In referring to the Supplement II of the Descendants of William Capers and Richard Capers of FL by Dorothy Seabrook W. Smith (Low Woods), I found your name and address on page 83. You were correcting errors regarding BENJAMIN WILLIAM JENKINS (1810) son of SAMUEL JENKINS and JANE REYNOLDS.

My question concerns MARTHA S. (Sarah?) JENKINS, sister of your BENJAMIN WILLIAM JENKINS (1810). South Carolina Genealogies Vol. III p. 25, is incorrect when it states she married Dr. William B. Townsend. (Dr. Townsend married as his second wife, Sarah Seabrook Jenkins, daughter of Benjamin Whitmarsh Jenkins and Providence Edings Fickling. Vol. E, page 299, Deed Records of Dallas County AL) Do you know the name of MARTHA S. JENKINS' husband? Was her middle name Sarah? Could she have been a widow, Mrs. Sarah Harvey who on 11 October 1831 married DR. THOMAS HARRISON McCALLA CURTIS? (Rev. Basil Manley's marriage records.)

Capers Connections by Ellison Capers IV, p. 244 gives Martha S. Jenkins daughter of Samuel Jenkins and Jane Reynolds as "died 1827 unmarried".

You will not have seen me at the SAR meeting tomorrow. Hope to make one at a later time. My dues are paid up.


