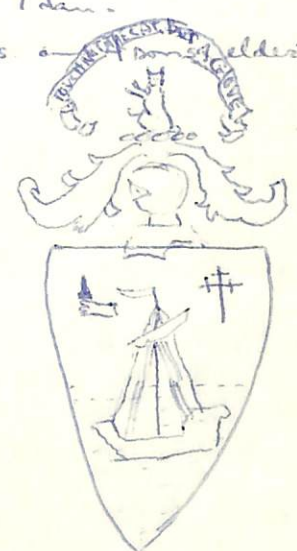

Arms: Per fess or and azure, a nymph on the first, with her sails furled, oars in action, mast and tackling all proper, flags flying gules, in the dexter chief point a hand couped grasping a dagger point upwards gules, in the sinister chief a cross-crosslet fitchie of the last. Crest: a cat sejant proper.
