Simeon Martinangele's first wife was a Miss Green, grand-daughter of William Greene and grand-niece of Mary Martinangele. She died. There were no children.

Simeon Martinangele's second wife was Lady Elizabeth Yard, the widow of Sir Edward Yard. (an officer in the Italian Army)

Abram Martinangele married (wife's name unknown) had one child, Elizabeth Martinangele, (*)

Abram Martinangele married a second wife (name unknown). They had 2 children: Margaret and Ellen.

Abram Martinangele was murdered in his bed by Thomas Pendarvis, brother of Richard Pendarvis during the Tery War.

Ellen Martinangele married Francis Ficklin of Grahamville, S. C. and eminent lawyer. He died there. There were no children.

Ellen Ficklin (nee Martinangele) married the second time to Dr. James Ball of S. C. They had no children and at her death willed all her property to her sister Mrs. Chapman on account of her husband's ill treatment.

Margaret Martinangele, daughter of Abram Martinangele (who was murdered in his bed with her in his arms) married Mr. Chapman. She had children. One daughter married Mr. Winkley (This is all the record I have of Abram Martinangele's family.

Isaac Martinangele married the widow of Anthony Godfrey, Mrs. Elizabeth (Ladson) Godfrey, August 20th, 1782. The children are mentioned in order

1. Philip Martinangele, Jr., born Sept. 29, 1833, was killed by lightning on Daufuski Island, S. C. May 14th, 1852. He never married.
2. Mary Martinangele, born Dec. 27th, 1835 married Francis Dunn Feb. 7, 1807. Mrs. Mary Dunn (nee Martinangele) died July 6th, 1878. There were no children
3. Love Martinangele, born January 30th, 1788, married Mr. Mead. He died. They had no children. She remarried a Mr. Forsythe. There were no children by this second marriage. Love then a third time to a Mr. Jesse Mount. They had one daughter: Amanda Mount. Amanda Mount married Mr. Charles Zittreuer. They had two children. Sarah and Jessie Zittreuer. They married two brothers; Frederick and Joel Copes.
4. Isaac Martinangele, born May 2, 1790. No record of his marriage or death. (Record found elsewhere).
5. Mary Ann Martinangele, born Dec. 12, 1793, married James Pete of Gedalming, born a May 1793

b. 18 Sept. 1819

Surrey, England, Sept. 17, 1818. They had two children: Mary Elizabeth Ann Pete and James Pete, Jr. Mr. Pete died Nov. 18, 1821. Mrs. Mary Ann Pete (nee Martinangele) married Paul Grible on Sept. 11, 1823. They had five children; Francis is the only one living.

Mary Elizabeth Pete married William Fripp Chaplin, Jan. 10, 1842. They had children

6. Harriot Martinangele, born Oct. 1, 1796 married William Fripp Chaplin, Sr., she died August 27th, 1830. They had 10 children. (See J. P. Chaplin's record)

No record of Isaac Martinangele's family.

Mary Martinangele, daughter of Philip Martinangele, Sr., married Gen. Francis Hopkins. She was the first cousin of Philip Martinangele, Jr., who was killed by lightning and aunt of Mrs. Mary Dunn, First cousin of Mrs. Gribball and Mrs. Mount.

Georgia W. Hopkins married Capt. Joseph Mulvery of the U. S. Navy. They had one child; Joseph Mulvery, Jr., Capt. Mulvery died and Mrs. Mulvery (nee Hopkins) married Capt. Edward Day of the U. S. Navy. They had two children; Edward and Mulvery Day. Joseph Mulvery, Jr. died in 1843; his half-brother, Edward is a Dr. in Darien and Mulvery Day died after the war. The Elder daughter of John Hopkins, Mary, married Col. Henry Titus of Titusville, Fla.

Georgia, 2nd daughter, married Mr. Barbee of St. Mary's, Ga.

Rebecca, 3rd daughter, married Mr. Soule of Charleston, S. C.

Margaret Margaret Martinangle, youngest daughter of Philip Martinangele, Sr. married Richard Pendarvis. He was killed in a battle at Bloody Point on Daufuskie Island, S. C. They had no children.

Margaret Pendarvis (Nee Martinangele) as Abram Martinangle's youngest sister and her husband's brother murdered her brother, Abram Martinangele.

I found the missing link of Abram Martinangele's daughter in an old
letter written to me fifteen years ago by my cousin, Mrs. Margaret
Mongin Gregory (Afterwards Mrs. Brantley).

Elizabeth Martinangele was the elder daughter and only one of Abram
Martinangele by his first wife.
Elizabeth Martinangele married Mr. Stoney of Bluffton, S. C. They had
two daughters.

The following is an exact copy of papers (the originals being hand-written) which belonged to Ida Melvina Chaplin Fripp, and which were in her possession at the time of her death, which I do hereby certify.

Simeon Martinangele's first wife was a Miss Green, a grand-daughter of Wm. (?) Green and grand-niece of Mrs. Mary Martinangele. She died; there were no children. Simeon Martinangele's 2nd wife was Mrs. Elizabeth Gard (or Yard?), the widow of Sir Edward Gard (or Yard?), an officer in the Italian Army. Had no children. Abram Martinangele married, wife's name unknown, and had an only child, Elizabeth. Abram Martinangele married the 2nd wife, name unknown. Had two children, Margaret and Ellen. Abram Martinangele was murdered in his bed by Thomas Pendarvis, brother of Richard Pendarvis during the Tory War. Ellen Martinangele married Francis Ficklin of Grahamville, South Carolina, an eminent lawyer. He died; there were no children. Ellen Martinangele Ficklin married the 2nd time Dr. James Ball of South Carolina. She had no children and at her death willed all her property to her sister Mrs. Chapman, on account of her husband's ill treatment. Margaret Martinangele, daughter of Abram Martinangele who was murdered in his bed with her on his arm, married Mr. Chapman. She had children. One daughter married Mr. Winkler. This is all the record I have of Abram Martinangele's family.

Isaac Martinangele married the widow of Anthony Godfrey, Mrs. Elizabeth Godfrey, August 20, 1782. The children are mentioned in order. Philip Martinangele, Jr., born Dec. 29, 1783, was killed by lightning on Daufuskie Island May 17, 1852. Never married.

Mary Martinangele, born Dec. 27, 1785. Married Francis Dunn Feb. 7, 1807. Mrs. Mary Dunn died July 6, 1878. No children.

Love Martinangele, born Jan. 30, 1788, married Mr. Mead; he died; no children. Her 2nd husband Mr. Forsythe; he died; no children. Her 3rd husband Mr. Jesse Mount. One daughter Amanda Mount. Amanda Mount married Charles Tittrons (spelling?). Sarah and Jessie Tittrons were the children of Charles and Amanda Mount Tittrons. They married brothers, Frederick and Joel Copes. Isaac Martinangele, born May 2nd, 1790. No record of his marriage or death. (Record found elsewhere.)

Mary Ann Martinangele born Dec. 12, 1793. Married James Peto of Godalming, Surrey, England, Dec. 7, 1818. One child, Mary Elizabeth

Peto. Mr. Peto died November 18, 1821. Mrs. Peto married Paul Grimbball Sept. 11, 1823. They had 5 children; Francis is the only one living. Miss Mary Elizabeth Peto married Wm. F. Chaplin Jan. 10, 1842. They had children.

Harriet Martinangele born Oct. 1, 1796, married Wm. F. Chaplin, Sr. She died August 27, 1830. Had 10 children. No record of Isaac Martinangele's family.

Mary Martinangele, daughter of Philip Martinangele, Sr., married Gen. Francis Hopkins. She was 1st cousin of Philip Martinangele, Jr., who was killed by lightning. Gen. Francis and Mary Martinangele Hopkins had several children. *Octavius Hopkins.*

John Hopkins. Charles Hopkins. Georgia Washington Hopkins. Edward Hopkins.

If there were other children I have no record.

Georgia W. Hopkins married Capt. Joseph Mulvey of U. S. Navy. One child, Joseph Mulvey, Jr. Capt. Mulvey died. Mrs. Georgia Mulvey married Lieutenant Edward Day, U. S. Navy. They had two children, Edward and Mulvey Day. Joseph Mulvey died in 1873. His half-brother, Mulvey Day, died after the war. Edward is a Dr. in Darian. The eldest daughter of John Hopkins, Mary, married Col. Henry Tutus of Titusville, Florida; Georgia, 2nd daughter, married Mr. Barber of St. Mary's, Ga. Rebecca, 3rd daughter, married Mr. Soule (Soulle?) of Charleston, S. C.

Margaret Martinangele, youngest daughter of Philip Martinangele, Sr., married Richard Pendarvis. He was killed in an engagement at Bloody Point, Dauguskie Island. No children. Mrs. Margaret Martinangele Pendarvis was Abram Martinangele's youngest sister and her husband's brother murdered her brother Abram Martinangele. Mrs. Margaret Pendarvis married Capt. Wm. Edwards Mongin, second son of David and Elizabeth Edwards Mongin, May 25, 1783. They had 9 children. Mary Mongin, born Sept. 7, 1787. Died Sept., 1887 (?). Elizabeth Edwards Mongin born Dec. 30, 1785. Margaret Mongin, March 7, 1788 -- Nov., 1792. Wm. Henry Mongin, March, 1790 -- Oct. 1792. Sarah Watts Mongin, August 12, 1797 -- Sept. 1799. William Edwards Mongin, Jr., Aug. 12, 1797 -- Sept. 1799. Richard Thomas Pendarvis Mongin August 7, 1797. Simeon Mongin Sept. 22, 1799 -- Oct. 21, 1800. Ralph David Mongin Jan. 5, 1802. Three children only were raised. Elizabeth Edwards Mongin married Robert L. Tettigren (Lettigren?), a lawyer of eminence in Savannah, Ga. No children. Richard Thomas Pendarvis Mongin married his 2nd cousin Adeline Cornelia Lewis, granddaughter of Johnathan Edwards in New Have, Conn., 1820. One daughter, Margaret Cornelia Mongin, who married Jacob Gregory, 1873. They had one daughter Antoinett Haverland Gregory who married Capt. Wm. Jackson Anderson of Fort Valley, Ga. They reside there now. Ralph David Mongin, youngest son, married Eliza Catherine Maner, daughter of Capt. John Maner of South Carolina. They had 6 children:

Roswell Baker died. Elizabeth Lee Baker. Mongin Blackswell Baker. Mary Hines Baker died in infancy. Elizabeth Lee Baker married Wm. N. Nichols. Mongin Blackswell married Sachie L. Pellow Macon. Wm. Edwards Mongin married his 2nd cousin Elizabeth Catherine Smith. Had 6 children. His wife died; married 2nd wife; had 2 children. Minnie J. Mongin married Mr. George N. Nichols, his 2nd wife, had three children. Mongin Baker Nichols. Edward McJ. Nichols. Minnie Sohlery Nichols.

Following is notation at bottom of papers: "As nearly as I can compile all the records this is the genealogy of the Martinangele family to the present day, Nov. 16, 1895. Written for Mrs. Ida Fripp, by Mrs. Stephen J. M. Baker, nee Caroline E. R. Mongin".

The papers then continue, in Caroline E. R. Mongin Baker's own handwriting, as follows:

"Mrs. Mary Leby was the grand-daughter of Wm. Green, brother of Mrs. Mary Martinangele....widow of Philip Martinangele.

"I found the missing link of Abram Martinangele and daughters in an old letter written me fifteen years ago by my cousin Mrs. Margaret Mongin Gregory--afterwards Mrs. Brantley. Elizabeth Martinangele was the oldest daughter and only one of Abram Martinangele by his 1st wife. Elizabeth Martinangele married Mr. Stoney (Stony, Stonsy?) of Bluffton, South Carolina. They had two daughters, no record of sons. Mary Ellen Stony (spelling?) who married Samuel Webb. Elizabeth married Mr. Seeley. Margaret Stony (spelling?) married at age of 50, married Mr. Griggs of LaGrange, Ga. There were 2 daughters by the 2nd wife. Ellen Martinangele married Francis Ficklin; then Dr. James Ball. Margaret Martinangele, youngest youngest daughter of Abram Martinangele, married Mr. Chapman.

"Pendarvis requested Hon. Wm. Pope of Hilton-Head Island to bury him under his dining room window so the ladies could throw the dregs from their wine glasses on his grave.

"Mulvey Day died at Savannah. Date on stone in Laurel Grove (Cemetery). Margaret Stony (spelling?-could be Storey?) married Mr. Griggs. Mary married Mr. Webb. Elizabeth Seeley"

The foregoing concludes the papers written by Mrs. Baker for my great-grandmother, Ida Melvina Chaplin Fripp. At end of these papers, I found, written in pencil, that the papers were "written in 1887", and this last notation is in handwriting of Ida Melvina Chaplin Fripp.

Daniel J. Chaplin enlisted at Charleston, S. C., May 9, 1861 - mustered into Confederate Service May 22, 1861. On muster roll of June 30, 1861, filed July 30, 1861, as in hospital at Culpepper, Va. Reported on muster roll Nov. 1, 1862 as present. Wounded at Fredericksburg Dec. 13, 1862. - On muster roll of Jan. 1st to Feb. 28, 1863, as absent wounded, transferred to _____ in exchange for C. H. Marriett on April 21st, 1863.

E. A. Chaplin enlisted at Charleston, S. C., May 9, 1861, mustered into Confederate Service May 22, 1862, reported on muster roll of June 30, 1861, filed July 31st, 1861, as in hospital at Culpepper, Va. - Not on any later roll. (Note: Official Records say discharged on account of ill health.)

Hannah Fripp (dau. of John & Eliza [Hand] Fripp) m. Benjamin Jenkins. Benjamin Jenkins m. 2nd Martha La Roche. (b. 1790-1882) a son Paul. Joseph Jenkins of Edisto (b. 1710, d. 1770) m. Phoebe Chaplin, dau. of John & Phoebe (Jenkins) Chaplin of St. Helena. Richard Jenkins, son of Jos. & Phoebe (b. 1731, d. 1771) m. Martha Ripon, d. of Edward Fenwick (Lord Ripon).

Will of John Chaplin 1765 tells of the gift of Ephriam Mikell Baynard by deed of trust to Charleston College \$160,000 in City of Charleston Scrip which has been the chief support of the College. Ephriam Mikell Baynard and his brother attended this College. The brother Archibald Calder Baynard a graduate with 2nd honor abt. 1816. He was then elected to the S. C. Legislature. He d. 1862 - was b. about 1795--married Martha Sarah Chaplin (dau. of John Chaplin of Edisto). (These are great-grandparents of Mrs. Tillie Hull Lagerquist) Also the great-grandparents of Mrs. Julia Bacon Osborne. Wm. Jenkins came from Wales on the ship Carolina in 1670 - the 1st of the line.

They had 4 children, Adaline Mary, Anius, Sarah, William. The last three died unmarried. Adaline Mary married Edward R. Young of Providence, R. I. They had four children (there may have been others) Edward M., George, Elizabeth, Adaline. Elizabeth married Mathew W. Arnington of Providence, R. I. They had children. Adaline married George Bogman of Boston, Mass. They had two sons.

Mrs. Elizabeth Godfry, nee Miss Elizabeth Ladson, widow of Anthony Godfry, married Isaac Martinangele, Sr., Aug. 20, 1772. They had 6 children, Philip, Mary, Love, Isaac, Ann, Harriet L. Philip Martinangele was born Dec. 29, 1783. Was killed by lightning on Daufuskie Island May 14, 1852. He never married. Mary Martinangele was born Dec. 27, 1785. Married Francis Dunn, Feb. 7, 1807. Francis Dunn was born 1777, died March 23, 1823. Mary Dunn died July 6, 1878, age 92 years, 4 months, 21 days. They had no children. Love Martinangele was born Jan. 30, 1788. She married Mr. Mead. He died. They had no children. She married Mr. Forsyth. He died. They had no children. She married Mr. Jesse Mount of Philadelphia, Pa. They had one child Amanda. No record of death of Love Mount. She died in Savannah, Ga. & is buried in the vault on Daufuskie Island. Jesse Mount died in Beaufort, S. C., Aug. 9, 1871.

Amanda Mount married Charles Zittroner (spelling ?) of Skidaway Island, Ga. They had two children. Sarah, Jessie.

Sarah married Fred Copes of S. C. They had one son, Charles. Jessie married Joel Copes of S. C. They had several children.

Fred & Joel Copes were brothers.

Isaac Martinangele was born May 2, 1790. No record of marriage, or death.

James Peto Chaplin married Miss Mary Rhodes of South Carolian. They had 3 children. She died March 26, 1891. Harriet, Margaret, James Peto.

Wm. F. Chaplin married Mary E. A. Peto. They had five children, Wm. F., Ida M., Elizabeth M., Francis Dunn, Harriet Ann.

John Joshua Chaplin never married.

Miss Green married Philip Martinangele, Sr., of Daufuskie Island, S. C. They had 5 children. Simeon, Abram, Isaac, Mary, Margaret. All born on Daufuskie Island.

Simeon Martinangele married Miss Green, a grand-daughter of Wm. Green, and grand-niece of Mrs. Mary Martinangele. She died - no children. Simeon Martinangele married (in Italy) Elizabeth Gard (Yard?), widow of Sir Edward Gard (Yard?), an officer in the Italian army. They had no children.

Abram Martinangele, 1st wife's name unknown. They had one child, Elizabeth. She married Mr. Stoney of Bluffton, S. C. They had three daughters (no record of sons), Mary, Elizabeth, Margaret. Mary Stoney married Samuel Webb. They had four children, Amanda, Elizabeth, James, George. Amanda never married. Died Oct. 14, 1876. Elizabeth Webb married Wm. M. Wilson of Charleston, S. C. They had 9 children. James Webb married Miss Belle Knapp of Savannah, Ga. They had two daughters. George Webb married Miss Nancy Tarver. They had four children. Elizabeth Stoney married Mr. Seeley. No record. Margaret Stoney married Mr. Griggs of La Grange, Ga. No children.

Abram Martinangele's 2nd wife's name unknown. They had 2 children, Ellen, Margaret.

Ellen Martinangele married Francis Ficklin, a lawyer of Grahamville, S. C. They had no children. He died. She married Dr. James Ball of S. C. No children.

Margaret Martinangele married Mr. Chapman of Savannah, Ga. They had a daughter, Elizabeth. She married Mr. Winkler of Savannah (a widower with children). They had five children, Laura, Rosa, Ian Rensseler, Alvin, Elijah.

Laura married Herbert A. Palmer. The others never married.

Abram Martinangele was murdered in his bed with his baby Margaret in his arms on Daufuskie Island, S. C., during the British War, by Thomas Pendarvis (a Tory). Brother of Richard Pendarvis.

Mary Peto Chaplin died Jan. 8, 1899.

Wm. F. Chaplin died June 20, 1884.

Isaac Martinangele married the widow Godfry, nee Elizabeth Ladson. He died April 15, 1796, age 44. She died Jan. 1, 1847, age 84 years, 11 months, and 10 days. Parents of Mrs. _____ Mount, Grimbald, Chaplin, Philip Martinangele.

Mary Martinangele married Gen. Francis Hopkins.

Margaret Martinangele married Richard Pendarvis. He was killed in battle at Bloody Point at Daufuskie Island, S. C. during the British War.

Mrs. Margaret Martinangele Pendarvis was Abram Martinangele's youngest sister. Her husband's brother Thomas Pendarvis murdered her brother Abram Martinangele. (Mrs. Herbert A. Palmer's Grandfather).

Mrs. Margaret Pendarvis married Capt. Wm. Edwards Mongin, second son of David and Elizabeth Edwards Mongin, May 25, 1783. They had 9 children: 3 lived and married. Elizabeth Edwards Mongin married Robert L. Pettigrew, a lawyer of Savannah. No children.

Richard Thomas Pendarvis Mongin married his 2nd cousin Adeline Cornelia Lewis, in New Haven, Conn., 1820--had one daughter, Margaret Cornelia Mongin who married Jacob Gregory 1843.
