## 1851-1875

Jane was born April 15, 1851 in Ludlow, Hampden Co., Massachusetts to William Diodate Cooley (1825-1904) and Jane S. Cooley (1825-1851), William's second wife. Young Jane's mother died just six days after her birth. On January 2, 1870, young Jane married Joseph H. Jenks (1841- 1878). Perhaps Jane's mother was the sister of either Gilbert or Antoinette Pillsbury, because young Jane was living with them in Ludlow, Massachusetts on the 1860 US Census. The Pillsburys were both teachers at that time in a boarding school and later were teachers and Superintendents to the freedmen in South Carolina. In 1864, Jane was appointed by the New England Freedmen's Aid Society as a teacher to the freedmen and arrived on Hilton Head Island in December of that year. Jane was sponsored by the Bessie Lehmann's Society

chapter in Boston, Massachusetts.<sup>2</sup> In 1870, Jane and her husband were on the US Census living in Charleston, South Carolina where they both had been transferred in July 1865 by the New England Freedmen's Association.<sup>3</sup> Jane served as a teacher and Assistant Matron (to Mrs. A.F. Pillsbury) at the Colonel Shaw Orphan Home in Charleston.<sup>4</sup> The orphanage had been established in April 1865 by Antoinette and Gilbert Pillsbury when the military transfer of freedmen families to inland locations left many orphans behind in Charleston. Jennie died August 1, 1875 in Ludlow, Massachusetts and was buried in Ludlow Island Pond Cemetery, Section C, Lot #111.<sup>5</sup>
