Please send me copies of any records that you wish to share with others and cite your sources whenever possible. Of great importance are Bible records, old letters, as well as wills, marriages, obituaries, etc.

LAYMAN-LEHMAN (all spellings) branches (lineages) should be sent in on family group sheets or with a computer Genealogy Program group form, starting with your earliest ancestor, continuing on down to yourself. Please, always cite your sources.

Branches will be published in detail down to one generation past where the LAYMAN-LEHMAN name is lost; i.e. the children of a LAYMAN-LEHMAN woman will have their details printed. Thereafter, for each generation, only the vital information for that generation will be printed. Details about the contributor will be printed, including children and grandchildren if they wish. By using this method the majority of the lineage information will be about the LAYMAN-LEHMAN (all spellings) generations.

Branches will be assigned a number as they are published. If your branch connects with another branch and if you so inform the editor, there will be a merger and the earlier branch number will prevail, the latter branch number will be retired.

Time does not permit me to correspond individually with you about ancestral problems and still produce this booklet. Your queries and lineages will be printed in this booklet series where many will see them. The booklets are in various libraries throughout the United States.

Together, we can preserve our heritage, find new cousins and help each other connect the missing links as well as help future researchers.

P R E F A C E

Another volume of LAYMAN - LEHMAN RECORDS AND LINES is completed. I wish to thank all of you who sent me your material to be published.

As you read the branches and family groups, you can see that in some of them the compilers need help in either locating their immigrant ancestors or in finding more information about their known ancestors. If anyone can help them in their search, I encourage you to write directly to these researchers.

If any branch has information on your line, remember that these branches are clues. You need to find the original source records for your proofs. This applies also to any written or printed record including genealogies. In order to properly document your line, the original records are needed. Printed records and genealogies are only clues.

Also, you will note that some of the branches do not have sources listed. I appreciate the work of those researchers who do include their sources because it will be of help to others should they have the same ancestors.

Queries are very important also. Even though some queries may be those asked many years ago, they can still be valuable as clues. For example, the periodical, Genealogy And History, published many years ago in Washington, D.C., consists of queries and answers to queries. In my Logsdon search, I found many queries and answers by a man whom I felt must have had many valuable records that would help me. By writing to other Logsdon researchers asking about this person, I was able to locate and obtain a copy of this man's research.

I know of a researcher, after sending to an old address from a query, received her letter back "forward time expired". Undaunted, this genealogist wrote to a neighbor of the person who had submitted the query. As the neighbor's name was unknown, the letter was addressed to Occupant and was asked if they knew where their former neighbor lived now. Thus, the genealogist found the person who had submitted the query and received more information on her line.

The above motto of the College of the City of New York applies to all of us researching for our family lines. By sharing our information, others may also Look Back, Look On, Look Forward.

### MARYLAND --- CUMBERLAND, GARRETT COUNTY --- OBITUARIES

Edward "Glyn" Geis, 117 Center Street, Frostburg, MD 21532, contributed the following articles which were printed on pp. 232, 233, & 234 of the book listed in "Sources" at the end. Your editor, Laurine, has condensed the beautifully written but rather "wordy" essay which was the style in the 1880's. Write to Laurine if you wish a copy of the article.

#### MRS. LOUISA BLOCHER

Bleak and inhospitable December, like its more genial sister months, has its harvests, but with ingatherings mostly for eternity and the tomb. On the 22nd day of the now departed month and year, Mrs. Louisa Blocher gave up her precious life in the 90th year since September last, at the residence of George W. Blocher, in Garrett county. ...

For more than 60 years a devoted member of the M. E. church, with an unblemished record. Her maiden name was LOUISA DAYTON, and married DANIEL LAYMAN at Westernport, Allegany county, over sixty years ago. He died soon after the birth of their fourth child. Four children in all -- two sons, the youngest child of this marriage, except Sheriff G. L. LAYMAN, who died less than two years ago. The two daughters were twins with an "undistinguishable" likeness, not only in features, but in disposition and nature -- uniform in almost every respect. They were married to brothers, Andrew and John Blocher; the latter died many years ago. His widow still survives as such.

About the year 1843 the deceased was married to John BLOCHER, one of Allegany county's excellent citizens with whom she had one child, now the wife of Charles Livengood, a prosperous business man of W. Va. In 1856 she again became a widow, and remained in that state till her death. Since the death of her last husband she has lived with her son, Geo. W. Blocher, who had always treated her with the utmost tenderness and care. ... Jan 3d., 1889

#### MARY JANE BLOCHER

Mrs. Mary Jane Blocher died on the 1st day of February, 1889, at the residence of Hon. Geo. W. Blocher, in Garrett county, aged 60 years on the 24th July last. She had been an invalid for quite a number of years, many times distressingly so lately. Her great care and anxieties were for her very aged and sick mother, who died about six weeks ago. Since then her complicated ailments increased rapidly till the end came. ...

The deceased was born in Westernport, Allegany county, a twin daughter of Daniel and Louisa LAYMAN. The latter became a widow, and in 1843 married the late John Blocher who brought the whole family of four children to his generous home, five miles west of Frostburg. Mary Jane (the subject of this notice) married John Blocher, Jr., who died about 30 years ago childless. His widow remained such for the rest of her life, always remaining with and clinging to her widowed mother, with every endeavor to make her comfortable as the great weight of years pressed on. In her well times she was a lady of cheer, and even vivacity, and had the faculty of making those about her comfortable and happy. ... February 4th, 1889.

Dr. Gratz writes: "These names of places given are all in Canton Bern. When, the word 'of' is used after a certain place, it means that is where they held communal citizenship which is the primary citizenship of all Swiss. There are between 40 and 50 LEHMAN families that are given in much the same manner, most of whom emigrated to Ohio and Indiana, 1820-60."

**BIOGRAPHIES**

**OHIO -- WAYNE COUNTY -- WAYNE TOWNSHIP, 1878**

JOHN LEHMAN was born August 14, 1790, in Berks County, Pa. His father, Martin Lehman, and mother, Christina Speck, were immigrants from Germany, and were sold out to service by the captain of the vessel until their passage was paid, as the custom then was.

In the spring of 1812 JOHN LEHMAN married Miss C. Smith; they had 5 children. John removed to Wayne Twp. in the spring of 1823, settled 4 miles north of Wooster, where on July 13 of the same year, his wife died. In the spring of 1824, John married Miss N. BAIR who died August 23, 1867, aged 65 years. By his first wife there are 2 children living and by the 2nd nine.

Mr. LEHMAN now lives [1877 or 1878] with two of his daughters. He is a hale old man, whose strong mental faculties are not impaired by age, and who can look back on a long life well spent.

DANIEL W. LAYMAN, M.D., was one of the most prominent practicing physicians of Putnamville, was born in Franklin County, Pennsylvania, September 14, 1808, son of Phillip and Catherine (Wanderly) LAYMAN, of German ancestry, and also natives of Pennsylvania. The mother died in that State when our subject was four years old, after which he lived with his grandparents. The father died in Putnamville, about 1869. They had four children, two sons and two daughters.

DANIEL W. went with his grandparents to Augusta County, Virginia, soon after his mother's death. He was educated at the University of Virginia, graduating at the medical department in 1824. He practiced in Pennsylvania two years, and in 1831 came to this county, since which time he has been engaged in the practice of his profession.

Dr. LAYMAN was formerly a Democrat in politics. In 1840 he voted the Whig ticket, but has been a Republican since the organization of that party. He was the first postmaster at Putnamville, appointed in 1832, and held the office several years.

In April, 1832, the doctor was married to MARY TOWNSEND, born in Union County, Kentucky, March 3, 1812, and daughter of James Townsend the proprietor of Putnamville. He was born in Maryland and removed to Morganfield, Union County, Kentucky. He came here in 1828 and afterward sold out his interest here and removed to Clay County, where he lived until his decease. His wife, Catherine Doras, wa also a native of Maryland and died in Clay County about 1870.

Dr. and Mrs. LAYMAN have had five children -- John H. (deceased), Catherine, Mary (deceased), James T. and Columbia I. Mrs. LAYMAN died May 23, 1879. She was a member of the Presbyterian church of which Mr. LAYMAN is still a member. His is one of the large landholders of the township, owning about 280 acres of land, besides property in Putnamville. He is an affable man and well calculated to win many friends. His health is good and he is well preserved, often being taken for a much younger man. His practice extended over five counties.
