Anna Mary was born September 20, 1844 in North Woodstock, Connecticut, one of four children of Hezekiah Bishop (1804-1863) and Martha Dana Lyon (1806-1877), daughter of Captain Judah Lyon, an influential citizen of Connecticut. Ann Mary's paternal grandparents were Dr. Ebenezer Bishop who was born in Lisbon, Connecticut and died in October 1834 in North Woodstock, Connecticut. He was married to Sarah Lyon and had six children, including Ann Mary's father Hezekiah

Anna Mary entered Mt. Holyoke Seminary for women in 1859 and graduated in 1864¹. Her sister Sarah L. Bishop was also a graduate of Mt. Holyoke, class of 1860². Sarah taught freedmen in Abbeville, South Carolina from 1870-75. Ann Mary married Horace P Whitney of Toledo, Ohio June 30, 1863³.

Anna Mary was appointed by the American Missionary Association as a teacher to the freedmen on Hilton Head Island and arrived in September 1868⁴. Her salary was

aid by the US Senate Act Fund of 1866. Anna Mary transferred inland to Abbeville to continue teaching freedmen's children in May 1870 where her sister Sarah also taught 1870-75. After teaching in Abbeville, Anna Mary transferred again to Atlanta, Georgia with the Freedmen's Bureau and finally to Talladega College in Alabama⁵. The 1880 US Census found Anna Mary living with her married sister back in Woodstock, Connecticut. She died on May 11, 1894 in Woodstock and was buried in North Woodstock Cemetery⁶.
