

ZEIGLER:

with wife & 5 children

I. Frederick Zeigler (Faitz Seigler) arrived S.C. from Rotterdam, Holland before 15 March 1753 when the Council read and approved his petition for a grant of land; (Council Journal of S.C.) 250 acres was granted him 3 Sept. 1754 on MINE Branch (off Congaree River) above Amelia township, Berkeley Co.; title to this 250A was delivered 15 May 1758 to Christopher Guenters, indicating probably that Zeigler had died. His petition indicates he arrived with his wife and 5 children:
