## **The Exploratory Committee**

For

The Hilton Head Island Civil War Memorial (US Colored Troops Memorial)

Committee Purpose: To determine if sufficient interest exists in the Hilton Head Island community to erect a Civil War Memorial to those who served in the War of the Rebellion on the Island, to include the escaped slaves who enlisted in the United States Colored Troops on Hilton Head.

Scope of the Committees work: Since this is an exploratory committee only, it is expected that there will be only one or two short meetings between the formation in October 1999 and the full project commencement February 12, 2000. Much of the work will be done by individuals, and by telephone. The committee will determine the following points:

- Is there sufficient interest to support the project?
- What would be the most appropriate location for the memorial?
- How extensive would the memorial be?
- Who would serve on the committee to fund and construct the memorial?
- Will a new non-profit organization need to be formed, or can the project be done under the auspices of an existing organization?
- Will support structures or parking need to be built?
- Will a permanent endowment for maintenance and support be needed?

**Possible Sites:** The following short list of possible sites will be discussed, and possibly added to, by committee members:

- Fort Howell—on Beach City Road, owned by the Hilton Head Island Land Trust
- Mitchellville—next to Fort Howell, ownership unknown
- Fort Mitchell—owned by the Hilton Head Historical Society, located in Hilton Head Plantation
- Fort Walker—owned by the Port Royal Plantation POA, located in the Plantation
- The Chapel of Ease Cemetery—at William Hilton Parkway and Matthews Drive, owned by the Hilton Head Historical Society
- Union Cemetery—on Union Cemetery Road, owned by the White Family
- Fort Sherman—owned by the Port Royal Plantation POA, located in the Plantation

New Library automation software has been installed at the Heritage Library - Library World 98 from CASPR, Inc. This is the same software used at the Technical College of the Low country. Users are able to search on-line by subject, title, and author.

We are in the process of installing the software and transferring our cataloguing data to the new system. Eventually, patrons will be able to access the system from a terminal in the library or on the World Wide Web via our URL-www. heritagelib.org. This package enables a researcher to find a book's exact shelf location. In addition, users can access the software to create a bibliography for their subject and/or surname to save on disk or printout.
