Please continue to send in your Layman, Lehman (all spellings) material and branches for future publications. On page 42 is an article about the series and an explanation of the procedure for publishing branches.

If you connect with a published branch, I hope you will write to me so that I may inform our readers of your connection. Also, let me know if there are corrections to be made in your branch. Corrections & new information will be published in a subsequent volume.

Sometimes this editor enters incorrect data in branches and I appreciate receiving the correct information. Other times, some branches are difficult to read and the interpretation may not always be right. As editor, I am not responsible for errors in research material contributed by others. Please, do let me know of any errors so that they may be published in the "Errata" section. The errata in this issue is on page 32.

As you know, from your research, our German - Swiss ancestors' Christian names sometimes consisted of two or more names. This may create confusion as to which one is the right ancestor.

An example is that of a wife with the married name of Elisabeth Rebecca Ringer. She is listed in baptismal records as Elisabeth and in other baptismal records as Rebecca. (The children are known to be siblings). Some say that the mother is one person: Elisabeth Rebecca; others have said that there were two mothers! If a marriage record could be found it should ascertain who is who or what. (Yes, she is my ancestor; her granddaughter married John David LAYMAN).

Notice, I wrote the name Elisabeth with a "s" in the same way the Germans spell the name. The English use the letter "z".

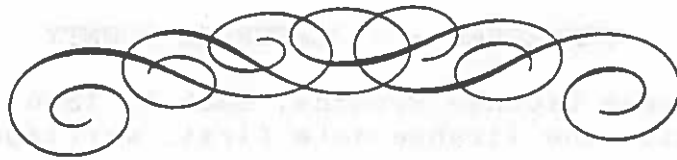

RECORDS FROM HERE AND THERE

SWITZERLAND

CITIZENS OF LANGNAU PARISH, 1780 - 1850

Delbert L. Gratz, Librarian of the Mennonite Historical Library, Bluffton College, Bluffton, Ohio 35817, is generously providing this material for publication in Layman-Lehman Records And Lines.

He is pleased to transliterate and translate from a document of which he has a photocopy which gives all of the Lehman families (familywise) who were citizens of the parish of Langnau who were living in the time of 1780-1850. As it takes considerable time to do this (one hour and a half spent on these records below), the Citizen Records will be published in subsequent volumes.

These records are a rather exact translation. The families are from page number 3 of the document; other pages referred to are in the same works. Mr. Gratz writes: "These names of places given are all in Canton Bern, when, the word 'of' is used, as a certain place, it means that is where they hold communal citizenship which is the primary citizenship of all Swiss. There are between 40 and 50 LEHMAN families that are given in much the same manner in this book."

1772, Jan. 07 LUDWIG LAUMAN, Lancaster, sells bolting cloth.

1774, May 10 Conrad Schwartz, saddler, Lancaster, has removed to a house opposite LUDWIG LEHMANN'S house, on the south side of King street.

1774, June 21 Christopher Becker, North side of Race street, between Third & Fourth, Phila., 3 doors above CHRISTIAN LEHMAN, Notary Public, & opposite Rudolph Bonner's inn, sells rum, wine, molasses, chocolate, etc.

Mrs. Nancy Freeman died at the home of her son George Freeman, in Kempton, at noon Thursday, her death being due to a complication of afflictions, but since she met with an accident several months ago, falling and fracturing her hip, her health became more impaired and grew gradually worse. The past few weeks she had been confined to her bed the greater portion of the time.

Mrs. Freeman was born in Shelby County, Ind., Aug. 14 1829 and she was married at the age of sixteen to Asa Freeman. she was the mother of seven children, only one surviving that being her son George with whom she has lived since the death of her husband seventeen years ago.

The greater portion of the life of this good woman was spent in Clinton County, near the town of Hillisburg, she moving to Kempton with her son about five years ago.

Mrs. Freeman is also survived by a brother, Rev. John Laymon, of Michigantown, and also one sister, Mrs. A. H. Freeman of Missouri, the sister being the wife of a brother of the deceased's husband.

Her parents were Rev. John Laymon, the father being a minister of the Baptist Church.

Mrs. Freeman was a member of the Baptist church until late in life when she changed her membership to the Christian denomination.

The burial will take place Saturday, the services being held at the Christian church in Kempton, at 10 o'clock, Rev. J. A. Parker officiating. The interment will be at the LAYMON cemetery, near Michigantown.

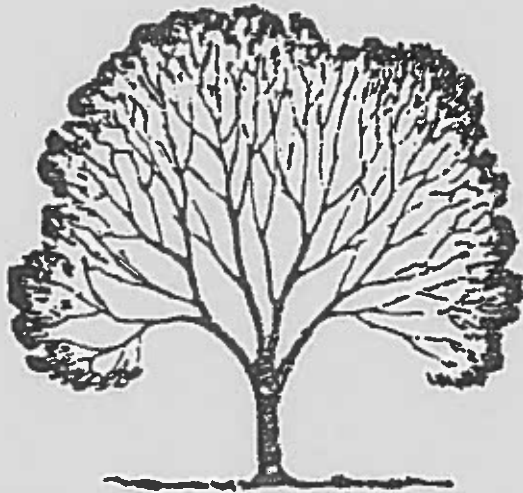

In v. I of Layman-Lehman Records And Lines, Branch #4: JOHN CHRISTIAN LEAMON/LEHMAN of Germany & Philadelphia Co. PA, contributed by Shirley Borden Kline, lists the same children as the following branch. Branch #4 is also in v. II contributed by Sara Ellen (Barr) Schaaf whose line branches off with generation #4.

This latest branch for "Christian" has some information different from data given in Branch #4 for generation #1: John Christian Leamon/Lehman. Therefore, the branch is listed here as Branch #17, the next available branch number.

There are 3 early passenger arrival entries (1730, 1731, 1753) for Christian/Christoph. Lemman/Lehman in Strassburger's Pennsylvania German Pioneers, which is a publication of the original lists of arrivals in the Port of Philadelphia from 1727 to 1808, Strassburger's book is a very definitive work, more so than the Pennsylvania Archives or Rupp's book, A Collection of Thirty Thousand Names of German, Swiss.....
