he being then y<sup>e</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> of next James the said Ju<sup>o</sup>. Maynor

servitude y<sup>e</sup> said Nich<sup>o</sup>. Witherington doth oblige himself  
to teach the said Ju<sup>o</sup>. the trade of Blacksmithy to give  
him the learning of writing & Reading & sundry o<sup>th</sup>er  
fringe to f<sup>urn</sup>ish him necessary Meate Drinck washing & lodging  
and at y<sup>e</sup> Expiration of the said term to pay & deliver him  
two Cowes with Calves or Calves by their sides & one Mare with  
and three Barrells of Corne. For the s<sup>u</sup>re p<sup>er</sup>formance of the  
promises they have hereunto sett their hands the day  
y<sup>e</sup> above Expressly
