Lineages - BRANCHES, are needed as these will help everyone find their ancestors. A separate section in this volume explains how to submit your branch. On page 44 is the Editor's Note which also asks new readers to send in their information. These booklets will continue as long as there is an interest.

In researching early German records, I have noticed some interesting items. The German way seems to be to use their middle name as their given name; John [Johann, Johannes] is very commonly used for their first name when they are christened. e.g. Johannes Jacob, known as Jacob. Phillip is another one used for the first name. The same applies to the women. Anna and Maria seem to be favorite first names. e.g. Anna Maria, aka Maria; Maria Elisabeth, aka Elisabeth. However this usage is not always used! Some records give all the name, others give either 2nd name or even only the 1st name! All this compounds the search for the right person. Relying on land records is one way to help sort them all out.

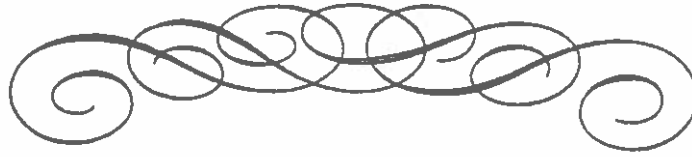
Our ancestors seem to have come mainly from Germany and Switzerland. On page 11 is an interesting record. Where do you suppose they came from? Were they of German extraction?

BIOGRAPHIES



The following are extracts from Biographies in History Books.

1909, LICKING COUNTY, OHIO

DAVID LAYMAN, a farmer of Washington township, was born in Fairfield county, Ohio, September 10, 1846, his parents were Abraham and Elizabeth (Keller) Layman, the former a native of Rockingham county, Virginia; and the latter of Washington county, Pennsylvania. Abraham Layman came to Ohio in an early day; in 1856 took up his abode in Licking county, he died in 1865. Abraham and his wife had 8 children: Benjamin, Mary, Daniel and William D., all of whom are all deceased; one who died in infancy; David of this review; Charles W., who is deceased; and Emily, the widow of B. Vanwey.

David Layman had a common school education, lived with his parents until he became the age of twenty three years; then married in 1869 to Miss Amy Smith, who was born in Orange county, New York, Oct. 24, 1844. Her parents are both deceased, they had 8 children.

David and Amy Layman had 9 children: Edward, Delia May and Frederick N., all deceased; Nellie B., wife of E. L. Burkholder of Licking Co; William Earl, deceased; and Charles R. and James A., both at home. David's wife died on Oct. 3, 1908, and is buried in Eden Cemetery.

Subsequent to his marriage Mr. Layman operated a rented farm for one year and then purchased his present place of 132 acres in Washington township, Licking county.

1880, ORANGE TOWNSHIP, DELAWARE COUNTY, OHIO

MRS. SARAH LEHMAN; P.O. FLint; born Jan. 10, 1842, daughter of William & Christina (Route) Bickle, natives of Germany who came to Fairfield County, Ohio, where Mrs. Lehman was born; she lived at home until she was about 18 years of age, when she was married to Joshua Lehman born Oct. 15, 1819 in Fairfield Co. After their marriage, they located in Hocking Co., in the spring of 1875 they moved to this county; bought 150 acres of land on the State road, in Orange Township; he was a farmer until his death---Feb. 10, 1879.

[Joshua Lehman] Was, during his life, a consistent active member

of the United Brethren Church, he had been a member since his 20th year. Since his death, Mrs. Lehman has been conducting the farm; she had four children---Clara Samantha, Charles D., Christina and Lillie Alice; children all at home. Mrs. Lehman and two girls are members of the U. B. Church.

1886, CHESTER TOWNSHIP, LOGAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS

ANDREW LAYMAN, youngest son of Henry and Elizabeth (Kretzinger) Layman, was born in Mason Co. Illinois, April 14, 1852. He married Blanche Pegram, born 1854 in Pike County, Illinois, daughter of Alexander and Martha (Ward) Pegram, residents of Lincoln (her mother died December 1, 1876). To Mr. and Mrs. Layman have been born four children -- Ward E., Nellie M., Beulah B. and Clifford A., the latter dying in infancy. Mr. Layman is at present residing on the northwest quarter of section 14, Chester Township, where he has a fine farm containing 380 acres, situated on section 11 and 14.....

[The article gives detailed information about the father of Mrs. (Blanche Pegram) Layman].

GEORGE LAYMAN, one of the prominent citizens and farmers of Chester Township, is the son of Henry and Elizabeth (Kretzinger) Layman, who settled in this township in 1866. The parents were natives of Virginia and of German descent, the father born in 1801. They were reared and married in their native State, and in 1836 removed to Union County, Ohio, where Mr. Layman cleared and improved a timbered farm, living there 7 years.

He [Henry Layman] sold out and located near Palestine, Illinois, but the following year removed to Parke County, Indiana. In 1846 the family returned to Illinois, locating in Mason County, where Mr. Layman purchased an unimproved farm, which was the home of the family about 20 years.

Henry Layman came to Logan County in 1866, and with his sons, Samuel and George, bought a tract of about 600 acres of land. The father made the homestead on the northeast quarter of section 15, where he lived till his death in 1868, and where his widow still resides. Henry Layman and wife had a family of nine children, of whom five sons and two daughters are living. Two daughters are deceased. Samuel, the eldest son, lives near Salem, Oregon; Isaac and Lewis live in Champaign County, Illinois.

George Layman, the second son, was born in Shenandoah County, Virginia, July 26, 1835. May 30, 1861, he was married to Elizabeth Plaster who was born and reared in Illinois, birth date: November 5, 1843. Her parents, Thomas and Elizabeth Plaster, were early settlers of Illinois, and are now deceased.

EXTRACT OF BIOGRAPHY: GEORGE LAYMAN - Continued:

Mr. and Mrs. George Layman have 3 children--Mary, wife of Charles Blackburn; George Edgar, lost his sight in May 1884; and Lewis Wolf. George Layman farm is on section 14, Chester Township, containing 320 acres, where he resides. His farm shows good care and is under fine cultivation, and his residence and farm buildings are noticeably good. His land when he first located here, in 1866, was wild prairie land.

Andrew, the youngest son of Henry Layman, resides on the northwest quarter of section 14. The two surviving daughters of Henry Layman are: Delilah, who lives at the homestead, and Mary, wife of William Young, living in Champaign County, Illinois.

LAYMAN'S CHAPEL.-- The original class at Layman's Chapel was organized in the fall of 1866, in the school-house, by Samuel, George and William Layman and their wives. The first pastor was the Rev. S. E. Pendleton.....In the spring of 1869 trustees were elected as follows: SAMUEL, GEORGE and WILLIAM LAYMAN, Wm. Moore, W. A. Pegram and A. B. Hageman. The chapel was completed and dedicated in September following, the dedicatory services being held by Rev. Wm. Crain, of the Illinois Conference, Rev. W. R. Goodwin, of the Methodist Episcopal church, in Lincoln, having laid the corner-stone in the summer.....

1880, NOBLE TOWNSHIP, LA PORTE COUNTY, INDIANA

THOMAS LAYMAN, son of Joshua and Eliza (Travers) Layman, born in New York in 1828, is of Dutch descent on his father's side and Yankee on his mother's side. His parents were also native of New York and are now both dead. He came to Indiana with his father in the fall of 1833, and first settled where he still resides on sec. 2.

In 1851 he married Sophia Youngs, who died 4 years after their marriage; she was the mother of 3 children of whom only one is now living: Anna. He married 2nd in 1856 Agnes Peterson who is now 45 years old and the mother of 7 children; of these 6 are now living: Cass C., Norvel, Henrietta, Delbert, Addie and Jennie.

Mr. Layman owns here 68 acres and 20 acres of timber land in the same township. He once held the office of Constable. His educational advantages were rather poor; he is a Democrat. He and wife are members of the Baptist church.

The following excerpts support the LAYMAN biographies from the 1880 History of Logan County, Illinois.

April 8, 1880 [date of paper] --- Etna, April 5

Layman church Sabbath School was reorganized last Sunday with the following officers: Andrew Layman, Superintendent.....

October 21, 1880 --- Aetna, October 18

Mrs. Young of Champaign county is visiting her mother, Mrs. Bessie Layman.

November 4, 1880 --- Aetna, November 1

The many friends of Andy Layman will be glad to learn that they can now hear his musical voice sing "Baby Mine" -- a daughter.

January 20, 1881 --- Aetna, January 17:

Mr. and Mrs. Andy Layman and family accompanied by Miss D. Layman are making a lengthy visit among friends in Champaign county. His aged mother and a farm hand are taking care of the property during their absence.

March 31, 1881 --- Obituary column "Died"

At the home 4 miles north of this city [Lincoln] on Saturday morning March 26, Mrs. Sarah Layman, wife of William Layman, Esq. aged 57 years 6 months 25 days. Mrs. Layman came to Clinton county, this state from Georgia, when a little girl, and to this county in 1865. She leaves a husband, one son and three daughters. Funeral at the Zion church, sermon preached by Rev. W. N. McElroy, Presiding Elder, Rev. T. D. Weems Pastor, assisted in the services. Buried in the Zion cemetery.

March 31, 1881 --- "Personals" column

John Layman of Thomasboro, Champaign county and Mrs. J.T. Walton of Marion county were here at the first of the week attending the funeral of their mother.

June 14, 1881 --- Aetna, June 13

George Layman has purchased a two seated buggy.

December 22, 1881 --- "Delayed Letters"

The following was sent in from Dayton, Yamhill county, Oregon. Samuel Layman owns and farms a fine farm of 176 acres near Woodburn. He raised good crops this year four and a half acres of potatoes yielded 1500 bushels. He and his family are well satisfied with Oregon.

January 26, 1882 --- Real Estate Transfers

Andrew Layman to Delilah Layman, 42 acres in Section 10, Chester, \$2520.00.

March 2, 1882 --- Aetna, February 27

Instead of Andy Layman purchasing the Leonard farm it was his brother George, purchased for his son-in-law, Charles Blackburn.

There may have been more items regarding these LAYMAN families for the years 1880--1883. I read this information while searching for my Manon family...editor.

Bonsack is in the extreme northeastern end of Roanoke county on highway # 460. Laymantown is about 3 miles west of highway #460 near the old stage coach road to Lynchburg, VA, & is in the extreme southeastern end of Botetourt county, which is adjacent to the north of Roanoke county. Rocky Glade, Laymantown and Bonsack are 5-7 miles apart. Contributor's notes are in brackets.

"In the name of God, Amen, I, JACOB LEHMAN, of Frankford township Cumberland County in the State of Pennsylvania being yet at this time blessed with a good understanding & memorythe moveable and real property I leave, I divide the same in the following manner, first, I devise that 1 year after my decease my Executors & Administrators have my land appraised by 12 men & if my son JACOB LEHMAN will have the land at the appraisement, which is situate in Frankford Township, Cumberland County adjoining John Clay, Kraft Kolb, George Kiehl and Abraham Heigernell, when he accepts it then he must pay the one half to my eight children & the residue in 4 equal payments, one payable every year, to pay yearly two of the eldest children.

But if my son JACOB will not have the lands, then my son in law MATHEW CLAY shall have a right to take the land in that way & if none of them will have it then they shall sell it as well as they can.

Further I bequeath to my wife CATHERINE the 3rd part of the money of the land & moveable property shall have the interest as long as she lives further she shall have the house occupied by PHILIP CLAY & 1 acre of land near it shall have hay & pasture for 1 cow further she shall have as right to take of the moveable property what she wants without being appraised the remainder of the property shall have appraised & sell the same at public vendue.

Cumberland Co., PA, will of JACOB LEHMAN, continued:

Further it is my will that the four children of my daughter EVE viz ELISABETH MELL, JOHN MELL, CATHARINE MELL shall have the half of their mother's legacy further it is my will that if SARAH MELL continues with her grandmother until she is 14 years of age then she shall have good clothes but if she shall continue until she is 18 years of age then she shall have a good bed chest spinning wheel & ?howbow? out of my estate....."

JACOB LAYMAN - REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIER

The following newspaper article has interesting data concerning JACOB LAYMAN, his life, children and descendants, as well as information about his brothers and sisters.

Wording and paragraphing of this article is exactly as written in a feature story printed in The Cocke County Banner, published by the Cocke County Publishing Company, Newport, Tennessee. For ease in reading, this story is herewith printed in essay style.

Jacob Layman - Revolutionary Soldier
Mrs. Beulah D. Linn
Sevier County Historian

Another historic area in Sevier County is that area along the Little East Fork of the Little Pigeon which rises thirty miles east of Sevierville near the head of Cosby's Creek (which flows into Big Pigeon River in Cocke County) and flows nearly west through Jones Cove, the communities of East Fork and Harrisburg, and joins the main East Fork four miles east of Sevierville. The rolling countryside along the river is one of the most productive farm lands in the county. No doubt the early pioneer settlers recognized its potential as settlements were made as early as 1787. Among the early settlers was Jacob Layman, Revolutionary soldier.

Jacob Layman was born in 1759 in Reading County, Pa. but moved to Virginia before the Revolution. He entered service as a substitute for Reuben Beaver in Shenandoah County, Va. He marched to Richmond under Capt. Bonywitt and there was attached to the infantry under Gen. Muhlenberg and Major Bays for ten weeks and was discharged and returned home to Culpepper County, Va.

Later, he belonged to the 8th Division of Virginia troops under Colonel Barber. Col. Barber told them to take the Hessians (prisoners of war captured from Burgoyne) to Elbmar Barracks. This was a five months tour of duty. After guarding the prisoners he went home to Culpepper County, Va.

The application for the pension (File 4504) was made 8 of September, 1832, in open court, Sevier County, Tenn. He stated that there was no one living in Sevier County who could testify that he served in the Revolutionary War. "And the "Said court do hereby declare their opinion after the investigation of the matter and after putting the interrogations prescribed by the War Department that the above named applicant was a Revolutionary Soldier and the court further certifies that it appears to them that Elijah Rogers who has signed the proceeding certificate is a clergyman residing in the county of Sevier and State of Tennessee and that William C. Maples who has signed the same is a resident in the state and county aforesaid and is a credible person and that their statement is entitled to credit." George McCown, Clerk.

Jacob Layman received pension certificate No. 19065. He signed the application with a beautiful signature which I wish all his descendants could see.

Since the Laymans were German descent, the name has undergone many changes as Lehman, Lemon, Lamon. In the Sevier County telephone directory we find Lamons, Layman, and Laymon who may belong to different families or some may be related.

The exact date of Jacob Layman's arrival in Sevier County isn't known. He served as a Captain in the Tennessee Militia Sevier County having been appointed July 30,

1800 (Record of Commissions of Officers in the Tennessee Militia, Vol. 1, by Mrs. John Trotwood Moore, pp.28,29) Land Grant No. 1022, Book 2, p.148 in the Archives in Nashville, states that pursuant to the Act, 1809, 304 acres in Sevier County in the District South of the French Broad and Holston "on the little East Fork of the Little Pigeon joining the lands of William Duggan and John Duggan," surveyed 10 April 1807, and granted 12 May 1810. On the same date 49 1/2 acres located "on the West Fork of the Little Pigeon a corner to Samuel Fancher and Moses Oldham surveyed 29 January 1807 was granted." According to the dates of the surveys it appears that he may have settled on the West Fork of the Little Pigeon first. This supposition is strengthened by the fact that on Sept. 5, 1807, the year of the surveys, that Jacob Laman and wife and Joseph Laman were listed as members of Forks of Little Pigeon Baptist Church in Sevierville.

On November 9, 1808, Jacob Lemmons (euphonic spelling) bought 122 acres from John Reed for the price of \$650.00, the land lying in the District South of the French Broad and Holston and adjoining the lands of Abraham Shull on the north bank of the Little East Fork of the Little Pigeon and vacant land. The land had been surveyed 16 April 1807 for a grant issued to said Reed. The deed was witnessed by William Duggan and Abraham Shull.

The following entries were made by Jacob Layman in the Entry Takers Office in Sevierville and surveyed by the County Surveyor. Recorded in Survey Book I they indicate that all the lands were located on the Little East Fork. The chain carriers reveal the names of relatives and neighbors. [C.C. = chain carriers]

Entry No. 108 July 1, 1824 - 50 acres, Little East Fork joining Sanford Allen.

Entry No. 90 June 22, 1824 - 60 acres, Little East Fork joining the old line.
George Layman and John Moon. CC.

Entry No. 89 June 22, 1824 - 50 acres, Little East Fork joining George Oldham's line and including the "White Oak School House."
George Layman and George Oldham, C.C.

Entry No. 398 June 12, 1826 - 57 acres, Little East Fork joining old line, Sanford Allen and Alexander Zollinger. George Layman, Carter Jones. C.C.

Entry No. 354 Jan. 8, 1826 - 87 acres. Little East Fork, "joining Mrs. Sally Thomas improvement and Jasper Moon. James Jones and Carter Jones C.C.

Entry No. 355 June 9, 1825 - 50 acres, Little East Fork "near his old Still House." Michael Layman, Carter Jones. C.C.

Entry No. 400 Jan. 12, 1826 - 35 acres, Little East Fork, joining Alexander Zollinger and Jasper Moon. George Layman and Carter Jones. C.C.

Entry No. 1244 Jan. 11, 1837 - 32 acres Little East Fork joining William Thomas.

Entry No. 1355 Jan. 13, 1838 - 200 acres Little East Fork.

The following references are made to Jacob Lamon in the Forks of the Little Pigeon Baptist Church Record Book:

"The first Saturday in February, 1808, Jacob Lamon served on a committee with Elijah Rogers and Isaac Veach.

The first Saturday in February 1809, Jacob Lamon served on a committee with Isaac Veach.

In May 1810 Jacob Lamon was one of the members appointed to attend a Union meeting at the Dumplin Creek Meeting House.

The first Saturday in December 1811, Jacob Lamon, James Smith, George Long and Spencer Clack were appointed to attend a meeting at the church in Millers's Cove."

A request for a letter of dismissal was granted to Jacob Laymon and wife by the Baptist Church in Sevierville in 1812. At the same meeting 'Br. Lamon came forward and gave a relation of the exercise of his mind respecting his goal to the work of the ministry. The church after hearing and maturely considering the matter thinks and says that his qualifications recommends him to that sacred function." It is probably that this Br. Lamon was Daniel Lamon, his brother.

Daniel Lamon, brother of Jacob, arrived in Sevier County the same time as Jacob as proved by Grant No. 892, 73 acres, issued by the State of Tennessee May 12, 1810 and recorded in Land Grant Book 2, p. 17 in the Nashville Archives.

Another intersting [sic] sidelight to the history of Jacob Layman is revealed in the following pension application:

3 April, 1845, Elizabeth Compton, age 81, asked for a pension as the widow of Jeremiah H. Compton.

She made oath she married said Compton in Botetourt County, VA., about 1784, and that her husband died, 19 June 1844. Daniel Layman made oath, 4 April 1845, and said that he was present when said Comptons were married in Botetourt County, Va. Daniel Layman said he remembered date of Compton marriage because he (Daniel Layman) was married in 1797, about twelve years after the Compton marriage. Daniel Layman also made oath that he remember [sic] seeing his "elder brother and said Jeremiah H. Compton returning from the army at the close of the Revolution." He also stated that Elizabeth Compton was his sister. Daniel Layman who made this oath was a "clergyman." On 13 August 1845, Ann Jones made oath that she was present when said Comptons were married in Botetourt County, Va., and also saw her brother Jacob Layman, return from the Revolution with Jeremiah H. Compton.

The late J. A. Sharp, Sevier County Historian, had evidence that his great great grandfather, Abraham Mullendore (b. 1769 d. 1831) married Susannah Layman, another sister.

Thus we may conclude that the following were brothers and sisters: Jacob Layman, Daniel Layman, Ann Layman Jones, Susannah Layman Mullendore, and Elizabeth Layman Compton.

Another brother in the same family may have been David Layman whose will was dated 28 March 1810 and recorded in June, 1817 in Jefferson County close by. The will stated that his wife Nancy was to have his property during her natual [sic] life; dau. Magdalen, \$1.00, son Jacob, #1.00, son John, \$1.00, son Thomas, \$1.00, son George, \$1.00; Daughter Nancy to have all at wife's death. Wife Nancy and friend Jacob Denton, executors. Witnesses, William Hill and James Hill.

At the age of 41 Jacob Layman married Nancy, a French lady, 21 years of age. The date would be about 1800 and the place unknown.

Since Joseph was with Jacob and wife in Baptist Church in 1807 and Joseph was in Blount County Census in 1830 age 40-50, he may have been the son of a first wife.

In 1932 Elmer Layman of Indiana listed the following children:

1. Michael Layman. Moved to Iowa.
2. John Layman. [and?] Martha and moved to Missouri. Their children were William, Elizabeth, and Nancy Layman.
3. George Layman b. 13 November 1805, d. 11 January 1878 m. Nancy Selvage in 1829. They moved to Missouri in 1840 -Children: Lucinda, Jacob, Robert, Pollman, Albert, Joseph, Levi, Columbus, Sarah Jane, George L.
4. Jacob Layman, Jr. b 1810 d. 1858 m. Susan Weaver in 1831 - Children: Elizabeth, John, Preston, Isaac, William T., Daniel, Mary.
5. Absolum Layman b. 30 August 1811 d. 24 Jan. 1890 m. 8 March 1840 to Sarah Hemby. - Children: Elias, Leander, George, Phoebe, Albert W., John Preston.
6. Ambrose Layman, Lived in Arkansas. A son, William, was in the Confederate Army in the Civil War.
7. Preston Layman b. 4 July 1816 d. 17 Dec. 1892 m. Malvina Baker b. 14 Nov. 1821 d. 13 July 1891 Buried at Cummings Chapel.

Further proof for Preston Layman being son of Jacob is the following record copied by the late J. A. Sharp.

From George McCown's Daily Store Ledger (Sevierville, Tenn):
Jacob Laman per son Preston, 12 May, 1838
Daniel Layman per son Asa, 4 Oct 1838
Michael Layman per Jacob Layman, 17 July 1837
Griffith W. Layman 8 Sept. 1838.

From the 1850 and 1860 census records the children of Preston and Malvina Layman are: Margaret (1842), James Mitchell (1844), William (1849), Albert (1854), Newton (1857), and Martha (1859). In the 1870 Census Preston Layman (54) and Malvina (48), William (21) Mary M. (18) are living in the same household.

James Mitchell Layman, son of Preston, married Hannah A. Bogart 25 June 1848. Her [sic] served as a Representative in the 36th General Assembly, 1869-71. Children: Margaret (Layman) Shaw, Julia M., and Eliza (Layman) Headrick. After the death of his first wife he married Sarah Shults. A son of this marriage was Lemuel Layman, the father of Mr. Clyde Layman who lives near the Bethel Church. James Mitchell Layman died 26 November, 1907 and is buried at Cumming's Chapel.

Since no daughters of Jacob Layman were mentioned by Mr. Elmer Layman of Indiana, the following should be considered since the Laymans and Houks were neighbors. However, they would have to be daughters by a first wife.

A copy of a Houk Family History was sent to me by Mrs. Elaine Wells of Grandview, Texas. "The first Houk to come to Jackson Co., Alabama, was Michael Houk born 1794 in Tennessee and his wife Lydia, born 1796. Lydia was a Lemons, sister of Margaret Butler, wife of Samuel Butler, Sr., also a sister of Annie, the wife of Ricard Wood."

Continued---

The following was recorded by Elmer S. Layman of Richmond, Indiana in 1932.

"Jacob Layman lived and died on the old home place on the East Fork of the Little Pigeon. He was a member of the Mt. Pleasant Church which was established in the early 1800's about one-fourth of a mile east of the Bethel Baptist Church. The old log house was used for both a school and church. It had a dirt floor and split logs for seats. The third building was erected in 1916 and was called the Cedar Bluff Church. The Mt. Pleasant Cemetery located near this church is where Jacob Layman and his wife are buried. They are buried on the north side of a cedar tree. A grandson, William, son of Preston, is buried in the same lot."

Thus the grave of Jacob Layman, a Revolutionary Soldier, has been located.

I wish to express my appreciation to Mrs. J. A. Sharp for permission to use the Revolutionary War pension application, the store account and the 1808 Sevier County deed from the files of the late J. A. Sharp, Sevier County Historian.

Also, I wish to thank Mr. Clyde M. 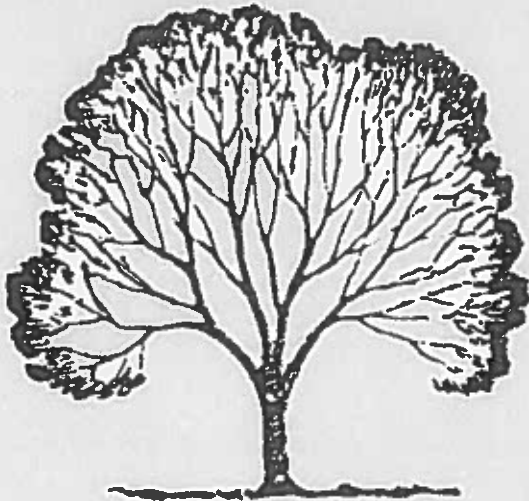
