as noted above. He had entered land in Walker County. Ala. Nov. 19, 1854, apparently moving in the summer from Cherokee County to Walker County). Also, in Cherokee County there was in the same census a James Woodson, born in S.C., 61 years of age (born in 1789?), and married to Amanda, age 49, place of birth not given, date of marriage not known. This James and Amanda Woodson are apparently the parents of William A. Woodson, whose wife is Louisa _____, but the date of marriage is not clear. This James Woodson was born in South Carolina, so was William A. This means that James Woodson was in South Carolina in 1828-30 when he became the father of William A. This raises the question of who was the father of James Woodson?

In the 1840 Cherokee Alabama census records there is a James P. Woodson with family members which fit the family of James Woodson in 1850, leading me to think that he was the same man. If so, this might indicate that the P in his name is for Pryor and that his grandson Francis Pryor Woodson, son of William A., was named for his grandfather. This is not clear, but it could be.

I am left without a way to proceed backward from this point. So, I have gone from John and Sarah forward. Using William and Mary Quarterly information and notations I have the following:

1 John and Sara(h) Woodson

sons John and Robert.

Descent through / Robert / and Elizabeth Ferris Woodson

sons John, Richard, Robert, Joseph, Benjamin

Descent through Benjamin and Sarah Porter Woodson

sons William, Benjamin, Joseph, John, / Robert /

daus. Elizabeth and Sarah

Descent through Benjamin and Rebecca Pryor Woodson

sons John, / James /, Benjamin, Robert

daus. Eliza(beth?), Mary, Sarah.

Descent (likely) through James.

Now comes the problem of tying the threads together. A Mrs. Leon L. Mabry of Union, S.C. is a descendant of a son of this James, 169 James that is. She traced the line and showed the following: 169 James b. 1739, d. 1834, married Elizabeth Whitlock, Goochland Co., Va. July 23, 1754. William and Mary Quarterly show the following issue: Jennie, Gillie, Thomas, Sally, and Car(c)y. Mrs. Mabry tells that the Douglas Register, p. 325, lists a son, /James b. March 10, 1758 and baptized April 30, 1758/. Mrs. Mabry traced the life and line of Carey and this helps greatly in my search, but the thread is not yet complete.

The problem basically is that there are several James Woodsons in S.C. in the years of my special interest. I have the idea that the James Woodson, Cherokee County, Alabama in 1850 is James P. Woodson in the same county in 1840. I also think, but I am not sure, that he was the son of Robert Woodson who came with his brothers James and Benjamin from Goochland County, Virginia after the Revolutionary War. If I can prove this, or determine who was the father of James (P/ryor?) 1850 and 1840 respectively, I will, at long last, be able to go back to John and Sarah. So, I ask these questions for inclusion

in the newsletter:

1. Who was the father of James P. Woodson listed in the 1840 census in Cherokee County, Ala., in his home state of South Carolina?
2. Is James P. Woodson (a) in reality James Pryor Woodson and (b) The same man as James Woodson in the same county in 1850?
3. Who was the Amanda, wife of James Woodson, Cherokee County, Alabama in 1850? Was her name McCurdy, McCurry, McCurley, etc.?
4. Who was Louisa, wife of William A. Woodson in Cherokee County, Alabama in 1850? What was her maiden name?
5. Was the James P. Woodson (Ala. census 1840, 1850) the son of Robert Woodson, James Woodson or some other Woodson in South Carolina?

Dear Claudette:

My middle name "Woodson" was given to me probably thru association with the Woodsons in the past. My family history (Akers) shows that my GGG Grand father William Akers got in trouble for letting an ex-communicated Baptist preach in his home. (From Pigg River Church records). A brother Woodson of the Black Water Church was warranted in this case.

I don't know whether he was the ex-communicated person they were talking about. As you can see in some of my notes, that some of my Akers clan acted as surety for some of the Woodson marriages.

Rev. Edwin Woodson settled in Talcott, W. Va. on the Greenbrier River. My Grandmother Mann was from that neighborhood. There are some Woodsons still living in that area, but I have nothing on them. Edwin m. Adaline B. Landcraft of Nelson Co., Va. Both are of English ancestry. He d. in 1851.

Response to Query ___/W92: Shirley Ferry Bell:

Several sources say that Shadrack, son of William and Sarah (Allen) Woodson, was b. ca 1717 in Cumberland, married and settled in Buckingham. The birth date would be impossible since his grandparents Benjamin and Sarah (Porter) Woodson were m. in 1700 and their son William was b. in 1703 (both dates, Quaker Rec.). From Cumberland Co., Va. records it appears that this same Shadrack m. Susannah Walker, 1766, in Goochland Co. (Douglas Reg.) A son David was b. the 8th and Bapt. the 23rd of April, 1770 (p. 327, Ibid). Cumberland Deeds show that Shadrack and Susannah had sons: David, Jess, Shadrack, Jr. - Family group sheets in Salt Lake City (no ref), add: Joseph, b. ca. 1741; Polly, b. ca. 1743; Wm., b. ca. 1745. It is obvious that the researcher gave these last three children to the wrong mother, but it surely indicates that Shadrack was m. at least twice. This is the

p. 74 - Query of W135, Elizebeth C. Robinson:

This is most interesting! However, Thos. Chamberlayne, b. ca. 1652, d. 1719 (Will pro. Henrico Co., Va. Dec. 1719), m/1 Mary Wood (proven d/o Gen. Abraham Wood); m/2 Elizabeth Stratton (d/o Edward), Sept. 1709. The Batte, Jones and Cocke families intermarried a lot. Has new data been found? I am wondering if the Sarah Woodson, of the Will mentioned, was the widow of John Brown, who m. John Woodson II? Records show she had a daughter named Temperence, which could be the same Temperence Brown (there were several) who m. Thomas Batte (b. ca. 1662; d. 1691). They had one child named Martha. This would seem to fit.

p. 75 - Wm. Lacy Woodson:

I have always thought that Jesse had other children besides Allen. He almost had to be the Jesse listed in 1782 as "head of family" of 5 whites and 5 blacks. Again, this age should be corrected as his father, Wm., was b. 1703, it isn't likely that Jesse was b. in 1715 (W&C). I would be more inclined to think that Joseph Monroe Woodson (b. 1787) could have been a nephew/1st c., rather than a brother of Allen since Jesse was, apparently, married to Mary Anne (Toney?) before Oct. 1776 (Cumberland records), and they evidently had no children.

p. 75 - The line of Capt. James Woodson, m. Elizabeth Whitlock, is fully contained in an article published in the book, "Union County Heritage" (S.C.), 1981. The Author, Mannie Lee Edwards Mabry, is also editor of the book.

p. 76 - I believe that Charles Hutchinson, William L. Woodson, Janie Crosby and myself, will make a connection. Sure would be nice if we hit the Taylor line in the same sweep (we would probably pull in Anne Baker here also).
